During the summer we conducted a wonderful experiment with an informal worship service on Sunday evenings. We have called it the Anchor service. Paige Snyder and Trace Morgan were our leaders, working under the capable guidance of Lisa Aronson, and we met each week of the summer to praise God and celebrate God's blessings upon our lives. Our gathering was always joyful and attended by folks of all ages. Often there were forty to fifty folks present, but on August 10 there were 72. Currently we are working to devise a strategy to continue the Anchor service past the end of summer.

There is another experiment we are undertaking this Fall. On Sunday mornings at 10:45 we have had a blended service most weeks, including traditional music along with music by our praise band, Invocation. Over the next few months, we are going to try separating the two, so that on some Sundays the service is entirely traditional with choir, organ and hymns, and other Sundays all music is provided by Invocation. We anticipate that the styles and order of worship for those services will differ as well.

Our purpose in this is twofold: first, we often have so much music that it is impossible to include all of it on a Sunday morning. This strategy will give us the opportunity to include more musical offerings that folks in the congregation are hoping to give to God in worship. Second, we are anxious to see if there is a difference in the ways that folks respond in worship at First Church to the two different styles.

We are still working to put all this together, so I can't give you a schedule yet. I can tell you that there are no anticipated changes in the 8:15 service. Also, we have a Psalm 150 service of praise and testimony in place for September 21 at 10:45.

I am hoping for two things this Fall as we undertake this experiment: first, I'm hoping that folks will participate in both kinds of services and discover the joy and beauty of worshiping God, no matter what the style of music and leadership. Second, I hope that folks will be open and free in offering us their evaluations of both worship styles. It is always our goal to build worship in such a way that everyone gathered can fully participate in all its aspects.

Allport-Bigler-Woodland Workcamp Recap

I had the distinct pleasure of serving with the Volunteers in Mission (VIM) Team that traveled to the towns of Allport, Bigler and Woodland in Clearfield County, PA from June 22nd through 27th. Rev. Jeff Fisher of Calvary UMC in Harrisburg was the VIM Team leader for this workcamp, the third year in a row that the VIM Team has served in these communities. It was my second time being part of this workcamp. About twenty projects were addressed during the week, ranging from some simple painting efforts/yard cleanup to more advanced replacement of windows/portions of roofs to complex planning and constructing of decks and handicapped ramps. Many of the homeowners we helped were elderly widows who want to remain in their homes but can't accomplish maintenance/repair projects themselves or afford to pay professionals to do the work. The smiles (and tears of joy) on their faces as we do even the smallest task for them makes the experience especially worthwhile to me.

During the week, we stayed at Lake Street UMC in Woodland and showered at the YMCA in nearby Bigler. Our meals were lovingly prepared by eight different United Methodist churches in the area, and I can honestly say that if anyone went hungry at mealtime it was their own fault. The food and fellowship was wonderful! Devotions were led each morning and evening by members of the VIM Team, with a general emphasis on the concept of servanthood. I used Matthew 25:31-40 (Jesus' parable about the final judgment) as the basis for the devotions I led.

Thank you to First Church's Mission Committee for providing financial support for the Allport-Bigler-Woodland workcamp, and to everyone who prayed for me while I was being the "hands and feet of God" to the wonderful folks of Clearfield County. The VIM Team plans to return to Clearfield County in 2015 from June 21st through 26th to help additional families in that community. I plan on going again, and would love to have others from First Church join in the effort. Please prayerfully consider this opportunity to serve.

Remembering my school days (or ancient history as my kids call it), I found that a good teacher went beyond just knowing the material. Most students who dislike school say that school is boring. A superior teacher knows keeping the class animated can reel in the most disinterested kids in the class. So in honor of the teacher with a sense of humor, I have an author that always make me chuckle.

Mary Connealy's trilogy *Trouble in Texas* is historical fiction that brings laughter, action and romance throughout her books. Ms. Connealy starts off with **Swept Away**. Although Ruthy MacNeil is swept away from her family during a dangerous river crossing, she doesn't care about being separated from the family who raised her. She has been more of a servant than a family member. Meanwhile Luke Stone is on a mission to reclaim his family's ranch that has been stolen. After rescuing Ruthy downstream, he has no time to return her to the wagon train. He brings her along with his group on his dangerous mission, maybe more dangerous than crossing a swollen river. Ruthy becomes the hard-working cook for the group and soon the men are vying for her attention. Even Luke is wondering if he should leave the path of revenge and destruction and be swept away by love.

Glynna Geer is a mail order bride in the second book, **Fired Up**. When her husband dies, Glynna is not too sad as it was not much of a marriage. With two small children to support, Glynna decides to open a diner overlooking the fact she is a poor cook. Dare Riker is the town doctor whose business takes an upturn due to Glynna's questionable cooking. While Dare is intent on talking Glynna into taking another chance on marriage, someone is planning on ending the good Doctor's life. Between a woman trying to make it on her own and a man trying to avoid danger there are a lot of sparks flying.

Rounding out the set is **Stuck Together**. This adventure sets a lawman, Vince Yates, against Tina Cahill, a crusader against the town saloon. Though Tina pickets the saloon every day, no one seems to care except the sheriff. But he has more problems than Tina as his dysfunctional family has shown up adding to his problems. Of course, Vince and Tina are thrown together and find each other to be very attractive. But the crusading is coming between them. Read this book to find out if they become "Stuck Together".

Facilities

What a glorious summer it has been for us around First Church! Weather wise, the temperatures have been quite reasonable and the humidity levels have been bearable, which helps to keep everyone “cool and comfortable” as opposed to “hot and bothered”. The moderate temperatures and sufficient rainfall have the flowers around the church in full bloom. All praise to God for the wonder of His creation! God is good! All of the time!

The last month has been a little slower for the Trustees as many members of the Board have been able to enjoy some vacation time with their families while we plan our next series of projects. Our paint crew, headed by Judi Buddenbaum, took a much needed break in order to concentrate on crafts for our recently completed Vacation Bible School program. I had promised Judi that I would get the new stair treads installed in the Frederick Street stairwell before VBS to help with traffic flow for our VBS attendees. I was able to get all but one of the 18 new treads in place; the bottom tread requires some additional engineering that I have requested assistance on in order to complete that project. Additional painting will then be done in that stairwell to give it a brighter, cleaner look.

Nail Construction is still working on restoring the iron railings in the exterior stairwells that run from ground level to the back sides of Fellowship Hall and the Music Room. Once those are finished, the iron railings at ground level protecting persons from falling into these two exterior stairwells will be addressed.

The expansion of our computer network within the building is almost complete. We added a new network switch and power injector in order to connect the additional outlets and wireless access point devices. These initiatives now afford us network and internet access for the church library, Fellowship Hall, Kid’s Worship, Wee Worship, and Youth Lounge areas of the building. Thank you to James Paris and Wayde Leister for their efforts on this project.

If you recall, in the fall of 2012 we had a major issue in the south parking lot where it appeared that a large sinkhole had developed (the Borough of Mechanicsburg is notorious for sinkholes due to the high incidence of limestone formations underground). When we excavated that area, we determined that we didn’t have a sinkhole, but rather the decaying and settling of fill in what had been the foundations of razed properties along West Keller Street where the parking lot now stands. We are now seeing a gradual sinking of the parking lot in the area between the 2012 hole and the corner of the parking lot next to the property we recently sold at 120 West Keller. The Trustees are addressing this issue, but it will take a little time to resolve. Please use extreme caution when you are in that corner of the church parking lot until we can rectify the problem. Thank you.

Activity in and around the church will be increasing rapidly as we gear up for fall. Little Friends Nursery School starts their school year on September 2nd. Thank you to Little Friends for their work this summer on the playground mulch. New Hope Ministries has offered a two day a week program at our church this summer, and New Hope’s after school program will be here each school day again this year. Add in a full slate of Sunday School classes, committee meetings and evening activities, and you get the idea that this is one busy place. We’re doing our best to keep our facility welcoming and inviting to all who enter. Be sure to let me know if you see something that is broken or needs repaired. Even better, let me know how you can help make things better.

Mental Health First Aid

Sometimes, first aid isn't a **bandage**, or **CPR**, or the **Heimlich**, or calling **911**.

Sometimes, first aid is **YOU!**

You are more likely to encounter someone in an emotional or mental crisis than someone having a heart attack. Mental Health First Aid teaches a 5-step action plan to offer initial help to people with the signs and symptoms of a mental problem or crisis, and connect them with the appropriate professional, peer, social, or self help care. Anyone can take the 8-hour Mental Health First Aid course — first responders, students, teachers, leaders of faith communities, human resources professionals, and

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caring citizens.

First Church will be hosting a Youth Mental Health First Aid Course, Thursday, September 25, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. This is an 8-hour public course for adults living or working with youth ages 11-18 and for senior high school students.
