

"A Prayer for Peace "

As a child at Grace Church in Carlisle, I sang in the Junior Choir. Every spring, no matter the quality of a child's voice, or how he or she had behaved during rehearsals, all of us received a gift. After completing one year, each child was given a wooden cross with a black chord, which we proudly wore with our choir robes. At the end of year two, the gift was a red chord to attach, along with the black chord, to the wooden cross. After three years, we received a small silver cross to wear with our choir robes. Over all of these years, I've hung onto those crosses and the chords. They remind me of our pastor's wife, Mrs. Kauffman, who instilled in generations of kids like me a love of praising God.

I've also kept the gift we all received for completing four years in Junior Choir. It was a plaque with this prayer printed on it:



That plaque has been on a wall in every place I've lived since the age of 12. It was on the wall of my bedroom as a teenager, in college dorm rooms and seminary apartments, and in my study in every place I've served. This prayer is relevant in every time and place. We live in a world in which individuals, households, communities, and nations are broken by division, hostility and heartache.

Jesus said in the Sermon on the Mount, "...let your light shine before people, so they can see the good things you do and praise your Father who is in heaven." (Matthew 5:16) This bold prayer shows us just how to do that! Take a few moments to pray this prayer, and look for opportunities each day to let the light of love shine in all the places God calls you to be. As we join with Jesus in the good things he calls us to do, it truly does bring glory to him!

Library

It has been more years than I care to admit since I saw Camelot at the movies where they sang about “the Merry Month of May”, but every year when May arrives that phrase comes up in my mind. I hope May is a merry month since we have had so much rain and so many dreary days this year. As always, the library has many books that offer uplifting messages, and here are some new ones for May.

If you know me, you know I don’t usually read Amish fiction—I need stories with higher adrenaline. But while processing Beverly Lewis’s latest book, *The Tinderbox*, I found the summary on the back of the book very intriguing. And before I even get to the intriguing part, I read in the reviews that all the secrets in this book won’t be revealed as there is a sequel planned for September. As always, Ms. Lewis is writing about the Amish of Lancaster County. Nineteen-year-old Sylvia Miller came across her father’s brass tinderbox that he has always kept locked in his clock making shop. Even though she knows she shouldn’t, Sylvia snoops in the box. What she finds threatens to blow up her relationship with her father, her parents’ twenty-year marriage, the family standing in the Amish Order and maybe even Sylvia’s impending mar-

riage to the Bishop's grandson. It must be one powerful secret to cause this much trouble to a community that values forgiveness. If you are as curious as I am, check out this book but plan to come back for book two in September!

Author Patricia Bradley has broken the pattern of writing just three books in her series by continuing with book four in the Memphis Cold Case series. Justice Delivered is about the ugly sex trafficking business right here in our country. Carly Smith has been a victim who managed to escape. Rejected by her own family and ignored by professionals who were supposed to help her, Carly has trust issues. Carly has earned her counselor's degree and works tirelessly to help other women in crisis. Eight years after her escape her own niece is abducted, and Carly plans to catch the perpetrators and free her niece. Along with the suspense of this book is also a romance between Carly and a long-forgotten boyfriend who she has to rely on to help her in her quest. Many reviewers have said they read this book in one day, but since I don't know if this series will continue, maybe you should pace yourself.

I realize neither of these books is very "merry", but they are great reads. If you need something more light-hearted or just a different genre, stop in the library and let one of our volunteers find just the right book for you.

Easter Season Sermon Series - "Catch Your Breath"

Do you remember the last time you had to catch your breath? Perhaps you were winded from walking up a steep flight of stairs. Perhaps someone startled you, or you frantically searched for a child who'd wandered away in a crowded place. You remember the experience – your heart is pounding, your lungs gasping for air. Then, as deep breaths fill your lungs, your heart rate slows down, your body recovers, you are ready to move on.

This Easter Season, we're going to explore worship as an invitation to slow down, breathe deeply, and be refreshed by the presence of the Risen Christ. As a deep breath fills your lungs with life-giving oxygen, the stories of Jesus will invite you to fill your life with life-giving good news.

April 28: In Times of Fear - John 20:19-30

There are many things that keep us locked in fear. Finances, broken relationships, addictions, the unknown, our past, the list can go on and on. We all have fears. Even when we are locked in the room of our fears, Jesus breathes new life into us!

May 5: In Times of Exhaustion - John 21:1-19

Are you expected to do more work in the same amount of time? Are you overwhelmed by all that needs to be done in your professional, personal, church and volunteer life? Most of us are exhausted by all of life's demands. Just when we think we have nothing left to give, Jesus offers us nourishment and restores all that we need!

May 12: In Times of Doubt - John 20:24-30

Life after death? Touching the wounds of a risen man? Miracles at the sea? If it is hard to believe, you are not alone. Many of us wrestle with our doubts and question our faith and even God. Even the angriest doubters are invited to come to Jesus and bring their questions to him. Even during our doubts, Christ calls us into relationship and invites us to believe!

May 19: In Times of Loneliness - John 13:31-35

We can be surrounded by people and still feel incredibly lonely. We can experience abandonment by loved ones and betrayal. At times we all wonder if we are in the world alone as an individual or if we are connected to one another by something bigger and deeper. Even amid these struggles, Christ calls us into a powerful community that is based on loving one another!

May 26: In Times of Suffering - John 5:1-9

Do you want to be made well? After years of suffering and isolation, Jesus asks this powerful question and invites the paralyzed man into the pool of healing waters. When we get news of suffering in our world, it takes our breath away. In this Easter season Christ invites you to catch your breath and receive the blessings of his healing.

June 2: In Times of Division - John 17:20-26

Lost friends or family members when discussing politics? Can't agree on the little things let alone the big national and global issues? We live in a divided time. Jesus shows a better way, a way of unity that brings us together!


