From Pastor Denny's Desk...

The week after Vacation Bible School, our Head Custodian, George Canonizado, shared devotions at our weekly staff meeting about his experience of VBS. As you read George's enthusiastic testimony, may you be inspired to build relationships with children and their families all year long...

I don't think VBS is just about fun and games (and crafts and snacks). Its primary purpose is to lead us (the volunteers and kids) to experience the life-transforming power of the Gospel. When viewed through the lens of the Word of God, VBS takes on a renewed purpose. As I served as a volunteer for VBS this year it was 100% fulfilling and 10,000% to the glory of the King!

This year I remembered how much I love VBS! It's unlike anything else our church does all year. There's something special about coming together for several hours every single day for a week. It's a highlight of summer and something kids will look back on and remember fondly even when they're grown.

After two summers without VBS, this year was extra special! The kids were ready for it! The parents were ready for it! The volunteers were ready for it! Katie and Sarah were ready for it! But when it started, Mr. George was still sketchy about it. Granted, I crave community. My mouth says how much I don't like people, but my heart says how much I do!!! For me, after the scourge of the plague, VBS was the perfect opportunity to remind me how much my little self can help little people feel the love of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

My favorite part of the week was being able to share with the kids how their food collection for the Little Free Pantry is a miracle for our neighbors. Their donations made someone's day go from being a worry to putting food on their table.

Almost every Sunday I stand at the welcome desk with whomever our greeter is and joyfully welcome people to worship. At VBS we welcome people in every day. Some we know. Many we don't. Parents and kids. Parents trusting us to take care of their kids, and kids being unsure of what's coming to them. What a great opportunity to reach out to our community for Christ!

When my family started attending First Church 20 years ago, it was common for families to attend Sunday School and worship weekly, and also to participate in midweek programs. Now it's rare for families just to attend worship three Sundays a month! The pandemic has only given folks another reason not to come. That kind of shift makes it very difficult to build relationships with children and their families. During VBS, adult and youth volunteers got to spend three hours per day with the same kids for five days straight in our building! That kind of face-to-face, relationship-building time might ordinarily take months to accrue during traditional church programming settings. So serving in VBS has never been more important!

Kids need to build healthy relationships with Christian adults outside their immediate family. They need to feel loved, valued, listened to, and safe as part of their healthy physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual development. The relationships formed at VBS can be a part of that. And that's a huge thing! Not only for the kids but for Mr. George and his peers too.

I'm already looking forward to VBS 2023, and encourage everyone to get involved. I'm also thinking, why wait for next summer? What if we could have a VBS-like atmosphere for kids and families all year long, Sunday mornings and during the week? Our Director of Children and Family Ministries, Katie Knorr, and her team are already making plans for a super fall season! Now is the time for all of us to commit to building community with children and their families!



First Church Mission Moments...

Clearfield County Workcamp 2022 – Bringing Hope in the Name of Jesus Christ

I had the distinct privilege of sharing my God-given gifts and talents, limited as they may be, with persons in need in the Allport-Bigler-Woodland area of Clearfield County, PA during the period of June 19th through 24th. This was the 11th year of this Workcamp, and I have been blessed to be able to participate for 9 of those 11 years. Our efforts are based on 1 Peter 4:10, which states "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms".

There were 33 individuals, families, and/or institutions on the requests list for this year's Workcamp. The projects ranged from fairly straightforward items like yard work, interior cleaning, power washing, exterior painting and hauling/stacking firewood to more complex items like replacing a porch, installing fencing, and building decks/wheelchair ramps. I haven't seen the final report on all that was accomplished, but I know we made a difference in the lives of every person we interacted with during that week.

I spent the first three days of the Workcamp as part of a team building a deck and wheelchair ramp off the front of a house for a family where the husband had recently been in the hospital and was now confined to a wheelchair. The problem was, he had no way of getting out of his house in case of an emergency or even to go to a doctor's appointment. Four individuals had carried him up a steep set of stairs at the rear of the house when he was released from the hospital and placed him in a wheelchair inside the home, but that's what his world consisted of when we arrived. In those three days, we built a 10x20 foot deck and the structure for the first phase of the much needed wheelchair ramp. Unfortunately we had to stop progress on this project after those three days because my team leader had to return to his Harrisburg area home to assist his wife with some pressing medical issues. I am thrilled to report that this project was completed after the end of the official Workcamp by a group of people (most of whom had been part of the Workcamp itself) who came together to finish the work and give great hope to this family. Here is a picture of the completed project:



On Thursday of Workcamp week, I replaced two storm door latches and sanded/primed/painted an exterior door of a large house for an elderly widow where we were also power washing the entire home and cleaning ceiling fans and lamp shades on the inside. On Friday, I helped dig six 36" deep holes in shale so that posts could be set for the building of a deck (and cover) to be attached to a FEMA trailer purchased by an individual currently serving overseas in the U.S. military but due to soon return to life in Clearfield County. Every time we dug rocks out of each hole as we got closer to the 36" depth, some more rocks fell in and the process became agonizingly slow.
