

"Can a mother forget the baby at her breast and have no compassion on the child she has borne? Though she may forget, I will not forget you! See, I have engraved you on the palms of my hands; your walls are ever before me." Isaiah 49:15-16, CEB

Isaiah 49:15 has always struck me as an odd verse because the comparison seems misplaced. If I was trying to assure someone of God's faithful presence with them and His ability to never forget them, I feel like "losing a remote," "misplacing my keys," or "forgetting where I put my phone" are a better contrast to God's faithfulness than "a mother forgets a baby." But, alas, that is what scripture offers us. Why? Perhaps it's the odd notion of a mother forgetting a newborn. It is unlikely, yet it's not impossible. While not often, there are times when a mother might neglect her newborn. Even that which we think is certain is still not as certain as God's faithful remembrance of us. Our best example of faithful care, a mother and a baby, still does not compare to God's care towards us.

This summer, 17 students and adults are headed to Mayfield, Kentucky, to bring that message of hope: God has not forgotten you. When the tornado pummeled the Mayfield community in December 2021, many likely inquired upon God's presence and wondered as to His care of them. A year and a half later, after first responders and disaster agencies have left and gone to support others, the community is left rebuilding.

Sometimes long distance mission trips (an 11 hour drive) for a short amount of time (five days) don't seem practical and well-placed when there are needs here in our local community. While, yes, only so much work will be accomplished in five days, there is still a great value in the effort. For as we swing a hammer, help rebuild a porch, or layer one last coat of paint on a bedroom wall, we are bringing a tangible answer to a hurting community: You are not forgotten; God cares. He cares so much that he will bring, from 11 hours away, a church willing to share in your pain and help carry your burden, if even just for 5 days. The word of hope offered by Isaiah are the words of hope we bring to Mayfield: "The walls you're rebuilding are never out of my sight" (Isaiah 49:16 MSG).

As our team carries this message of hope to the Mayfield community, I pray you would carry that same reminder with you wherever you go this summer. You are never out of God's sight. We serve a God who cares deeply and loves faithfully. Whether you're rebuilding after a disaster or embarking on a summer adventure, He is there. Take great hope in His promise, and seek to connect to the Lord that is with us in all times, all places, and all circumstances.

From the Library

July – a month that I always think of as the heart of the summer. In the good old days, as I'm sure some of you remember, school vacation ran from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Not only did I ride my bike to the public pool every day, but I frequently went to the library to stock up as many books as I could fit in my bike basket. My days of bike riding to the library are long gone, but when I look for books that I would like to read or buy for the church library, that same feeling of joy comes over

me. Not only do I search for books that I would like to read, but also I try to decide what you would like to read. I always welcome your input on new Christian authors or titles. For now, let's check out some firecracker-worthy new reads for July.

When I write these newsletter articles, I usually look at online reviews to see what other people think of a book. When I checked out *Counter Attack* by Patricia Bradley, the reviewer said she got no housework done on the day she received the book – she couldn't stop reading to the very end. I knew this was my kind of book. The main character, Alexis Stone, has just been sworn in as interim sheriff for Russell County, Tennessee, when a killer strikes again. Dubbed the Queen's Gambit Killer because he leaves chess pieces and a note detailing a chess move at each crime, this killer must be caught. Alexis had planned to be in Russell County only a short time, with her sights set on her real prize job of being the first female police chief of Chattanooga. But, how can she leave with this fiend on the loose? Also on the hunt is Nathan Landry, chief of police of Pearl Springs. He and Alexis were high school sweethearts, and he has never stopped loving her. Can he keep her safe while giving her space to do her work? Since I never spoil the ending, you'll just have to read this suspenseful book yourself. And, I give you permission to let the housework go until you finish!

The library has a new writer of romantic suspense just in time for the theme of "firecracker reads." Lisa Phillips is writing a series called "Benson First Responders," and the first book is *Allegiance*. The whole town thinks that police detective Lucas Westbrook is a disgrace to the uniform. What they don't want to believe is that he's not only an upright man of God, but also a man with a dangerous secret. EMT Freya Olson has been loyal to Lucas, as she knows he is a good man. But, a new case tangles them both in a web that seems to have no way to escape. How far can Freya take loyalty when she doesn't know Lucas's secret? I would say this story has a chance of a happy ending, but you'll have to navigate all the twists and turns to find out. Did I mention Lucas has a secret — you might be interested in finding out what that might be. Let me know if you like this title, as there are more books that could round out the series.

On another note, the library is accepting gently used books, puzzles, CDs, and DVDs for our Aug. 19 Book Sale. Both adult and children's items are welcome, but we cannot accept VCR tapes, textbooks, or encyclopedias. Small donations can be left by the library door (clearly marked) at any time. Monthly Prayer Focus: "Information Fast"

How do you feel when you eat too much... bloated and uncomfortable? The same is true for our minds and our spirits. There are so many books, TV shows, podcasts, movies and more for us to feast on! But, to have the abundant life that Jesus promises (John 10:10), we must feed our minds and spirits *less* from this world in order to make more space for God to fill us instead. During the months of July and August, let's try an "information fast." What might this look like for you?

- Be mindful of what kinds of media and how much you are consuming. Awareness is the first step to change, so take note of all the books, TV, movies, etc. you take in.
- Once you're aware of all that you consume each day, take note of how it makes you feel. (As an example, The American Psychological Association reports that more than 50% of Americans say the news causes them stress and anxiety.)
- Once you're aware of what you are consuming and how it makes you feel, consider what
 can be reduced or eliminated in order to make more space for God, increase your joy and
 improve your overall well-being.
- After eliminating some of the information you take in, spend that time with God in prayer. Maybe you'll take a walk in nature, simply sit in the quiet, read your Bible or use a devotional as a guide... no matter where you are and what you do, simply take the time you've created through fasting to be with God.

Know that not every day will be perfect during your "information fast." Just enjoy the quiet time you create and pay attention to how it helps deepen your relationship with God.

Financial Report

Expected income – YTD \$375,369 (42% of budget) Actual income – YTD \$409,781 (45% of budget) Actual expenses – YTD \$370,802 (41% of budget)

Income for the four-Sunday month of May was \$75,639, more than our average four-week budget. We continue to run ahead of our YTD budget by about \$34,000. In May, expenses were a bit over an average 4-week budget due to the timing of payments. The good news is year-to-date expenses remain \$5,000 below expected spending.

We're grateful to be entering the summer season of worship to see how our new Green Space will enhance our worship and offerings to the community. We thank you all for supporting the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, your presence and your support toward the mission of our First Church family. The bell tower work is well on its way to completion. This project is expected to cost upwards of \$300,000, of which the Trustees' maintenance funds covered \$100,000. To make up the difference, our congregation has approved a loan for the remaining \$200,000, to be reduced by fundraisers and the generosity of our congregation. So far, the Endowment fund has contributed \$10,000, and fundraisers and donations have helped reduce the final expected loan amount. But, there is still time to reduce our loan with a gift that goes directly to the bell tower repairs. You can give on the Church Center app or with a check. Bless the Paetzold Family


