Recently I attended our annual First UMC Men's Retreat at Wesley Forest, one of our conference camps located about 80 miles north of Mechanicsburg. Every time I visit the camp, tucked quietly in the mountains of central Pennsylvania, my mind is flooded with memories of retreats and meetings I've attended there over the past 35 years. One experience in particular comes to mind whenever I visit Wesley Forest.

It was mid-February, 1987. I had been asked by a conference committee to lead a silent retreat. My mom and two women from the churches I served in York accompanied me. We joined about 20 others. The plan was to observe silence from after our evening meal on Sunday until lunchtime on Tuesday. Every three hours around the clock we would come together for brief worship. We would eat meals in silence, too, with someone reading to us while we enjoyed the food.

For the first several hours, keeping silent was difficult. It was a busy time in the churches I served and I was distracted by all the other things I might be doing back home. In the silence, I also realized how noisy my day to day life was. We didn't have computers and smart phones back then, but there was plenty to fill up our quiet spaces. Frankly, a few hours in, I wondered if I could make it to Tuesday without talking. Then, a remarkable thing happened. Our little community entered into the rhythm of worship, followed by silence, at 9:00 p.m., and midnight, and 3:00 a.m., and 6:00 a.m., and every three hours thereafter, and I found that I was drawn into the silence.

24 hours into our retreat, on Monday evening, it started to snow. By breakfast Tuesday morning, all of Wesley Forest glistened with a thick blanket of white. That morning, I trudged through a foot of new fallen snow into the woods. Far from the lodge, I stopped to soak in my surroundings. The breeze was cool and fresh brushing against my face. The contours of the evergreens covered in snow were amazing. The silence was deep and rich. Overcome with a sense of awe, my eyes welled up with tears. I had a sense that God was there with me and that I was totally and unconditionally loved.

Before long, I was driving home on a busy highway with three dear women happily chatting away in the car. Then, I was home, surrounded by the wonderful noise of a house with little ones and back in the busy routine of ministry. But in the days that followed I was more rested, more attentive to those around me, more centered in my devotions, more energized for ministry.

Being back at Wesley Forest with our men, I recalled again the blessing of what I experience there so long ago. While I would encourage everyone to take silent retreats, I know that such experiences are not for everyone. Retreats like our men have each year at Wesley Forest are great, but rare. Still, it's important for all of us to create margins in our lives where we can be still and quiet in God's presence.

This year we're involved in the "Be One, Make One, Discipleship Challenge". We're all invited to set apart time each day to read and meditate on God's Word, to keep a journal, and to pray. I trust that you are finding, as I am, that keeping this daily discipline is creating a quiet center from which you can live your life. My prayer is that you discover joy and peace as you receive the gracious invitation of our Lord Jesus and, "Come away to a deserted place by yourselves and rest a while." (Mark 6:31).

No, it is not an April Fool's joke that Easter is on April 1st. So instead of highlighting the Saint Patrick's Day books in this March newsletter (that is a joke—the library doesn't have any), I am skipping right to Easter. First, let me mention that we have many of the church's passion plays on DVD from 2000 on. If you would like to view your child's performance from years past, or if you don't know what the children's passion play is like, you can check out one of them.

The library has all levels of Easter books. Board books for toddlers include Rufus and Ryan Celebrate Easter and The Story of Easter. Each of these books gives toddlers very simple explanations of the Easter story. Moving on to older children, God Gave Us Easter is an excellent choice for a little more in-depth explanation of Easter. The library has books for older children and adults who want to enrich their spiritual life during this period of Lent.

On the fiction side of the library, the third book in Wanda Brunstetter's Amish Cooking Class books has arrived. Lyle and Heidi Troyer have adopted an orphaned brother and sister and, as a way to ease them into the community, Heidi decides to offer cooking classes for children. Each child who attends comes with an adult. The group is composed of single parent families, two working-outside-the-home families, and families that are having problems—in other words, a slice of every community. While they are cooking, the children and parents have the opportunity to talk about their problems and help each other. The Celebration is the last in the series, but it can be read as a standalone—or you could go back to the shelf and read the first two books, The Seekers and The Blessing, in order for maximum enjoyment.

Every day God reminds me I need all the help I can get and, recently, my daughter Kris, an avid reader, pointed out that I had two Lisa Harris' series mixed together. I immediately ordered the whole Nikki Boyd four book series so I could get that straightened out. The best part of my error, is that if you liked the Southern Crimes three book series, you will now have another series to dig into—all of it. I do most of the ordering for the library, so if you have a series or an author you would like to suggest, I would be glad to hear from you.

If none of these books interest you, stop by the library and let us help you find just the right book for you. Have a blessed Easter! See you in the library!

Lois Coover Memorial Gift Recognized

If you have ever taken Communion at First Church, you have most likely been the recipient of the loving and serving hands of the late Lois Coover.

For years, Lois served as a Communion Steward, and led a small but dedicated team of church members who faithfully prepared the Communion elements for worship services.

"She was very meticulous about everything, and wanted everything to be perfect," said Jean Adams, who served with Lois. "Lois made sure we had everything we needed."

Lois continues to make sure First Church has what it needs. The church recently received an estate gift from Lois. The gift was designated to the Endowment Fund.

The Endowment Fund was started a decade ago. Contributions to it remain with the fund in perpetuity, with the goal of generating future income to support First Church's missions and ministries. Lois' gift will support First Church for many years to come.

Lois, a lifelong Christian, grew up attending the United Brethren Church (now a United Methodist Church) in Wormleysburg. After marrying the late William Coover of Mechanicsburg, Lois joined him in attending First Church. She remained a faithful and active member for the rest of her life.

"Lois did a lot to help others," said Beverly Hertzler, Lois' sister. "She would do anything for anybody, if she was able to."

Lois routinely visited and prayed for church members who were hospitalized, homebound, or residing in nursing homes.

Steve Zimmerman welcomed Lois' help on the church's Christmas Decorating Committee. He also taught the kindergarten Sunday school class with her for many years. "You could joke with her," Steve said. "She was a lot of fun, and an all-around good person."

One day, Jeff Hoffnagle mentioned to Lois a possible outing to Sight and Sound Theatre for our congregation's senior members.

"She stopped what she doing immediately and impressed upon me how wonderful that would be," Jeff said. "From that moment on, she asked me every week if I had made arrangements yet."

The trip was planned, and went very well. However, that wasn't enough for Lois. "The week after our first trip, she presented me with all kinds of brochures to assist me with ideas for future trips. What a riot!" Jeff said.

Lois also attended the Guyer Sunday School Class for many years.

Outside of church, Lois worked for the former First Federal Savings and Loan until her retirement.

Lois passed away in November 2016, after a valiant battle with cancer. But, she remained faithful to the end. According to Beverly, even during her illness, Lois worried about preparing Communion, and was giving instructions to her committee.

"Church was very important to Lois," Beverly said. "Her faith was strong, and it helped her come through a lot of difficulty."
