Bible Reading Plan 9 This year, Consecration Sunday is Nov. 6! During our 8:30 and 11 a.m. worship services, we will ask every member of our church family, whether worshiping in-person or online, to make a financial commitment to support the ministry and mission of First Church in 2023. In addition, we will have a Ministry and Mission Fair to celebrate the many ways God is working in and through our life together.

I want to take a moment to share with you two reasons why our annual Consecration Sunday is so important in the life of First Church. First, your annual estimate of giving is a valuable tool for the leaders of our church as they plan for our church budget for 2023. Returning your commitment card helps us to estimate how much fuel we will have in the tank to accomplish our ministry and mission in the coming year. Your giving is critically important to funding our many ministries, reaching out to our community, caring for our beautiful facilities and supporting our dedicated staff.

Second, Consecration Sunday reminds us of the important role that financial giving plays in our spiritual growth as disciples of Jesus. Every year, Betsy and I, like many of you, prayerfully consider the percentage of our income God calls us to commit as we joyfully participate in God's work. The biblical principle for determining how much to give is the tithe, or 10%. All that we have is a gift from God, and He asks us to return the first 10% as our way of saying "thank you" for all that the Lord has given us. If you are not already tithing, God may be calling you to that commitment, or to take a step toward tithing. If you already tithe, your next faithful step may be to give beyond 10%.

As we prepare for Consecration Sunday amid the challenges and opportunities of this season, I am once again reminded of the significance of the word, "consecrate." To consecrate means, "to make or declare something sacred" or "to dedicate somebody or something to God." Long ago, our mothers and fathers in the faith consecrated our church building as a sacred space. They declared that the sanctuary to be set apart to glorify God in worship. The classrooms and fellowship hall, the offices and multipurpose room, and even the parking lots were dedicated as sacred spaces where each generation could grow in faith, fellowship and service for Christ.

On World Communion Sunday (Oct. 2), we will gather at the Lord's Table and say a prayer to consecrate the elements. We will remember that Jesus consecrated the bread and the cup as outward and visible signs of the grace of God for us in Christ. As we partake of the consecrated elements, we experience the love of our crucified and risen Lord, who died and rose again for our salvation.

The apostle Paul reminds us that, as followers of Jesus, we, too, have been consecrated. He writes, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God – what is good and acceptable and perfect" (Romans 12:2). We are set apart. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, our lives are formed to resemble the life of Jesus.

First Church, on Consecration Sunday you are invited to "make or declare a portion of your income sacred," consecrated to the Lord for His great work in 2023. As you give regularly, sacrificially and joyfully, may this be your prayer and mine: "Take my life and let it be, consecrated, Lord, to thee."

From the Library

I am writing this article just the day after Labor Day, and I am already missing summer. I know there will be more warm weather, but as soon as school starts, it seems like summer is over. And by the time you read this, it will be. So, get out your cozy throw, comfy pajamas and, of course, your pumpkin spice latte, as you are going to be up late reading in October.

I usually consider October to be mystery month in the library, but every once in a while I present something outside my own personal preference. Kim Vogel Sawyer is a perennial favorite in the library, so I know you will want to know about her latest book, **Still My Forever**. Ms. Sawyer does not follow the usual trilogy of books; instead presenting her books as stand-alone novels. This romance is inspired by a historical figure from her earlier book **Freedom's Song**. Gilbert Baty and Ava Flaming were once engaged, but it ended when Gil left for New York to seek his fame as a composer and conductor. Ava could not follow him as she was her ailing mother's caretaker, and it broke her heart to have him leave her behind. But now, Gil is back in Kansas, hiding his humiliating failures in New York and hoping Ava may give him another chance. His new inspiration is a youth band. Ava wants to avoid Gil, but seeing the youth band's success and how it affects the town's people, she is drawn back to the man she never stopped loving. Then, the band wins a statewide contest, and Gil thinks he can take them to New York and make a name for himself. But if he leaves again, Ava will never forgive him. Which is more important to him: his career or the love of his life? I won't spoil the ending.

Now I am back to my kind of books—suspense, with a little romance and enough twists and turns to cause whiplash. Susan May Warren writes those kinds of books and her latest series, *The Epic Story of RJ and York*, checks all the boxes for mystery readers. The three books, **Out of the Night, I Wll Find You**, and **No Matter the Cost** feature girlfriend RJ Marshall and boyfriend York Newgate. York thought their days as spies had ended and just as his ultra-romantic proposal is starting, RJ spots Alan Martin, a terrorist they thought was securely behind bars. Unknown to them, he has escaped to plan his biggest attack yet. As they chase him across Europe and into Russia, the plot twists just keep coming. This series has received a five star rating with many reviewers mentioning lost sleep and "swoon-worthy

romance" that moved them from book to book without stopping. The vivid scenery was also mentioned frequently. If the character RJ seems familiar to you, the RJ stands for Ruby Jane. Ms. Warren's five book series about the Marshall family ended on Ruby Jane, but I guess she just couldn't let her go yet. It is not necessary to read the early series, but if you want more of RJ's back story, you know where to go to find it –our library.

I can't imagine that these books wouldn't be just right for you, but, of course, we have a volunteer in the library every Sunday to help you find the perfect books.

We are grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, your presence and your support through service and gifts to the mission of our First Church family. As we move into the fall time of year, we look forward to cooler weather and getting back to regular Sunday School.

Change for Water!

Water is the foundation of our very lives. Yet, according to CDC estimates, only 2% of the population in Sierra Leone has access to clean, readily available drinking water! That morning, we interacted with families with different religions, ethnic backgrounds, personalities, interests and stories. But, we tried our hardest to welcome them all with open arms. George made funny faces to make the shy kids smile. Katie introduced herself to parents and shared about some of the great opportuni-

ties First Church offers for families. Tina and Janice greeted everyone at the door, helping everyone to feel like they can have a place at First Church.
