### From the Pastor

"Therefore, Go!"

Those words, lifted from the Great Commission in Matthew 28:19-20, serve as the theme for the 2016 General Conference of the United Methodist Church. The Conference, which takes place every four years, is scheduled for May 10-20 in Portland, Oregon. 864 delegates will represent our 12,311,438 member denomination. Members of the conference will act on 1,044 petitions to change *The Book of Discipline* and *The Book of Resolutions*, approve the denominational budget, and approve amendments to our constitution to send to the annual conferences.

Ten delegates, five clergy and five laypersons, were elected to represent the Susquehanna Conference last June at our annual conference sessions at Messiah College. Anne Horton, Director of Camping and Retreat Ministries for the conference and a member of First Church, was elected as a lay delegate. As the sixth clergy elected, I will attend the conference as a reserve delegate. Along with another clergy reserve and two lay reserves, we will be available to make sure our conference is fully represented at all the sessions.

In addition to participating in the proceedings of legislative committees and General Conference sessions, Anne and I will have the opportunity to join in numerous worship services and other celebrations. It is a wonderful privilege to join in uplifting worship, to hear inspiring preaching from our Bishops, to receive accounts of lives being transformed in Christ, and to share in fellowship with our United Methodist sisters and brothers from Africa, Asia, Europe, and North America. We are both grateful to represent not only our conference, but also our First Church family at this great gathering!

During the conference we will address a number of issues that will have a significant impact on the future of our denomination. Given the ethnic and theological diversity of our church, there will be difficult, and sometimes painful conversations. Anne and I ask that you hold us in your prayers, along with our fellow delegates, the presiding Bishops, and everyone involved. Ask the Holy Spirit to grant us wisdom to discern God's will and love that will unify us for the great mission to which we have been called.

When Anne and I return, we will have much to share with you from Portland. If you have a need for pastoral care while I am away, please contact the church office. Pastor Dave and our dedicated staff will continue our many ministries during this time. Be assured that as I travel and participate in the General Conference, you will be always in my thoughts and prayers. I cannot thank God enough for you!

### Attendance Challenge

The sermons, testimonies and small group discussions during our four week church-wide sermon series and small group study, "Just Walk Across the Room", helped us to see that evangelism is about developing friendships, discovering stories, and discerning next steps for pointing others to Christ.

One of those next steps is happening on **Sunday, May 8**. We will have an *Attendance Challenge* at our 8:15 and 10:45 a.m. services. We will celebrate Mother's Day/Festival of the Christian Home and welcome New Members. There will be inspiring music, faith sharing, and a sermon on the theme, "God Builds Bridges."

On May 10, 2015 (the same Sunday last year), attendance at our two services was 394. Pastor Denny is issuing a challenge for us to exceed last year's attendance by more than 100 people and to have 500 in attendance that day. If each of us brings a friend, we can do it! We might even exceed our Easter 2016 attendance of 615!

Of course, the goal of evangelism is not just to increase church attendance. It is to share the Good News of Jesus Christ with those who do not yet know him, and to welcome them into a Christian community like ours at First Church. As a loving community of Christ followers, let's encourage one another to continue on this path of pointing others to a life-changing relationship with Christ.

### Pentecost

Pentecost is coming up on Sunday, May 15th. This celebration represents an ending as well as a beginning: the end of the "Great Fifty Days" of the Easter Season (*Pentecost* means "the 50th day" in Greek) and the beginning of the early church.

Pentecost also gives us an opportunity to ask ourselves the question, What are we "on fire" about? What fans the flames of our church's ministry? Hopefully things like compassion, love, hospitality and a passion for justice come to mind.

So this Pentecost, remember the question: What is stirring within us? What warms our hearts? May the Holy Spirit work in surprising ways in all of our hearts so that others see and are drawn to the light of Christ!

Terry Blackstock has been one of my favorite mystery writers for over 25 years. Ms. Blackstock writes with passion and clarity about many hot topics. Meanwhile, Brent's family is devastated at his death and doesn't feel the police are doing enough to locate Casey. They hire Army vet, Dylan Robert who is fighting a private battle with PSTD, to investigate privately. Will her investigation into her father's murder end up costing Casey her life, or will Dylan track her down in time to save them both? A sequel will follow in December.

In the fall Trisha Goyer and pie specialist Sherry Gore started a series about a hometown bakery. **Made with Love** included some of Ms. Gore's special pie recipes. **Planted with Hope,** the second book in *The Pinecraft Pie Shop series,* finds Hope Miller expanding her bakery to include fresh produce grown right behind the bakery. Hope is excited about the prospect of her own little garden away from her family and all their well-meaning help. ### **Facilities**

The roof is leaking! The roof is leaking! The roof is leaking! I have heard those four words way too many times these past few months. Despite our best efforts, we have been unable to resolve the leak in the flat rubber roofing that ends up dripping onto the second floor hallway at the top of the center stairwell. As I reported last month, we replaced over 200 square feet of rubber roofing and some of the rigid foam insulation panels under the rubber roof in that area, only to have the leak reappear. We sealed over all of the overlapping seams and vertical corner joints in the rubber roofing in that area, only to have the leak reappear. Nothing we have done has been successful in stopping the water infiltration. Now we're thinking that the water may be leaking through the underside of the large air conditioning unit in that space. The unit's condensation drain was pretty much clogged with debris, so I cleaned it out and we sealed the roofing all around that equipment. Now we're waiting for another steady rain to see whether this latest "fix" does the trick or we need to try something else to resolve this persistent problem. My frustration level will go down considerably once I know we have this leak resolved.

Thank you to Judi Buddenbaum and Amy Erno for their efforts in painting in the Frederick Street stairwell from the main floor up to the balcony now that the balcony wall and ceiling plaster repairs are completed. What a professional looking job these ladies have done in sprucing up that area!

Matthew Canonizado's Eagle Scout project to construct a Prayer Garden on the Frederick Street side of the church building was completed shortly before Easter with the installation of a wooden cross as a prayer focal point. Thank you to Charlie Ryder for his help to Matthew in constructing the cross. It was awesome to see the cross draped with a black cloth after Maundy Thursday, and then to be reminded of Christ's resurrection with the draping of a white cloth on Easter morning. Please take advantage of this outdoor area for prayer and meditation.

PPL Electric recently changed out the tall area lamp in our church parking lot with new LED lighting. This provides lots of good light in the main parking area at a reduced cost to us, and the LED lamps should last a long, long time. In addition, Verizon recently changed all of our incoming phone lines from copper to fiber optic so we are up to date with the industry standard.

We recently purchased another set of choir risers and a backrail assembly for the risers. This should help alleviate the crowded conditions on the risers when our choirs are combined for special performances like the Christmas cantata.
