Honoring and Supporting Our Veterans

On Sunday, November 13, we will honor Veterans Day and support veterans in our church and community at our 8:15 and 10:45 worship services and during a special program at 9:30 in the Multi-Purpose Room.

Our special guest for the day is the Rev. David Smith, Coordinator of the Soul Care Initiative for Just-Peace. David, a clergy member of our Susquehanna United Methodist Conference, served 30 years as an Army Chaplain. During his service he deployed 9 times, including 4 combat deployments. He brings experience and passion to this topic. Rev. Smith will preach at our morning worship services and lead a workshop during Sunday school. He will help us explore the specific needs of returning warriors and their families and provide resources for how we as a congregation can support them.

There are almost 1.5 million veterans who live in Pennsylvania. Many who have served their country from the Guard and Reserves return home to face the biggest challenge of the war. The long term effects of Operation Enduring Freedom and Iraqi Freedom are profound; over 50,000 who were seriously wounded, over 43,000 traumatic brain injuries, over 4,000 new cases of PTSD every month.

The Department of Defense and the Veterans Administration have made progress in wounded warrior care under the rubrics of the physical, emotional, social, and psychological well-being. However, an underserved component of our veteran well-being is in their spiritual care. Many of our warriors return having experienced the invisible and silent wounds of war, in mind and spirit. The issues our service men and women experience are complex, but so too are the issues their families encounter.

Across the United States there are 5.5 million caregivers (family members) who ensure that their loved ones have compassionate quality care. Each day family members deal with the aftermath of the warriors wounds. The issues our veterans experience are complex, but so too are the issues their families encounter. The transition home from a deployment presents numerous challenges for the veteran, the veteran's family, and the community.

We invite every veteran and family in our church and community to attend one of our worship services and the workshop on November 13. In addition, we encourage you to invite family members, friends and neighbors who are veterans to join you that day.

As Rev. Smith reminds us, "Faith communities are uniquely positioned to heal the soul and strengthen the spirit of the veterans and their families." This is a special opportunity for us as a congregation to "Open Doors with Christ, One Another, and Our Neighbors" as we learn how to welcome and support our veterans and their families.

"This really solidified it for me."

This past weekend, **over 160 students and staff members** packed their cars and headed to High Point Camp near Lancaster County for West Chester Cru's annual Fall Retreat. It was a weekend of reconnecting with the Lord and fellowship with one another through games, meals, worship and listening to a speaker. During a period of time on Saturday night, the men and women split up to discuss two topics; for the men, bearing one another's burdens, and for the women, revival. Myself and LeeAnn lead the Men's and Women's ministries respectively, and were able to share our own insights on the topics.

LeeAnn spoke to the 100 women in attendance about revival, and what that looks like on West Chester's campus. She said that though it takes a lot of people to get there, revival starts with individuals. "To start a revival, you need to draw a circle around yourself and pray for a revival to start in the middle. Revivals start by recognizing the darkness we are living in and bringing it to the light." She then went on to share her story of how Jesus revived her, and how he continues to revive her daily. After she spoke, a girl name Elle came up to her and said her story had really impacted her. LeeAnn told her to listen to what God was trying to reveal to her during the prayer time, **and afterward she helped Elle walk through the steps to accept Christ into her life!**

I spoke to the men about the concept of bearing one another's burdens, and how it is applicable to our lives today. Galatians 6:2 says "Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ." I discussed how before I accepted Christ into my life, I carried my burdens on my shoulders and didn't let anyone else in on the sin happening in my life. Once I began walking with the Lord, I began being vulnerable with other men about different areas I was struggling in. I began to see healing because my brothers we're bearing these burdens with me.

After the weekend was over, I asked Graham, one of our students, how he felt about his decision to come to West Chester. In reference to Fall Retreat, he responded "This really solidified it for me."

September was an amazing month. We were able to host different events at our house, including a Women's Brunch and several "Man Week" events. "Man Week" consisted of an event each day of the week for the men of the ministry. We watched the Eagles game, played lawn games, went to a buffet, and had a cookout. This was all centered around the weekly Wednesday morning men's gathering we will continue throughout the year.

Thanks so much for being a part of what God is doing at West Chester University. We are humbled and grateful to have you on our team.

Library

Having just come off my annual sugar high (too much Halloween candy) and looking ahead to Thanksgiving, I find that sometimes it is easy to overlook Veterans Day. Unfortunately, with the longest war in our country's history, veterans are being created every day, and some have not left the war zone unscathed. During World War II and Viet Nam, news of the war was in the TV headlines every night. Now the war seems to be "old hat" and barely mentioned. Our veterans and military families are carrying a huge burden almost sight unseen. This year would be a good year for me, and maybe you, to remember our brave fighting men and women.

Denise Hunter has addressed the disabled vet in her latest book, **Just a Kiss**. Third in the series of *Summer Harbor* novels, the Callahan family is center stage again. Riley Callahan fled to boot camp when Paige, the woman he secretly loved, fell for his brother Beau. But when he received word in Afghanistan that they had broken up, Riley vowed to go home after his tour and tell Paige of his feelings and find out if she might feel the same. Then an IED takes the life of a comrade and leaves Riley an amputee. How could he ever think Paige would love him in this condition? To his horror his parents have arranged for Paige to be his caregiver during his recovery. Meanwhile, Paige is dealing with the loss of the Callahan family. When she was Beau's girl she loved being a part of his big caring family and now she wonders if her growing feelings for Riley are just an opportunity to be a part of this family again. Her life's work of running an animal shelter is in jeopardy too as she loses her funding and may have to close the shelter. Can two dysfunctional hurting adults find the love they crave and work out their problems at the same time? Ms. Hunter's books are always so romantic that even I can get lost in a less adrenaline charged book.

If you want to go back in time, **The Promise of Jesse Woods** which set in the 70's and 80's is the book for you. Written by Chris Fabry, it is a story of the preacher's kid, Matt Plumley, who ends up in Dogwood, West Virginia where his dad is sent to pastor a new church. Matt was happy in Pittsburgh, and enjoyed following the Pirates battle for back-to-back World Series titles. In Dogwood, he is an outsider but finds friendship with two other outcasts, Dickie Darrel Lee Hancock, a mixed race boy, and Jesse Woods, a girl that lives in poverty and has no Dad in sight. The three roam the hills and hollers as best friends. Matt knows he loves Jesse, and one night they make promises to each other. But trouble comes to the trio and a secret severs their bond of friendship. Matt is pulled away when his father again relocates the family. But Matt never forgets Jesse. Twelve years later, when he reads in the paper she is about to marry one of the boys who was so cruel to her that summer, Matt decides he must go back and find out if she needs him. And to learn the truth of what caused the break in their friendship. Chris Fabry has a reputation for writing beautiful heartfelt books, and you will find this to be true of this book also.
