"Christ, the First Fruits"

Last year my wife Betsy and I attended our first Easter Sunrise Service in Mechanicsburg. Led by members of our youth group, the service took place in the Mechanicsburg Cemetery. I have celebrated Easter sunrise on top of the mountain at King's Gap, along the seashore in New Jersey, at fairgrounds and county parks, in church sanctuaries and fellowship halls, and on church lawns. But last year was the first time I had ever celebrated Easter in a graveyard.

The service was wonderful. It ended with Lisa Aronson blowing a **shofar**, a ram's horn used by the ancient Hebrews to celebrate victory. Somehow Lisa managed to get enough air to sound the shofar, even though she was just weeks away from the birth of her son, Joshua! The whole service was a most special way to begin our Easter celebrations.

Seeing a bunch of people gathered in a graveyard in the cold of an early April morning may look strange to some. We go to cemeteries to bury deceased loved ones, to grieve those we've lost, and to honor the dead with wreathes, flowers, and flags. It seems an unlikely place for an early morning gathering, but for us it has great significance. At Easter we celebrate that Christ has conquered the grave. He is victorious over death. Because he lives, we shall live also.

In I Corinthians 15:20 the apostle Paul illustrates what Christ's Resurrection means for us.

But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

(I Corinthians 15:20)

In Biblical times, people couldn't get fresh fruits and vegetables just by going to the produce department of the local grocery store. They had to wait until the season came for fruit to grow. When summer came and fruit began to ripen, it was a happy event. People had waited a long time for the first fruits of the season. Imagine their delight in the first fruits.

In a couple of months, we will get the first fruits of the season. We will finally be able to eat a real tomato again—not the tasteless, hard tomatoes of winter, but the firm, ripe, red, juicy tomatoes of summer. That first real tomato of the year is a special treat, isn't it? I'm writing this in the middle of a mid-March blizzard and I'm picturing a hamburger just off the grill with a thick slice of tomato on top. There is nothing like it!

A part of the joy of that first tomato of the summer is the realization that it is just the first of many red, ripe, juicy summer tomatoes. That one tomato announces the coming of a host of tomatoes. It is the first of many fruits. And so it is with the resurrection of Christ. Easter is God's promise that just as Christ has risen from the dead so we, through his power, shall be victorious over the grave. Christ rose as the first fruits, the first of many who will rise from the dead.

April is filled with special events and worship experiences at First Church. We will celebrate with worship on Palm Sunday, our annual Passion Play, Holy Thursday Communion and Easter. Once again at sunrise we will gather in the Mechanicsburg Cemetery. Why? Because we have victory in Jesus! We have hope eternal in the Risen Lord!

Endowment Committee

First Endowment Proceeds to be Distributed

The Endowment Fund of First United Methodist Church ended 2016 in the very favorable and long-anticipated position of being able to distribute proceeds for the first time.

The Endowment Fund, now in its 10th year, has grown steadily due to the generous support of our congregation, as well as a strong overall economy and Stock Market.

As a result, the Endowment Fund generated \$11,200 in income to be used in 2017. Of this, roughly \$8,000 is undesignated and will be used to support church ministries. The remaining balance, in accordance with the donor's wishes, will be added to a special fund created for the restoration of First Church's historic stained glass windows.

For the undesignated portion, the Endowment Committee and church staff invited requests for support from church committees for specific missions and ministries. The following requests were approved by the Administrative Board at its March meeting to receive funding this year.

Family Fun Fest – In August, the Fellowship and Evangelism/Outreach Committees will host a new outreach event targeted to families in our community. In addition to carnival games, face painting and other fun activities, children who attend will receive free backpacks and school supplies. The goal is to help First Church become more engaged with our community.

New MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) Program - MOPS provides support and encouragement to the mothers of young children through group meetings and the use of mentors. The goal is to help young moms become more confident, and equip them to become leaders who then strengthen their families and communities. We will start a MOPS chapter at First Church, to serve the significant number of young families (ages 25-35) in Mechanicsburg.

Support for First Church Members to Attend Mission Trips - We are blessed to have several church members, both youth and adults, who have felt the call to attend mission trips. Locations range from nearby Lancaster to international missions work later this fall at our sister church in Taiama, Sierra Leone. The Missions Committee will provide financial assistance, upon request, to help individual church members finance their mission trips.

Each program represents a new mission or ministry for which no budget was allocated in 2017.

Dan, Caleb and I were basically on our own making executive decisions and continuing to keep the movements going all semester. I have to say, that we did a pretty great job at it, but that is truly all because of the Lord.

Day in and day out Dan, Caleb and I see a lot of each other. This past month we started seeing how broken and sinful we truly are. When we started to realize that, we always had wonderful, but hard conversations with each other. I personally found it really hard to fully love like Christ loves during this process.

Not only was it hard to love like Christ loves, but Christ was constantly revealing himself to me and all of my shortcomings.

A huge thing that came to the surface was that I need to stop feeling guilty. I am a HUGE people pleaser (not always healthy). God was truly showing me, through so many people asking me to do things, that I needed to come to a screaching hault and analyze where I find my identity. Do I find my identity in what others think of me/my perfomance or am I finding my identity in Christ?

I am so beyond blessed to have Dan and Caleb not only as team mates, but as my brothers in Christ. We may have had a big "storming" (one of the phases of team building) phase this past month, but boy oh boy was it beneficial. I have never been more awakened to my own shortcomings and how I need to be able to fully love on others when it gets hard.

I am still working on feeling guilty and accepting grace, but recognizing it is the first step. My goodness, it is so refreshing and freeing!!



But neither Sam nor Willow can foresee that a sudden snow storm will strand them together in the wilderness with a group of teenagers. Injured, with little more than hope to help them, they work together to survive and protect their charges. Maybe a crisis will allow love to grow in a way neither of them had planned. Get the coffee and plan to stay up late. If you missed the first book, **Wild Montana Skies**, it is on the shelf waiting to be enjoyed too!
