Currently studying *Crazy Love* by Francis Chan. Come to discover the life-altering, awe-inspiring, dream-changing, intense and relentless ways that God loves you!
- GUYER CLASS (Room 125B in sanctuary) A well-established group of elders in the church who study the United Methodist Quarterly Adult Bible Studies, which are designed as encouragement and instruction in living a life of faith.
- **HELPING HANDS CLASS** (Room 105 in office wing) A group of active seniors who focus on studies designed as encouragement and instruction on living a life of faith. Interactive studies and discussions are led by several class members. Also, class members enjoy many Christian social activities together.
