Opening Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors

"Relationship Builders"

At First Church we are "Opening Doors with Christ, One Another, and Our Neighbors." All of us are called to build relationships with one another. We are also called to follow the example of Jesus and build relationships with our neighbors.

Our Sunday morning worship services in January and February will focus on building relationships. In addition to two series of sermons, we will continue the congregation-wide daily Bible reading we began in 2018. We will also have Bible studies and other special events.

In the first series, we will focus on the importance of community for every follower of Christ.

We will see that following Jesus is not about ME, but WE as we explore Paul's instruction about the value and the power of Christian community in I Corinthians 12 and 13. We are the Body of Christ together! With the help of the Holy Spirit, imperfect people like us can build loving relationships that change the world.



In the second series, we will discover practical ways to join Jesus in building relationships with our neighbors.

We will see that everywhere Jesus went, there were crowds. One big reason is that Jesus truly saw all the people. We will follow Jesus through a portion of Luke's gospel and make note of the way Jesus responded to the crowds. Jesus invites us to pay attention, to affirm the value of every person, and to build loving compassionate relationships in the church and in the community.

I hope you enjoyed Christmas and had a chance to read some of our inspiring Christmas books. If not, feel free to stop in and read some at your leisure. I read Christmas books anytime because it makes Christmas last all year long. Since this newsletter is covering January and February, let's jump right into romance books. It's the perfect way to get you in to the Valentine season.

A popular romantic phrase is "I love you to the moon and back." Karen Kingsbury, often called the "queen of Christian fiction", has taken this phrase, shortened it and made it into a book title. **To the Moon and Back** is a deeply emotional and highly romantic tale of love lost and found. Both Brady Bradshaw and Jenna Phillips have lost parents in the Oklahoma City bombing. During a visit to the memorial site the two meet and spend the day together. After parting Brady realizes he has no way to contact Jenna and longs to see her again. For years he attends the annual memorial in hopes of seeing Jenna again. Each year he leaves a message on the famous Survivor Tree hoping she will contact him. When two of the Baxter sisters decide to visit the Oklahoma City memorial, they spot a obviously trouble young man, Brady. Though Ashley Baxter Blake's family and especially her husband think she should not involve herself, Ashley makes it her mission to find Jennifer for Brady. Can true love grow out of shared grief? This romance may keep you up late.

If you like romantic suspense, no one writes it better than Irene Hannon. Amazon calls her the "queen of romantic suspense". (Two queen of hearts in the same newsletter!) **Hidden Peril** is book two in the *Code of Honor series*. Kristin Dane and two friends made a promise to each other to grow up and make the world a better place. Twenty years later, Kristin is doing that with her fair trade shop featuring products from around the world. Then all the sudden, people connected to the shop begin to die. Detective Luke Carter of the St. Louis PD begins to investigate; only to have the FBI swoop in taking over the case, saying it's an international crime. But Luke can't walk away and leave Kristin in peril. The reviewers say this has an explosive ending. Sounds like a great way to end an intriguing book! If you missed book one in the series, **Hidden Illusions** is on the shelf waiting for you.

If neither of these books is right for you, stop in the library and the staff will help you find just the right book for you!

Feminine Hygiene Kits

Just a reminder about the sewing day Deborah Circle is sponsoring to make feminine hygiene kits for Mission Central. If you have not heard about these kits, it is an eye opener to know what women and girls do in poor countries to take care of their menstrual period. Sometimes they use dirt or weeds or worse during this time and if nothing works, they must stay home from school or work one week a month. This adds to their poverty and lack of education. To get a fuller look at this project go to Mission Central and look under ways to contribute and there is a larger explanation, patterns, and directions. You can help with this project even if you don't sew. There is a lot of cutting out of materials and if you do sew simple sewing. A serger sewing machine is very helpful but not mandatory.

We will start at 8:30 on January 12th (January 19th if we need a snow day) and sew until the fabric is used up, we are done, or you just need to leave. We will be setting up in Fellowship Hall. Pack a lunch if you care too. Coffee and muffins will be provided in the morning. Deborah Circle is providing the first \$100. worth of fabric including the all-important water proof fabric needed. If you can bring flannel or cottons for the project great. All fabrics must be washed in unscented soap and no fabric softener used. If the fabric is preshrunk and the kit made properly the kit will last 3 years. The fabric dos and don'ts are listed on the Mission Central website (and there are several). If you can bring your sewing machine-great. Other sewing supplies such as sharp scissors, rotor cutters, quilting rulers, and cutting mats will be needed. Dark thread is always used. In order to have enough fabric and patterns, please call or email me, Donna Nichols at djnichols43@hotmail.com. Tanya Weaver who presented this project Mission Central and actually went to Africa and distributed these kits said it was just like Christmas- the girls and women were so happy to have the kits. It was also mentioned that this kits maybe distributed poor areas in our country. **Relationship Builder**



StrongWomen/Growing Stronger Strength Training Program

First United Methodist Church in Mechanicsburg and Penn State Extension will be teaming up again to offer the **StrongWomen/Growing Stronger Program** this winter. This 10-week program is geared for middleaged to older women and men and is based upon years of research on how strength training and proper nutrition improve the health of women and men of all ages. The program was developed to help individuals increase their strength, bone density, balance and energy and help them look and feel better. Participants will meet two times a week for one hour sessions. There is a \$75 fee for this program.
