RE-CREATION

Re-Creation began in 1976, when Hugh Brooks, the founder of the group, was an instructor at the Pennsylvania State University. While visiting practicum students, Mr. Brooks realized that very



few institutions have an opportunity to benefit from the therapeutic value of live professional entertainment.

Concerned, he, his wife, Carolyn and daughter, Katie, organized Re-Creation, to offer this service to state centers, prisons, hospitals, nursing homes and other care facilities. Entertainers were enlisted and Re-Creation immediately began institutional performances in Pennsylvania.

Within a very short time Re-Creation was asked to tour for the USO and Veteran Affairs Medical Centers were added to the schedule.

In 1982, the national entertainment program to the VA Hospitals was in danger of being lost. There would no longer be a coordinated nation-wide effort to provide our hospitalized veterans with good entertainment, and certainly not entertainment that was designed to serve as therapy.

Re-Creation assumed full responsibility for live entertainment to the VA Medical Centers in 1983 and since then has attempted to raise necessary funding and present shows for Medical Centers nationwide. Re-Creation now presents more than 320 shows annually in order to fund tours to VA Medical Centers and State Veterans Homes in all 50 states!

Walk-in visitors and new class members are welcome in all classes.

- **GROWING IN CHRIST** (Room B004) An intergenerational class designed for adults of all ages. Short-term studies selected to challenge thinking and create fruitful conversation of Christian principles. Currently studying "Jesus Among Secular Gods". This study runs through June 30—drop in any Sunday!
- FAITH IN EVERYDAY LIFE (Room 207) A group of singles and couples age 25ish and above, but all are welcome. A discussion-based class that values friendship. Come discuss a variety of contemporary topics related to living out the Christian faith, compassion, and social justice.
- **FAITHFUL FAMILIES** (B001A) This class is made up of parents who are in the child-raising stage of life, and who enjoy discussion-based Bible studies related to living a faithful, Christ-centered life.
- CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP (Room 223) A multi-generational adult class that selects short-term studies which generate challenging discussion of Christian principles. Beginning June 2, Tom Berlin will lead us in a 5 part DVD series called "Restored Finding Redemption in Our Mess". We will study the journey from our own brokenness to redemption and restoration through Jesus. All are invited!
- HELPING HANDS CLASS (Room 105) A group of active seniors who focus on studies designed as encouragement and instruction on living a life of faith. Interactive studies and discussions are led by several class members. Also, class members enjoy many Christian social activities together.
- GUYER CLASS (Room 123) A well-established group of elders in the church who study together using the United Methodist Quarterly Adult Bible Study lessons. Each lesson is focused on scripture, and encourages participants to live a faith-filled life.


