"Are You A Lifelong Learner?"

The other day I came across an article by blogger and author Oscar Nowik, "12 Signs You Are a Lifelong Learner." He writes,

Lifelong Learners...

1. Read on a daily basis.
2. Attend various courses.
3. Seek opportunities to grow.
4. Take care of their bodies.
5. Have diverse passions.
6. Love making progress.
7. Challenge themselves with specific goals.
8. Embrace change.
9. Believe it's never too late to start something.
10. Have a contagious attitude.
11. Leave their comfort zone.
12. Never settle down.

This list grabbed my attention because, as I read it, I realized how relevant these 12 signs are for us as followers of Jesus. At First Church we value ***Growing as Disciples***: "We believe God wants us to continually grow to be like Christ." From the Library

I love October—the change of seasons, crisp apples, and, of course, Halloween. The library celebrates October by concentrating on mystery books which as you know are my favorite genre. And I have some really good mystery books for you. So let's go right to the heart of the matter.

Lynette Eason has been one of my favorite authors for some time. In her latest series, ***Blue Justice***, Ms. Eason has introduced us to the St. John family—a family that bleeds blue. Mom is the chief of police and five of the six siblings are in law enforcement. Each book featured a family member and now to wrap up the series in ***Vow of Justice***, we meet Lincoln, an FBI agent. Just before his wedding to Allison Radcliffe, she was murdered. Lincoln has dedicated his life to hunting down her killers. Imagine his shock when he discovers she is still alive. How is he supposed to feel when he finds out that he wasn't part of the inner circle of people helping her to hide? Swallowing down the hurt and anger hasn't been easy, but now he is going to help Allison stop the killers before they succeed for real. With this last book in the series all the books are on the shelf ready for you to breeze through with no waiting. The reviewers say Ms. Eason wraps the series up with a tidy bow. Get the coffee ready and plan to stay up late.

Dani Pettrey has started a new series, ***Coastal Guardians***, with the first book titled ***Killing Tide***. Set in Wilmington, North Carolina, the Coast Guard Investigative Service team is brought in when a Coast Guard officer is murdered and another goes missing. Finn Walker is finding this to be a very dangerous investigation for his team, and he doesn't need his boss's sister as his sidekick. Gabby Rowley is an investigative reporter and will go to any lengths to get a story—even as far as putting herself and Finn's team in danger. Sparks fly between the two as they investigate in different ways. Those sparks are sometimes anger, but sometimes they are feelings for each other that they try to deny. I know you will want to read this quickly to find out “who dun it”, but sadly the next book is not in sight yet!!

These two books are only the tip of the suspense iceberg—stop in for the latest from Nancy Mehl, Irene Hannon, or Lisa Harris just to name a few. And if that is not your genre, stop in and let us help you find just the right book.






Extravagant Hospitality

Endowment Grants Support Patriotic Quilts, Sensory Area and Other Projects

The Endowment Committee of First United Methodist Church is pleased to announce grant support of the following projects in 2019.

Patriotic Quilts for Veterans - In June, First Church presented 30 beautiful patriotic-themed quilts, handmade by the Squares & Prayers Circle, to veterans or those currently serving in the military. It was a modest but heartfelt gesture of thanks for their service. An Endowment grant helped support the cost of

the materials to make the quilts.

Sensory Area in Sanctuary – First Church will create a new Sensory Space in the back corner of the sanctuary (under the balcony) in an effort to welcome worshippers of all abilities, and help them to have a more comfortable and meaningful worship experience. The grant will help provide items such as a rocking chair, yoga ball, and fidget toys.

“Beyond Suffering” Training – First Church will offer “Beyond Suffering,” a course designed to prepare leaders in ministry, education, medicine, and science to effectively serve the needs of individuals with disabilities and their families. This course is unique in that it views disability and suffering through a Biblical lens. The course will be open to our members, the Mechanicsburg community of churches, and the local district of The United Methodist Church.

“Drawing Nearer to God” Creative Classes – First Church will host a series of crafting classes at a local retreat center, with God’s word as the backdrop. The goal is to reach those who do not attend a church, in a fun and comfortable setting. The classes are modeled on Fresh Expressions, an international movement of missionary disciples cultivating new kinds of church alongside existing congregations to more effectively engage our growing post-Christian society.

The grants were funded with annual income from the Endowment Fund.
