

An Update From Pastor Denny

On May 5, a task force with representatives from our church's administrative committees and staff began planning for reopening the church. The word, "reopening" is a bit of a misnomer. First Church has never really been closed! Since mid-March when the decision was made to close the church building, we have been alive and active! In fact we've seen some amazing things happen since we've been gathering online for worship and small groups. I'm really proud of our efforts to support each other and to help people in our community with food and other necessities. Your generous giving has helped our church's ministry continue at this most critical time. As our county has moved into the yellow phase, we've begun to see some businesses reopen. We've also seen some churches begin to meet in their buildings. While we're longing for the day when we can all be together again, our task force has decided not to reopen the building at this time. This decision was guided by three important commitments.

#1 Safety: We're committed to taking appropriate measures to ensure the health and safety of every person in every activity related to First Church, whether it takes place in our building or another location. We're also committed to honoring and respecting elected officials, following the advice of medical experts, and protecting the broader Mechanicsburg community. As I said in the sermon this past Sunday, maintaining high standards of safety and protection for all, we are being good neighbors.

#2 Hospitality: We're committed to extending hospitality to everyone. Public health officials advise that in the yellow phase indoor gatherings be limited to 25 people. If we begin holding public services now, who gets left out? Even if we gather in two or three spaces in the building at multiple times, we will still have to exclude most of our congregation. Officials also advise that younger children, people age 65 and over, and others who are vulnerable remain safely at home. Opening the building for worship now does not allow us to "feel like us." Nor does it allow us enthusiastically to welcome new people into the life of our congregation. Until restrictions are lifted and we can hold larger gatherings, we will continue to hold worship services, classes, small groups, and other activities online. In addition, soon we may be able to begin in-person gatherings in small groups that meet outside of the church building. Following appropriate social guidelines, these meetings would provide some good first steps toward reengaging with one another and our community.

#3 Clear Communication: We're committed to communicate clearly so that everyone understands what we are doing, why we are doing it, and that they will be able to participate in it in some way. We do not know how long it will be until we move into the next phase and can safely hold larger gatherings, but we are already making plans so that we will be ready.

Please continue to pray with me in this time of national crisis. Pray for the suffering and the grieving, for the helpers and the researchers, and for public servants and community leaders. I also ask for your prayers for the pastors, staff, and leaders of our church and other churches. We believe that our present and our future are in the hands of a loving God! We are a people of hope!

From the Library

In May's newsletter, I told you I was still ordering and receiving books and they would be on the shelf ready for you when the church reopens. No sooner had I dotted the last "i" and crossed the last "t", did I get an email saying that Christian Book Distributors in Massachusetts was shut down till further notice. But as always, there are still books that I haven't talked about and many other treasures on the shelves for you to discover. I better get started!!

Karen Kingsbury's new book **Someone Like You: a Novel** (Baxter Family Novel) is on the shelf. Ms. Kingsbury always meets current news head on, and this story is no exception. Maddie Baxter West discovers as an adult that she was adopted as an embryo. Her adopted family always meant to tell her, but somehow the time never seemed right. Maddie is thrown into turmoil by this news and throws her current life of new job, fiancé, and family out the window. She moves to Portland to discover her "real" family and to find out where she belongs in this world. In Portland Dawson Gage's feels like his life is over, when his fiancée, London Quinn is killed in an auto accident. Dawson learns that London may have a sister from a donated embryo. He finds Maddie and brings her to the Quinns for a reunion. But will it be more than that?

And what about the family Maddie left behind?

Francine Rivers has written a two-volume series about four generations of women struggling to find their place in the world. Her first novel **Mother's Hope** starts in Switzerland with Marta Schnieder at the beginning of the 20th century. Marta leaves Europe to settle in Canada and open a boarding house. There she meets Niclas Waltert. They marry and move to central California and start a vineyard. The second half of the story revolves around their daughter Hildamara Rose and how World War II challenges the family and all they have built.

In second book, **Her Daughter's Dream**, Hildamara is quarantined with TB so her mother Marta comes to take care of her granddaughter Carolyn straining the relationship between Hildamara and Carolyn. Later in the 1960's in San Francisco college-aged Carolyn has her life shattered in the counter culture of the times. She eventually brings her daughter, May Flower Dawn, home to try and restart her life and build a life for her daughter. The tensions between Carolyn and Hildamara come back to haunt them and the women struggle to be a family. Dawn finds herself drawn to her grandmother and would like to find a way to build a bridge in her family to bring all the generations together. After so much hurt, can that be possible? I will let you read this sweeping saga on your own to find out. Both books are on the shelf ready for you!

In this series, as we focus on the Great Commission, we will look at **four gifts Jesus calls us to bring** to a world in the midst of unprecedented change. It's a different world we're living in now, but our mission is still the same.



June 7 — Patience

“All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me.”

One of the hardest things in our world today is waiting on God's timing. Many of us are frustrated, wanting everything to return to normal. Knowing that our present and our future belong to Jesus, we bring the gift of patience to a troubled world.

June 14 — Community

“Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, ...”

Many of us struggle with isolation, but social distancing does not have to mean social isolation. Jesus modeled community for us and calls us to build a loving community that welcomes everyone.

June 21 — Obedience

Where do we turn for answers in this troubled world? Jesus calls us to anchor our lives in his teaching and to share his life-changing message with others.

June 28 — Certainty

*“And remember, I am with you **always**, to the end of the age.”*

Uncertainty about the future can create stress, anxiety and frustration. Whatever tomorrow brings, we are certain that Jesus is always with us.

While we may not be able to gather physically at this time, the ministry of First United Methodist Church is still alive and active! Check out what we've been up to!

From Congregational Care:

Congregational Care greetings from home! While I continue to think about First Church not as the building or the space where we typically gather, but instead as a community of Christ's people, I have two initial reactions. First, I am again painfully reminded of how long we are being called to live out our faith while physically separated from one another. However, I am also encouraged by the creative and practical ways many are finding to connect and support one another as a family of followers.

One church member was recently inspired by her neighbor to begin walking around her neighborhood each day, not only for exercise and fresh air, but to be able to say a prayer and blessing for her neighbors along the way. As time passes, more and more of our church family have been able to connect with Sunday worship...for some it has been figuring out the technology to watch worship on their computer or smart phone; others have received DVD players to watch worship recorded on DVDs; and most recently we have been forming partnerships to enable those with a phone to be able to listen to the worship service with someone else watching the online service at their home.

As we endure this season, I encourage you to seek meaning and purpose by connecting, comforting, and helping others, whether your family, neighbors, co-workers, or faith family. Confront your feelings of discouragement and helplessness by seeking personal growth and action in asking the questions: How can I pray? How can I serve? How can I give? How can I grow closer to God? You are more than likely to feel renewed and uplifted in return for your efforts. Here are a few suggestions to get you started!

- Someone on your mind? Get in touch! Give them a call, send an email, or mail a note!
- Create small bouquets from your garden to share with a neighbor or friend.
- Set aside a pocket of time to lift up the concerns from the weekly FUMC Prayer Letter.
- Collect or purchase food items or personal care items to deliver on a Wednesday to the designated drop off points in support of New Hope Ministries, Mission Central, and the Little Free Pantries.
- Check-in with a neighbor or friend to see if they need anything before you head out to the food store, pharmacy, garden store, etc.
- Plant some flowers around your neighbor's mailbox.
- Offer to help someone with the care of their yard or garden or check with John Bowen about any Backyard Mission projects.
- While libraries are closed, share some of your favorite books with an avid reader. Record yourself reading a favorite children's story to send to a relative or family from church with small children.
- Forward the link from Sunday's worship to a family or friend so they can experience your church.
- Offer to be a phone worship partner for someone who doesn't have an internet connection.

Please let me know what you try or what other ideas you may have! We read in 2 Corinthians 3:17, "The Lord is the Spirit, and where the Lord's Spirit is, there is freedom." I encourage you to find freedom and meaning by expressing the Lord's Spirit within you to others!

Bricks in the form of Sunday children's videos and Zoom calls, Scripture prayers, parent affirmations, prayer requests, fun activity resources, and a listening ear are placed every week. There are more pixelated bricks than we are used to, but we know a foundation built on God's Word will not waiver. As we come alongside our First Church children and families, our intention is to point to God's love, His Word- active and alive regardless of what season we are in, and express God's constant presence in our lives.
