"Sacred Spaces"

"Thou hast made us for thyself, O Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find rest in thee. (Augustine, 4th Century)

The famous prayer of Augustine comes to mind for me as I think about this present time. Many of us are restless these days. So much in our lives has been rearranged in the midst of this pandemic. A new school year approaches, filled with uncertainty. Many of us are growing impatient and asking, "will there be an end to this?" We yearn for peace for our souls. Now more than ever we need sacred spaces.

What would you consider the sacred spaces in your life?

For many of us, churches are sacred spaces. The worship space of every church I've served, including First Church, has been a space where I could hear the gracious invitation to come away for a while and rest. The sanctuary of my home church in Carlisle holds special meaning for me. In that space, as I gaze at the beautiful architecture and stained glass windows and breathe in all that is so familiar to me, I recall special people and special experiences. Always, I feel close to God when I'm there. I pray that our church sanctuary is, for all of us, a place like that.

Churches are not the only places that are sacred to us. Our homes can be sacred spaces. During our quarantine time, before we began re-gathering in the building a few weeks ago, our family room became our Sunday morning place of worship. Like many of you, Betsy and I have claimed the space between the sofa and the television set as "holy ground." We have been so very blessed as we've joined online with our church family in worship.

We can find sacred space in our homes all week long. If you're working from home now, or you have young children at home, it may be challenging, but we can all find God's presence in the midst of our daily life there. Some of you may have a special room or a corner in your home where you can go to pray, or read, or listen to worshipful music, or write in a journal, or work with your hands, open to the presence of God.

Many find sacred spaces in the outdoors. Perhaps you have a spot at a church camp or a retreat center where you feel close to God. Or, you like to meet God on hiking trails, or digging in the garden, or mowing the lawn, or fishing by a stream, or floating in a raft, or lying on the beach, or walking in the neighborhood.

Relationships can be sacred spaces. With Christ at the center, the relationship between a husband and wife can be a holy place of blessing and peace. The love shared between parent and child, grandparent and grandchild, brothers and sisters, family and friends can be sacred spaces. Perhaps you have found, as I have, that sacred space formed in relationships within the Body of Christ.

What would you consider the sacred spaces in your life? Whatever they may be, I encourage you to return to them often! For God is there, yearning to be with you and to give rest to your souls.

Email and Text Scam-Alert

In response to receiving an email or text message from someone you know and trust from First Church (including recent incidents involving Pastor Denny's list of contacts), our first reaction is to open the text or email and respond. We would like to caution you, however, to be alert for a message that seems 'suspicious' or does not sound like something the sender would typically say, or ask you to do.

- If you receive emails, text messages, or Facebook posts from First Church staff or friends asking you for money, or asking you to purchase Walmart or Amazon gift cards etc., this is most certainly a scam.
- There is no way to stop this kind of scammer, so we caution you to look twice to check the email address or phone contact, which typically will be different from the email or number you have in your personal contacts.
- When in doubt, please do not respond by replying to the text/email that you received.
- Try calling or emailing the individual directly from your contact list to determine if they are truly trying to reach you.

From the Library

I cannot believe that summer is almost over. Usually I would be writing about back to school and anticipating the start of football and soccer season. But this is such an unusual year—time to make other goals—like more time to sew or crochet or, even better, read! The best thing about books is you can be sitting in your recliner with a double expresso latte and be anywhere in the world or any place in time. When H. G. Wells tried to invent the time machine, he didn't realize it had already been invented in writing. So let me take you to Scotland and then on to England today. Get that coffee brewing.

The MacDonald Family Trilogy is written by Carla Laureano and is set in Scotland. In **Five Days in Skye**, Andrea Sullivan, a hospitality consultant is trying to snag a rich client, James MacDonald. Andrea has five days on the beautiful Isle of Skye to convince James she is the perfect consultant. And, of course, you know there is going to be romance. Though both Andrea and James are highly successful people, their private lives are full of turmoil. Can they really find a meaningful relationship in just five days?

But enough of Scotland, let's go to London. Grace Brennan, Irish photojournalist, has traveled war zones all over the world, documenting the helpless victims of war. She left Ian MacDonald, the only man she ever loved, to follow her career. But when her colleague is killed, Grace is shaken and returns to London to find out if Ian has forgotten her. Ian has not forgotten the woman that left him right before their wedding, the woman he gave up his dreams of Olympic gold for, the woman that put her career before him! Sadly, Ian has become a bitter cynical man. Grace wants to find forgiveness and grace from him. In this second book **London Tides**, Grace is going to need more strength than she thought she could have and the help of her heavenly Father.

But enough of London, back to the Isle of Skye, in the third and final book, Under Scottish Stars. In this book, I was expecting another brother to be the central character, but instead it is their widowed sister, Serena MacDonald Stewart. After the death of her husband, Serena wants to concentrate more on her children, and her brothers think the Isle of Skye and overseeing their new guest house would be the perfect location for her. When she needs a manager, incredibly attractive Malcolm Blake applies for the job. But he has his own baggage. He has left his home, girlfriend, and career to return to Scotland to raise his late sister's teenage daughter, and he is not too happy with the arrangement. As they work together, sparks begin to fly and not all of them romantic. See how long it takes the author to bring them around.

This trilogy has been rated high on Amazon, because of the very vivid descriptions of Scotland with the lush Isle of Skye as the focus and because the books are very romantic. Don't miss this "travel" experience. Plus all three are on the library shelf—no waiting for the next installment. Hope to see you

Our YTD actual expenses continue to be less than planned as the church staff is working hard to reduce discretionary spending to help keep our financial position in good shape. We are grateful to be holding "inperson" services with the appropriate safeguards in place according to guidelines. We are also continuing our Sunday services online. In July, giving continues to run behind an average weekly budget by \$2 - \$3 thousand per week. We appreciate all the support for our church during this difficult time and are thankful for those who have been able to continue in prayer and financial support of our ministry. Until we gather again, we hope you will consider mailing your contributions to the church office or utilizing electronic giving via the church website. Please be sure to visit the church website for regular updates and online services.

Mechanicsburg Bucks Initiative

First Church is pleased to contribute to the newly formed Mechanicsburg 'Bucks' program which supports individuals, families and businesses in need. Individuals and families in need will be identified by local organizations. Funds will then be distributed to those families in the form of paper "bucks" to spend at a list of participating local businesses. Participating businesses will then work with the Downtown Mechanicsburg Partnership, which will serve as a "clearinghouse" for the program, and exchange the "bucks" for real money. The money the partnership receives will be donated from local organizations, churches and businesses. Participating businesses will also be asked to give 10-20% discounts to those using the Mechanicsburg Bucks so the money stretches farther. (Cumberlink.com, August 12, 2020).
