When our church sanctuary was built 110 years ago, a marvelous scene was chosen for one of the two large stained glass windows. The scene is reported in Matthew, Mark, and Luke.

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them. (Matthew 19:13-15, Mark 10:13-16, Luke 18:15-17)

Every child is precious to Jesus.

- 1. Jesus' love for children was so widely known that generations later Matthew, Mark, and Luke all gave it a prominent place in the gospel story!
- 2. People in Jesus' day had a passion for bringing their kids to Jesus. They went to such great lengths to have him bless them, even when the stern disciples told them, "You're not welcome here!"
- 3. Jesus had harsh words for those who tried to shoo kids away!
- 4. Jesus lifted up kids as models of discipleship. He said, "Unless you accept God's kingdom in the simplicity of a little child you won't get in."
- 5. Jesus found great joy in being with children, taking them in his arms, laying hands on them, and blessing them!

As I think of how precious every child is to Jesus, I rejoice knowing that generations of children have come to know Jesus through First Church. Many of you have devoted yourselves to our children's ministry. In this issue of *First News First* I especially want to thank Dawn Fisher and Anna Harris. As many of you know, Dawn and Anna are "retiring" as our Co-Directors of Children's Ministry as of July 15, 2021.

With the support of parents and other "Partners in Ministry," Dawn and Anna have joyfully, lovingly, and enthusiastically blessed children and families in our church and our community. 

As the church is slowly opening, I am looking forward to showing off the library and all the wonderful Christian fiction we have available for your summer reading. Hope it is soon! Beth Wiseman is a library favorite for Amish books. **Picture of Love** and **An Unlikely Match** are the first two in the series with the third book, **Season of Change**, arriving in late October. Called the *Amish Inn Series*, each book is a romance set at the Peony Inn with the inn keepers, Esther and Lizzie, matchmaking for all their unmarried employees. Esther and Lizzie are widows, and while they continue to match-make, they realize the future must be left in God's hands. In **Picture of Love** Naomi and Amos meet at the inn, but both are recovering from heartache and believe they will never find love again. Can true love blossom from the deepest wounds?—you'll have to find that out for yourself. In **An Unlikely Match**, Evelyn Schrock has no interest in any young man in her small Amish community. But when Jayce Clarkson comes to town to work on a movie set in town, Evelyn is very interested. But can she really be interested in leaving the life and Amish ways for Los Angeles? This may be a very twisty path to true love—letting you be the judge.

Rachel Dylan is wrapping up her trilogy, *Capital Intrigue* with book three, **Power Play**. **End Game** and **Backlash** are already on the shelf for those who don't want to start a series until they all are available. The three books feature one of three best friends who must face down danger and adversaries to do her job and do it with courage. In **Power Play**, Vivian Steele is an attorney at the state department, who witnesses

two ambassadors collapse from poison at a diplomatic dinner. When she joins a joint FBI task force, she finds her by-the-book style clashing with Jacob Cruz, a former Navy Seal, who is unhampered by rules and regulations. But as the investigation becomes more dangerous, Viv finds Jacob to be a man she can trust, and someone who just might keep her alive. Plan on a late night for finishing this suspenseful page turner. July Prayer Challenge

Prayer is vitally important! Prayer is what we do to actively participate in growing in our love for and relationship with God. Being a praying follower is one of the things we highly value at First Church, and that's why we have been creating special prayer challenges that help us all stretch our prayer muscles!

Our prayer challenge for July is called "10 Minutes with God". Simply choose a time and place that you can make your 10-minute appointment with God every day, and stick with it for the 31 days of July! This is not so much of a challenge in learning *how* to pray, but is more about the *discipline* of sticking with it and making a *habit of prayer* for a life with God.

Some of you may have already developed this prayer habit – If so, that's great! No matter if you have already developed this habit or not, feel free to use the prompts below during your 10-minute appointment with God. If your appointment gets cut short or something in your day causes it to be delayed, that's ok, but make sure to fit it in your day somewhere. The intention is to build a habit that will deepen your relationship with God. Happy praying!

GRATITUDE: Begin by thinking about what you are most grateful for today. Is there a word or attribute of God that comes to mind? Take a moment to focus on that and thank God for who he is and what he's done that makes you feel this way.

AWARENESS: Now that you've entered this quiet, reflective state, revisit the times in the past 24 hours when you were or were not your best self. Talk to God and listen to what He is teaching you about these things.



SIGNIFICANT MOMENT: Did you have any special moments in the past 24 hours? It could have been an event or interaction with a person. Take time to sit in the silence and listen for what God might be trying to say to you through these significant moments.

PEACE: Ask God to forgive you for any wrong-doings (it could be against God, another person or even yourself). Ask him to show you if there is any relationship repairing needed, then ask him to fill you with his peace about these things.

OTHERS: Lift up to God anyone that you feel called to pray for today, asking Him to bless and guide them.

The Lord's Prayer: Close your 10-minute appointment with God using the prayer that Jesus taught us to pray.


