"You Are the Body"

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it. (I Corinthians 12:27)

As I was meditating on this short verse, the word *Now* leaped out at me. Rearrange the words, and it reads: *You are the body of Christ and individually members of it Now*. What does it look like for you and me to be the body of Christ *Now*?

Now is not the past. There is little doubt in anyone's mind that COVID has changed our lives. COVID has changed the church. We carry with us **Now** a wealth of gifts from the past. We bring the old, old story of Jesus and his love. We bring the mission Jesus gave his Church long ago, "Go and make disciples" (Matthew 28:19-20). We bring the unchanging Word of God and hearts open to the Holy Spirit. We bring prayer and worship, study and service, generosity and witness. We bring our building, our church website, our programs, our commitment to love our neighbors near and far, our connections with other churches. First and foremost, we bring ourselves. "**You** are the Body. **Now**."

We bring many gifts from our past, but *Now* is not the past. *Now*, as we begin 2022, brings with it new challenges and new opportunities. Here are a few examples...

- Attending worship *Now* means attending in-person *and* online. Currently, in-person worship attendance in our church is running a little over half of what it was before the pandemic. And yet, because we offer services online, more people are worshiping with us than before the pandemic. In effect we are a two campus church *Now*. God is calling us to find new ways in 2022 to engage people in *both* in-person *and* online campuses.
- Meeting for Sunday School classes, Bible studies and other groups *Now* means meeting inperson *and* online. It's a joy to see adults, youth, and children returning to classrooms and other settings for spiritual growth. *Now* we have new possibilities for connecting via zoom and other platforms. I'm excited that in January we're launching *Study Gateway*, an excellent resource that will give our entire congregation access to resources we can use individually and in groups, in-person and online.
- Congregational care *Now* means pastors, staff, and care team members keeping in touch with in-person visits, phone calls, prayer teams and Senior Fellowship *and* it means new ways of helping senior adults and others stay connected with worship online, meetings on Zoom, and safe small group in-person gatherings.
- Missions *Now* means our longstanding commitment to give financially and with our time to serve locally and beyond *and* it means responding to the many new opportunities to help our neighbors of *Now*.
- The church parking lot *Now* means a place for parking, conversation, special events, and receiving donations for the Little Free Pantry and Community Aid *and* it means a great outdoor location for creative ministry and increased visibility in the community. We *Now* have a newly constructed stage, beautiful outdoor decorations, and numerous opportunities for connecting with one another and our neighbors.
- Receiving the offering *Now* means multiple ways to give: in-person Sunday morning *or* via the U.S. Postal Service *or* online at <u>fumchurch.com</u> *or* electronically (contact <u>office@fumchurch.com</u>).

I'm sure you could add to this list of how the experiences of the past two years have opened up new possibilities for us. Being the body of Christ *Now* means leaving some things from the past behind. Discerning what is no longer relevant or effective in accomplishing Christ's mission *Now* is a challenging process. It requires prayer and listening, study and discussion, flexibility and an openness to our Lord who makes all things new. I value your involvement as we work together *Now* as staff, leaders, and congregation.

If *Now* is not the past, it is also not the future. The body of Christ is not something we will one day become. We do not wait for a better day or another time to be the body of Christ. *Now you* are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

I'm excited to be part of the body of Christ with you *Now*, as we begin this New Year together with all of its challenges and opportunities.





January Prayer Challenge - New Year Resolution

What does the word resolution mean? It comes from the Latin word "resolvere", which means "to loosen". We can also find it in the Bible in Psalm 51:10... "Create for me a pure heart, O God! Renew a resolute spirit within me!" (New English Translation). In this context, the word means to be "firm, established, rooted, prepared". So, to be successful in making a resolution, we must loosen our grip on the things we hold on to in order to stand firm and be rooted in Christ!

For early Christians, the first day of the new year became the traditional occasion for thinking about one's past mistakes and resolving to do and be better in the future. In 1740, John Wesley, founder of Methodism, created the Covenant Renewal Service, most commonly held on New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. Also known as watch night services, they included readings from Scriptures and hymn singing, and served as a spiritual alternative to the raucous celebrations normally held to celebrate the coming of the new year.

So, as we make our resolutions for the new year, first let's ask God to renew our faith and love for Jesus. Use John Wesley's Covenant Prayer for reflection and allow yourself to be open to his leading:

I am no longer my own, but thine.

Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God. Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen.

In addition to this prayer, you can try meditating on scripture. Here are some suggested readings: Jeremiah 29:11, Matthew 11: 28-30, 2 Peter 1:3-10. May your prayers bring you comfort and gratitude as you step into the next year! Share them with your friends and family to inspire their hearts as well. God Bless!
