From Pastor Denny's Desk...

"Love Is the Way"

In forty years as a preacher I've officiated more than a few weddings. When I meet with couples as they prepare for their marriage, I ask them to select scripture passages to be read in the service. Many couples choose I Corinthians 13, St. Paul's great picture of love.

For our wedding, my Betsy and I asked her Uncle Bob, a United Methodist pastor, to preach. We can still remember every word of his sermon. He said, "Dennis and Betsy asked me to offer a few words of wisdom for their marriage today. I can't say it any better than the Apostle Paul did!" Then he read I Corinthians 13, including these beautiful words,

Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends.

1 Corinthians 13 offers great advice for couples entering into marriage, but when Paul wrote what we now call, "the love chapter," he wasn't at a wedding. He wrote them in a letter to a church he had founded upon the teachings of Jesus. Now, he had heard some bad news out of Corinth. Its members had forgotten all those values that had brought them together. Arrogant, rude, insisting on our own way, irritable, resentful, rejoicing in wrongdoing? They had lost the love, you might say.

In his book, <u>Love Is the Way</u>, Bishop Michael Curry, Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, notes that while in English we have only one word, *love*, the Koine Greek of the New Testament uses three words: *eros*, *philia*, and *agape*. He writes:

Eros is romantic love; it's what Valentine's Day is all about. *Philia* is fraternal or brotherly love, which is why the city of Philadelphia is called the City of Brotherly Love. *A gape* is love for the other-sacrificial love that seeks the good and well-being of others, of society, of the world. (Curry, p. 14)

Bishop Curry goes on to explain that *agape*, love that looks outward, love that is a gift of the self to others, is what Paul is concerned about. For Paul, as for the disciples of Jesus, love was not just a nice feeling that rises up inside of us. This love was an action, with force and follow-through. "Love was rules for living." (Curry, p.18)

When people ask me about you, I always tell them, "First Church is such a loving congregation." I am not just being sentimental. On a daily basis I have the privilege of witnessing your love in action, how you look outward, giving of yourselves to others. You sacrifice for your loved ones. You lift each other up with your care, your prayers, your acts of kindness, and your giving. You serve your neighbors near and far. I rejoice in this, and so much more, because "love is the way."

As we enter the third year of a pandemic, I invite you to cling to these eloquent words of Paul on love. They are remarkably relevant. We do not know the challenges and opportunities that lie ahead for us as a church, but we do know this. "Love is the way." Looking outward, giving of ourselves, we experience "the more excellent way." The way that unites us and inspires us to greater things. May we discover in our life together the joy of knowing that "Love never ends."

Most of the country considers February a month for romance, and here in the library we have the same idea. While flowers, chocolate, or a special dinner out are wonderful gifts, there is nothing like a good book. You knew I was going to say that, didn't you? And if you should accidently mention coffee, I can expound on it way too long. I guess it won't be a surprise to learn we have the second book in the *Maple*

Falls Romance series, which is set in a coffee shop. The first book, **Hooked on You**, is followed by **Much Ado About a Latte**. When Anita Bedford decides that her dream to be more than friends with Tanner Castillo will never be realized, she decides to open a coffee shop and pour her energy into that. When a store front becomes available, it is right next to Tanner's diner. Not realizing who is opening the café, Tanner decides to ramp up his coffee selections to compete with this new threat to his diner. As a full-bodied coffee war begins, the whole town wonders when Tanner and Anita will figure out what is obvious to everyone in town — not only should they unite their diner and café, but also their lives.

I was recently at the movie theater when I was surprised by the preview of a new movie, **Redeeming Love**. The book of the same title was written by Francine Rivers in 1997. Though it is fiction, it is based on the biblical book of Hosea. If you haven't read Hosea for a while, God instructs the prophet Hosea to marry the prostitute Gomer, and even though he follows God's orders and showers her with unconditional love, Gomer is again unfaithful to him. The book is said to be a metaphor of the relationship of Israel and God at the time of the fall of the northern kingdom of Israel. Ms. Rivers has taken this story and set it in California in the 1850s. Her leading lady is not called Gomer but Angel and the leading man is Michael Hosea. I don't know how Hollywood will handle this Christian romance, but if you would like to read the book, **Redeeming Love** is on the library shelf. There will also be a Bible study in conjunction with the release of the movie, and maybe some small group will tackle that, too. But the premise of Hosea, **Redeeming Love**, and the movie is there is no brokenness that can't be healed with the power of God's love. I invite you to read this mighty retelling of God's unconditional love.

February Prayer Challenge: SOAPY!

Prayer unlocks our intimacy with God, but it's not always easy because prayer requires practice and discipline. The good news is that, the more we practice prayer, the easier our conversation with God will be. Here at First Church, we have been practicing a different method of praying each month in order to stretch ourselves and find new ways of connecting with and listening for the voice of God! This month, try using the SOAPY method for your daily prayer. What is this, you ask? SOAPY stands for Scripture, Observation, Application, Prayer and Yield. Here is how it works:

- Scripture: Open your Bible and select a piece of scripture to read. One suggestion: Use our daily Bible reading plan, which goes along with our sermon series. Use a journal to write down the scripture reference for what you are reading. Take your time and allow God to speak to you as you read the words. When you are done, look for a word or phrase that particularly spoke to you, and write it in your journal.
- **Observation:** Why do you think that word or phrase spoke to you? Is God saying something to you personally in this scripture? Ask the Holy Spirit to reveal this to you. Write your thoughts down.
- **Application:** Personalize what you have read by asking yourself how it applies to your life right now. Perhaps it is instruction, encouragement, revelation of a new promise, or corrections for a particular area of your life. Write how this scripture can apply to you today.
- **Prayer:** This can be as simple as asking God to help you use this scripture, it may be a greater insight into what He may be revealing to you, or it may be a prompting to do/pray something for someone else. Write down your thoughts.
- Yield: Yield your heart to God... give him authority over your words, your actions and your thoughts. This requires sacrifice on our part and submission to God's will, but it also means we get to contribute to God's glory!

New Sound System 2022-2023

As we continue to enter into new territories with our worship and livestream ministries, we are pleased to share that First Church will be making upgrades to our sanctuary sound and media systems! Through God's provision of generous designated giving and professional expertise in our congregation, we are eager and ready to continue aligning ourselves with God's timing to grow our worship ministries.

From a new digital board to new microphones, the conversion to a digital



system in Phase 1 (of 3) will enable us to more precisely control sound, music, and media in our sanctuaries. While you may not see and hear a new system right away, installation of the first phase will begin at the end of January 2022. Our hopes are to continue installation through March, all while providing full training to our current and future sound and media teams. A complete switchover to the new system is slated for late April of 2022.

Phases 2 and 3 of the entire project are anticipated for summer of 2022 through early 2023.

We are so grateful for the prayers and support our congregation has provided throughout 2021. As noted above, despite the difficulties of the pandemic, our church family continued supporting ministries and programs of our church throughout the year. Furthermore, our church members, staff and volunteers came together in 2021 to help us hold the line on costs.

In addition to in-person services and events, our church now reaches the family of God in new ways with a "virtual" ministry on Sundays, and for other events throughout the week. In addition, here are just a few of the ways our resources were put to use during this unusual time: We upgraded some of our heating and air conditioning units, repaired the roof and outside areas of building, and are working on sound and sanctuary improvements. We were also able set aside funding for other longer term projects which will be required for the maintenance of our building and to enhance outdoor worship.

The full year financial results for 2021 are enclosed, along with our budget for 2022 (later in this newsletter). We all look forward to seeing how God continues to grow our faith and family during this New Year, in line with His will. Thank you for your commitment to the ministry of First Church.
