110 years ago, when our ancestors at First Church designed our church sanctuary, ministry with children and their families was obviously a high priority. Of all the dozens of scenes from Scripture they might have chosen for the two large stained glass windows, they chose a scene that is found in three of the New Testament Gospels. In all three accounts, parents are bringing their children to Jesus. The disciples speak sternly to them, but Jesus says,

Let the little children come to me, and do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs. (Matthew 19:14; Mark 10:14; Luke 18:16)

60 years ago, as more and more children and families crowded into the building for Sunday School, our ancestors once again expressed their strong commitment to bringing children to Jesus. In 1962, our educational building was constructed. In the decades that followed, classrooms were crowded with children on Sunday mornings and throughout the week.

25 years ago, as still more children and families came, yet another building project provided additional space. Many of you came into the life of First Church because of our strong commitment to ministry with children and families. In addition to Sunday School, you have been involved in the Crib/Toddler Room, Wee Worship and Kid Worship, Wonderful Wednesday, the Passion Play, Vacation Bible School, Night in Bethlehem, Little Friends Preschool, and so much more.

I celebrate your longstanding commitment to, "Let the children come." That's why I'm especially excited, as we move into this new season, to welcome our new Director of Children and Family Ministries, Katie Knorr. Katie is from Bloomsburg, PA. The daughter and granddaughter of United Methodist pastors, Katie has been involved in church her whole life. After graduating from Bloomsburg University with a B.S. in Education, Katie taught Elementary School before she was called to full-time Children's Ministry and joined the staff of Camp Hill UMC. Recently, as Camp Hill did some staff restructuring, Katie applied for our position here.

With Katie's experience, her creativity, and her warm, caring spirit, she is a great addition to our church's ministry. Her love for Jesus and children shines through. Katie is already busy getting to know children and their families and planning creative ways to connect them to Jesus and our church family.

I usually talk about November and December being the whirlwind time of my life with too much going on and no time to think or to get everything done. But here I am on Valentine's Day realizing I haven't written the library article for the church newsletter. So I have pre-warned you this article might be brief, disorganized, making no sense, or all of the above. Thankfully, Pam has my back so at least my grammar will be okay. The February article was all about romance, so in March I want to go in the high adrenaline direction.

Author Natalie Walters was suggested to me by my sister who reads as much as I do. Since I always take my big sister's advice, I ordered the first of Ms. Walters' books in her *SNAP series*, titled **Lights Out**. In a contemporary world where spies and counter terrorism are everyday words, Brynn Taylor is a CIA Analyst who has developed a program to help foster cooperation with foreign intelligence agencies. But now one of the members of this new interagency group, an Egyptian spy, is missing. Jack Hudson who has been working for the Strategic Neutralization and Protection Agency (SNAP) is tasked to find this missing spy. Unfortunately, Jack and Brynn have some bad history together, and they are unsure if they can even work together no matter what the stakes are. And this is not an easy assignment. Kidnapping, explosions, murder, poisonings are thrown in their way at every turn. The terrorists' goal is to cause a digital blackout that will blind the US military and throw the whole world into chaos. Of course, Brynn and Jack find a way to work together—but I will let you find out how they work that out. If you enjoy this new author, her second book in this series, **Fatal Code**, will be out in May. And if you like this author, please let me know as I try to order what you like.

An all-time favorite author in the library is Lynette Eason and her latest series is titled *Extreme Measures*. Book one is **Life Flight** and it has plenty of adrenaline. Penny Carlton is an EMS helicopter pilot who is used to high stress situations, but when she is forced to land on a mountain in a raging storm with a critical patient, it takes stress to a whole new level. And if all that is not enough, there is a serial killer on the loose. Fortunately, she is able to survive with FBI Special Agent Holt Satterfield's help. But even after they are over the mountain event, Penny is still under attack and Holt discovers he didn't get his man the first time. I think you will enjoy this romantic suspense novel as Amazon readers gave it fantastic reviews. Brew some extra espresso and plan to stay up late to find the way through all the twists and turns that this novel provides. As always, if neither of these books is right for you, stop by the library and let us help you find the perfect book.

Sound & Media Upgrades Updates

The sound system upgrades began installation in late January, and we continue to remain on schedule! Volunteers have been meeting on Fridays to assist with equipment installation and wiring—this plan will allow the new upgrades to be tested during the Gathering service, while we temporarily remaining on the existing system for the Foundation service.

Our outlined plan also allows for the worship band to soon begin practicing using personal "in-ear monitors", with the goal of improved hearing while reducing stage volume, clutter and feedback. The sound team will also begin training on the new sound board during our 11 a.m. Gathering services.

To achieve better sound and smoother live worship during both Foundation and Gathering services, we'll soon be reviewing our wireless mics to resolve dropout issues, as well as installation of new microphones and presentation computers.

Endowment Fund Grants Enhance Church Ministries

First Church was blessed to have nearly \$24,000 in proceeds from its Endowment Fund to invest in church ministries last year! Endowment grants were provided to the following groups in 2021:

- Little Friends Nursery School \$10,000 in assistance. The school continues to provide a valuable learning and growing experience for young children but suffered decreased enrollment during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Squares & Prayers \$1,000 for quilting supplies. Group members made several quilts to donate for use by hospice patients.
- Covered in Love \$200 for knitting supplies for projects to benefit the community.
- **Trustees** \$5,000 for emergency masonry work on the small tower of our building to stop damage from water leakage.

- Furniture for Youth Lounge \$2,000 to purchase new furniture for the 4G youth meeting room.
- **Community Green Space** \$ 2,500 seed grant (pre-approved to be spent in 2022) to repurpose a portion of the church parking lot as an outdoor meeting space for use by church members and the public.
- In addition, a portion of the Endowment proceeds was designated to the **Stain Glass Window Restoration Fund** per the donor's wishes.

The Endowment Fund of First United Methodist Church was created more than a decade ago. All donations to it remain with the fund in perpetuity. As the fund grows, the annual proceeds generated are reinvested into current church ministries. Members can support the Endowment Fund with a deferred gift, such as a bequest in a will or a life insurance policy naming First Church as the beneficiary. Cash and stock transfer gifts also are accepted for those who wish to provide support now. On Sunday, February 13, we announced that Lori Hoffnagle, our Director of Outreach, will retire effective February 28. Lori joined our church staff in March, 2017. Over the past five years she has helped our congregation extend its reach into the community in many ways. Youth Ministry — Seeking to be Confirmed?

What is confirmation?: "United Methodists use the term "confirmation" to mark the first time a baptized Christian publicly "confirms" their intention to live the vows of the baptismal and membership covenant and so becomes a professing member of the local congregation and The United Methodist Church."

What does that mean?: It means that when you were baptized someone made vows on your behalf to raise you in the Christian faith. To be confirmed is to acknowledge <u>on your own behalf</u>, and in the presence of others, that you desire to live according to those vows, to profess your faith in Jesus, and participate as a membership of the church. It's your chance to say "yes" to the faith that you were baptized into.

What if I wasn't baptized?: If you aren't yet baptized, both a baptism and confirmation can happen at the same time since you don't need someone to make the vows for you.

I was baptized when I was an older kid: If you were baptized at an age or in a church where you made a personal proclamation of faith, then that was a baptism and confirmation wrapped up as one (that may be why some of your friends of other Christian churches don't have a confirmation program). But even still, you could join us in the process of confirmation as a means of becoming a member of the First Church community.

I was confirmed but honestly it didn't make sense then: Baptisms and confirmations only need to occur once BUT there are times in our lives where we wish to re-affirm our faith and the commitment we have made.
