

TEACHING NOTES

"The Resurrection of the Body and the Life Everlasting" Last in "The Apostles' Creed" Series

Jesus' resurrection is God's response to death.

Look, there was a great earthquake, for an angel from the Lord came down from heaven. Coming to the stone, **he rolled it away and sat on it**. Matthew 28:2 (CEB)

"On the third day he rose again, according to the Scripture."

²⁵ Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me will live, even though they die. ²⁶ Everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. **Do you believe this**?" John 11:25-26 (CEB)

We will have new, glorious bodies in heaven.

⁴² So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable; what is raised is imperishable.
⁴³ It is sown in dishonor; it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness; it is raised in power. ⁴⁴ It is sown a physical body; it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body. 1 Corinthians 15:42-44 (NRSV)

When this perishable body puts on imperishability and this mortal body puts on immortality, then the saying that is written will be fulfilled: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." 1 Corinthians 15:54 (NRSV) "God himself will be with them as their God.
⁴ He will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more;
mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away."
⁵ And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new." Revelation 21:3b-5

We can face life and death with hope.

And now, dear brothers and sisters, we want you to know what will happen to the believers who have died **so** you will not grieve like people who have no hope. 1 Thessalonians 4:13 (CEB)

Questions for Reflection:

- 1. When did it first really dawn on you that we're all going to die, and that everyone we know and love is going to die?
- 2. How does belief in the resurrection change how you face life and death?
- 3. What do you imagine heaven is like?
- 4. What can we infer about the resurrected body from Jesus' appearances to his disciples?
- 5. The Apostles' Creed gives us a very short list of essential Christian beliefs. What additional be liefs do you live by as a follower of Jesus?
