"Cross in the Marketplace"

Since our April newsletter is distributed the last week of March, it's like you are reading this during Holy Week. Once again this year we will journey with Jesus through his final week with our annual Passion Play, our Maundy Thursday Communion, and our Easter Celebrations. In addition, we will join with congregations from Mechanicsburg Borough and Upper Allen Township in a Good Friday Prayer Walk.

Groups will meet at six different host churches, including our church, at Noon. From each location we will walk together and stop for prayer at our schools, our fire companies, our police station, businesses and churches. At 1:15 p.m. we will meet at the First Church of God near the square for a brief time of worship, prayer, and fellowship.

Those of us who have been involved in planning this event are excited about the opportunity to make such a powerful, unified witness for Christ in our community. The Prayer Walk is one of many positive ways God is moving to unite us, across denominational lines, for the sake of reaching our Mechanicsburg area with the Good News!

In preparation for our Holy Week Services, our Prayer Walk, and Easter, I came across this thought-provoking statement by George MacLeod, one of the most influential pastors in the Church of Scotland in the 20th Century, and founder of the Iona Community, Scotland. These words are just as relevant for us in 2018 as they were when MacLeod wrote them in the last century:

I simply argue that the cross be raised again at the center of the market place as well as on the steeple of the church. I am recovering the claim that Jesus was not crucified in a cathedral between two candles, but on a cross between two thieves; on the town garbage heap; at a crossroad so cosmopolitan that they had to write his title in Hebrew and in Latin and in Greek; at the kind of place where cynics talk smut, and thieves curse, and soldiers gamble. Because that is where he died. And that is what he died about. And that is where Christians ought to be, and what Christians ought to be about.

Picture the cross not just in the church, but in the middle of town, is a powerful reminder of who we are and where we ought to be. As we walk with Jesus to the cross and celebrate his Resurrection, may we also consider what it looks like to represent Christ amid the realities of day to day life. "God so loved *the world* that he gave his only Son,..." (John 3:16a). In the name of our crucified Lord, we are called to love the world as well.
