As a congregation you showed amazing resilience! Hundreds worshiped from home, celebrating the Resurrection in that space between you and your screen that became holy ground!

As we look forward to Easter 2021 on April 4, we are still in the midst of the pandemic. However, this year, we are able to plan *three in-person Easter celebrations:*

- 6:45 a.m. Easter Sunrise in the Mechanicsburg Cemetery led by our Youth
- 8:15 a.m. Foundation Service in the sanctuary
- 11:00 a.m. The Gathering Service in the church parking lot (if it rains, this service will be held in the sanctuary auditorium)

From the Library

Joyous Easter and the promise of spring; I think that describes April perfectly. What could be better, especially this year that hasn't been so joyous? I hope you are spending this April counting your blessings, thanking God for his bounty, and hoping for new beginnings. This month might mean more activities, more friends to see and a community back to normal, and even better, not so many people hurting and alone. I hope to see all of you in the church library soon! I have some great new books you'll want to read. I can't wait to settle down in my recliner to read **The Paris Dressmaker**. Kristy Cambron is one of my favorite historical fiction writers. Her books are usually based on true occurrences, and she does excellent research. When the Germans occupied Paris, they couldn't wait to send perfume and fashion back home to their wives. And dressmakers had no choice but to serve them, no matter their feelings for the occupiers. Ms. Cambron starts her story as one of the fashion houses closed leaving their designers and dressmakers with no jobs. Lila de Laurent is one of those designers and she is desperate for work. Lila is not only a talented designer, but also a patriot. Having joined the resistance, she is now using her skills to design masterpieces for the Germans and to also glean military information to pass to the resistance. Another courageous woman in Paris is Sandrine Paquet whose job is to catalog the priceless works of art stolen from the Jews before they are sent to Berlin. While seemingly compliant, she too is working for the resistance, and even more importantly is trying to find her missing husband. When she uncrates a blush Chanel gown, she finds a concealed cryptic message that may reveal the fate of a dressmaker who has vanished. Reviewers have said this book is filled with "unimaginable heartache, unforgettable romance and a cheering defiance again oppression". I think that describes the perfect book for me. What about you?

The library has not forgotten that many of you enjoy Amish romance. We have the complete trilogy of *The Amish Brides of Birch Creek*. **The Teacher's Bride**, **The Farmer's Bride**, and **The Innkeeper's Bride** are all based around single men with different professions and all in need of a wife whether they know it or not. In **The Teacher's Bride** Ms. Fuller touches on depression and possibly Asperger's syndrome which are usually not approached in Amish books. But she does it with a light touch. All three books have characters that seem like they could be real people with normal ups and downs. The reviews all warn that you might have to stay up late reading till the last page. Don't say I didn't warn you!

Maundy Thursday Seder Meal Worship - April 1, 2021

Maundy Thursday is the part of our Holy Week where we remember Jesus' Last Supper with his disciples. Christ in the Passover meal shows the link between the ancient Festival of Redemption in Exodus and Christ as the Lamb of God.

As a response to our ongoing pandemic, we invite you to join our online Maundy Thursday Seder Meal on Thursday April 1, available to view any time after 4pm. This worship service is visual and participatory you will have the opportunity to see, taste, and reflect over a table set with traditional Passover items. We'll use scripture as well as visual and worship elements to walk through this Jewish Passover Seder, weaving the story of Exodus with the life, death and resurrection of Christ. Celebrating the Passover story helps enrich one's faith and understanding of Christ in the Last Supper, and delivers a universal message of hope.

To celebrate the Maundy Thursday Seder meal, there are a few items that you will need to prepare in advance. These items will be used as part of the service. They include:

- Candles and matches/lighter
- A bowl of water to wash hands
- A napkin/paper towel
- Ceremonial foods
 - o 3 pieces of unleavened bread (the traditional bread is Matzo, but you may use naan bread or tortillas)
 - o Karpas (a green vegetable- parsley, celery, cilantro, or lettuce). One stem per family member.
 - o Salt water in a small dipping bowl.
 - o Maror, the bitter herb (horseradish)
 - o Charoset/Haroset (a traditional apple/walnut mixture you may find a recipe online or mix apple sauce with graham crackers for a nut-free version)
 - o Hagigah (hard-boiled egg)
 - o Shank bone of a lamb (you may use a bone from chicken, turkey, or other meat with a small bone instead)
 - o Red juice and cups one cup per family member
 - o Your normal full meal or supper there will be time for you to enjoy fellowship over your regular dinner

Be a Part of the Glean Team!

This growing season, we are excited to offer the Biblical practice of gleaning in Mechanicsburg! You may already be familiar with the concept of 'gleaning,' perhaps from reading references to gleaning in the books of Leviticus and Ruth or from taking part in Project Share's opportunity to glean in Carlisle. As depicted in scripture, gleaning occurred when some of the fallen grain during harvest was intentionally left behind, including whole corners of the fields as required by Israelite law. The intention was to offer an unharvested portion of grain for others to collect in helping to feed the poor, the orphans, widows and foreigners, as a safety net and resource to provide for their needs.

We plan to glean some local crops (strawberries and corn for example) to share with our own community! "When you reap the harvest of your land, do not reap to the very edges of your field or gather the gleanings
