#### "Worship in a Graveyard?"

Once again, many of us will begin Easter this year at sunrise with a service led by our youth in the Mechanicsburg Cemetery. Over my lifetime, I have celebrated Easter sunrise on top of the mountain at King's Gap, along the seashore in New Jersey, at fairgrounds and county parks, in church sanctuaries and fellowship halls, and on church lawns. But, before my first Easter with you in 2016, I had never celebrated Easter morning in a graveyard.

Our Easter sunrise service is always special, including the dramatic ending with our Youth Pastor, Lisa Aronson, blowing a shofar, a ram's horn used by the ancient Hebrews to celebrate victory. One year Lisa managed to get enough air to sound the shofar, even though she was just weeks away from the birth of her son, Joshua! In 2020, just after the start of the pandemic, a few of us met in the cemetery and broadcast the sunrise service so our congregation could celebrate Easter while staying safely home. What a joy the following year when we could gather once again in person!

Seeing a bunch of people worshipping in a graveyard in the cold of an early April morning may look strange to some. We go to cemeteries to bury deceased loved ones, to grieve those we've lost, and to honor the dead with wreaths, flowers, and flags. It seems an unlikely place for an early morning celebration, but it has great significance for us. For it was in a graveyard that the greatest event in the history of the world took place.

The four gospels differ on the who's and how's of that first Easter morning, but they all agree on the when and the where. Matthew, Mark, Luke and John agree that the good news, "Christ is risen," was first heard at dawn on the first day of the week (Sunday) at the tomb where, on Friday, the body of the crucified Lord had been buried (a.k.a. the cemetery).

When we gather Easter morning, whether at the cemetery at sunrise, in person in the sanctuary, or online (or all three!), we celebrate the same Good News as those who heard it first. Christ has conquered the grave. He is victorious over death. Because he lives, all who believe in him shall live also.

In the study guide for our Lenten series, In The Footsteps of the Savior, Max Lucado says it this way:

"We often fear what we don't understand, so fearing death is understandable. It's a mystery. We don't get a trial run at death (well, at least most of us don't). But death is not a mystery to Christ. In him, we know we have a Savior who understands death, our fear of it, and exactly what happens to us when it happens. He has been there. He lived to tell us about it" (page 112).

We have victory in Jesus! We have hope eternal in the Risen Lord! Let's celebrate!

The month of February was a month of higher than normal giving, as several one-time gifts were received to carry on the mission of First Church to the glory of our Lord and Savior. We are grateful to our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus.

In February, the all-member church meeting approved the borrowing of (up to) \$200,000 to help fund a \$350,000 restoration of the bell tower. We are able to support some of this project with trustee maintenance funds, and we hope to reduce our borrowing with fundraising and additional gifts from the congregation. 
