The picture, with the words, "Welcome Home Keller Family" printed in crayon, created by Nate Erno, age 9, is still attached to our refrigerator with a magnet. Betsy and I first saw it on the kitchen counter, along with flowers and a card, when we were welcomed to an Open House this past May for those that had helped with the parsonage renovation project. With new carpet, freshly painted walls, sparkling clean rooms, and the start of beautiful landscaping, Betsy and I were grateful and delighted that *this* would be our new home. We enjoyed meeting new friends that night and celebrating countless hours of hard work. We hadn't officially started at First Church, but after meeting those gathered that evening we were already feeling at home here.

That evening, as we toured the house, we noticed small, ornate, rectangular boxes nailed to the doorposts at the front and back doors and to a doorpost on the second floor. The outside of each box was marked with Hebrew letters. A thin piece of paper was rolled up tightly inside of each box, with something printed on it in Hebrew. We soon learned that the couple that had made the new parsonage their home for many years was Jewish. We also learned that the parchment encased in each box is called a "mezuzah," which means, in Hebrew, "doorpost."

On the "mezuzah," in very small print, is the most important commandment God gave the people of Israel through Moses as they were about to enter the Promised Land:

Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might. Keep these words I am commanding you today in your heart. Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home or when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, and write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. (Deuteronomy 6:4-9)

Growing up in a Jewish community, the "mezuzah" was likely written on the doorposts of Jesus' family and friends. He didn't just know the words; he lived them as no other before or since. Jesus taught us to love God with our whole being. Then he added, and "love your neighbor as yourself." (Matthew 22:34-40)

Betsy and I are grateful that with all the renovations the "mezuzahs" remained on the doorposts of our new home. Whenever we come and go, whether it is by way of the front door or the back, or up or down the stairs, we are reminded to love God and our neighbor in all that we do. We also remember and give thanks

You probably do not have "mezuzahs" nailed to your doorposts, I encourage you as you come and go to remember in your heart God's call always and everywhere to love.



Our Stewardship program is beginning its 5th month in August. I hope you are enjoying the Stewardship Seconds each week, as presented by various church leaders/members. The Stewardship Seconds provide an opportunity to hear about some aspect of the life and ministry of First Church using the resources that we provide in our regular offerings to the unified budget. As you will continue to hear each Sunday, FUMC has great plans (and needs) for our offerings, above and beyond your "regular" giving levels. Our total year estimated budget shortfall for 2015 continues to be about \$50,000 (about 5-6%). If we can make-up this deficit during 2015, we can continue to provide (or expand) these important church ministries and missions.



Many of us maintain a regular exercise program. It helps us to stay fit and healthy. Lately I have been doing more resistance training, which is meant to strengthen my muscles, correct bad posture, and develop core strength (especially in my lower back). The result is that by regularly strengthening my core muscles, it then becomes much easier for me to complete my daily activities – Regular exercise strengthens my muscles. In 1 Timothy 4:8 it says "For bodily exercise profits a little, but Godliness is profitable for all things having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come." And in 1 Corinthians 16:9, Paul tells us to give to God on a regular basis. So if regular exercise strengthens our body muscles, **regular giving to God will strengthen our generosity muscle**.

During August's "Stewardship Seconds", our emphasis will be on the church mission budget. Despite budget issues over the years, First Church has been able to provide at least 10% of the annual budget to missions. Our Mission committee meets regularly to analyze, evaluate, and determine where our precious mission collections should be directed. During the church services in August, you will hear about many of these mission opportunities. From our support of missionaries and our congregational mission trips, to international and local mission organizations, our mission budget helps fund very important projects that spread the word of God throughout the world and make a difference in peoples' lives. During August, be sure to listen and watch as we water and nourish the "Missions' Root". If we have roots "Grounded in Faith", we will be able to "Grow to Serve".

Music

Ringers Travel to Hand Bell Festival in Scranton

Nine of our hand bell ringers attended the Hand Bell Musicians of America biennial regional festival at the University of Scranton from June 27 to 30. This year the technical classes were taught by Timbre, a community group from California, some of which are working on their Masters in Music in hand bell performance. The clinics ranged from basic hand bell ringing to caring for our bodies to avoid injuries while ringing. One of things that the ringers learned is that hand bell ringing is an aerobic exercise. So when you see us ringing on Sunday morning, we are doing our exercises for God. We also had an opportunity to hear other groups perform including Timbre. The festival gave the ringers an opportunity to play both sacred and secular music and to hear new compositions. Many times this music is then performed at worship services and concerts during the year. The festival ended with a mass ringing of the festival music by about 400 ringers on June 30.

The hand bell choirs are grateful for the support that the congregation provides at its fund raisers such as the spaghetti dinner in June. These events reduce the amount each ringer must pay to attend festivals and conferences without using church offerings.

Next year is the International Symposium of Hand Bell Ringers in Vancouver, Canada and several of us are planning to attend. Starting in September, we will share our plans and fund raising ideas. So watch for further developments.

Written by Dani Pettrey who likes high thrills adventure books so much she decided to write her own. Kidnapping, suspicious climbing accidents, boating accidents, not to mention regular mayhem and murder spiced with a generous dollop of romance overflow in this five book series. Her characters and scenery are painted with such detail, you'll feel like you are visiting Alaska. That would be a treat on a hot summer day in Pennsylvania.

Another new feature in the library is a group of MP3 discs. These discs can be played on many CD players, but also easily transferred to an IPod for easy listening. Though I love to read, with audio books I am now able to listen to books while doing chores or sewing. Since the library is trying out this format, there are only a few available, but we have a wide range of genres. Come in and let us show you this display. Listening to books make chores more bearable!

If you haven't taken the time to weed your home books shelf, you still have time before the August book sale. Facilities

It's hard to believe, but we're already half way through the year 2015. The frenzied pace of activities we experience for much of the year slows down a little over the summer months, affording us an opportunity to tackle projects like floor refinishing and entire room carpet cleaning that are difficult to accomplish when things are happening in every square inch of our church building. We also have a few major facilities initiatives in progress right now.

Restoration work continues in the lower level of the facility in response to last fall's sewage pump malfunction. All of the floor tiles had to be removed in the pump room and in the storage area off the kitchen where the large reach-in freezer is located. Drywall repairs, new cove molding installation, and painting of affected areas are in progress. In concert with these efforts, Judi Buddenbaum and Marcia Espenshade are painting all (I think there are 70!) kitchen cabinets to help refresh the area. A huge "shout out" is in order to those two women for their dedicated efforts.

Eric King has been hard at work making repairs to the wall and windows on the Frederick Street side of the church. Water infiltration over a period of years has made this wall into an unsightly mess, complete with plaster efflorescence and deterioration of window trim. Once Eric completes this painstakingly slow restoration work, we will paint the walls and pray that the exterior repairs we made over the past few years prevents a recurrence of this problem.

Eagle Scout candidate Matthew Canonizado has started work on the prayer garden he designed on the east side of the church near King Alley. Matthew's design includes replacement of the Brian James memorial weeping cherry tree that we needed to remove this spring due to disease, as well as a cross, benches, and other plantings. When finished, we are hoping this prayer garden will be a special place for personal reflection.

Have you noticed all of the sunflowers in bloom at the Simpson/Frederick corner of the church? They popped up on their own out of the mulch we spread in the spring, and are adding another burst of color to that area.

I hope you enjoyed the Stewardship Seconds in our worship services during the month of July where I focused on the Facilities root of our annual church budget. Opening the door, keeping things running, protecting our investment, and looking to the future are key tenets of our Facilities efforts. Help us be good stewards of the awesome resource that is First Church by showering us with your prayers, your presence, your gifts, your service, and your witness. Thank you.

First Church Announces Hamsher Endowment Gift

Harry and Norma Hamsher may no longer be with First Church, but their legacy lives on.

In June, First Church was the recipient of a substantial gift from the estate of Harry Hamsher. Harry and Norma made the provision many years ago to ensure their support of First Church well beyond them.

"Harry and Norma Hamsher were among the most gracious and generous people I have known," said Pastor Mike Minnix, retired senior pastor of First Church. "During their lives, their love for and support of First Church were apparent through their continual presence and participation in the church's ministry and mission."

Pastor Mike continued, "The considerable gift we have received from their estate assures not only that their love for First Church will continue to be expressed, but that the impact that First Church has on our community and throughout the world will continue to be significant for the cause of Christ and the Kingdom of God."

The Hamsher gift more than doubled the size of the Endowment Fund, which now totals nearly \$270,000.

Harry was an active member of First Church. He served as a Sunday School Secretary, member of the Trustees and Administrative Board, and Financial Secretary, and was an usher for over 60 years! Harry also was a faithful member of the William Guyer Sunday School class. Norma, a native of Enola, joined First Church after she and Harry were married.

Gail True, Harry and Norma's niece, had a special bond with them.

"I can remember as a young child, they were always a part of our family gatherings," Gail said. "When my father (Harry's brother) passed away in 1980 at the age of 50, Uncle Harry and Aunt Norma watched over my mother and became surrogate parents to me. I was a new bride, and when I had children, they filled the role of grandparents." Harry and Norma had no children of their own.

Harry and Norma came from modest means, but they were hard workers and owned a successful farm in Monroe Township. Early on, the Hamshers raised livestock to include chickens, dairy cows and pigs on the nearly 50-acre land.

"Uncle Harry was a full-time farmer and a full-time credit manager at Harrisburg Auto Parts," Gail said. "He would get up early to milk the cows, work all day, then in the evening do more farm work. He had a strong work ethic."

Later the Hamshers stopped raising livestock and focused on crops. Gail fondly remembers helping to pick vegetables and prepare them for storage.

Gail described Harry as a kind-hearted and quiet man. "I was always impressed with Uncle Harry, because he always wanted to do what was right," she said. "He lived a simple life, and wanted to do what would please the Lord." Gail remembers Norma as being ever grateful. "Every day, Aunt Norma made it a point to say how grateful she was for everything she had." Harry and Norma were married for 64 years.

Norma passed away June 2006. In December 2013, Harry's health began to deteriorate. "In his last days, I asked him if there was any Scripture he wanted me to read to him," Gail said. "He requested Psalm 23, 1 Corinthians 15, and other specific scriptures that were dear to his heart. I thought, how can someone in his condition think of Scripture at a time like this? It gave me a sense of peace." Harry passed away just a month later, at the age of 93.

"I think when Aunt Norma and Uncle Harry got to heaven, the Lord looked at them and said, "Well done my faithful servants," Gail said. "They were really good examples for our family."
