From Pastor Denny...

"The Conspiracy of Kindness"

³³ He told them another parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like yeast that a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour until all of it was leavened."

There's a conspiracy of kindness happening in the Body of Christ these days. It's an underground movement gaining momentum throughout America.

The title of this article is taken from the book written by Steve Sjogren. Years ago, Steve started a congregation outside Cincinnati, Ohio with only a handful of people. They started something called "Servant Evangelism" in which they continually performed acts of kindness to people in their community. They never took any money for these good deeds. Today, over 4,000 people attend the church that started this conspiracy of kindness.

As one of your pastors, I'm blessed to witness your acts of kindness on a daily basis. All summer long, you have been involved in the kindness revolution! Let me give just a few examples:

- You've extended warm hospitality to everyone on Sunday mornings in worship and in Sunday School classes.
- You've blessed 150+ children during a joy-filled week of Vacation Bible School.
- You've served in our conference camping program, helping children and youth experience Christ in a loving Christian community.
- In our church and community, you've blessed veterans with quilts, served in Backyard Missions, gleaned corn with Project SHARE, bagged groceries at Mission Central, served meals in Harrisburg with Isaiah 61, supported New Hope Ministries, joined other downtown churches to provide a community dinner for 100+ neighbors and much, much more.
- Farther away, you've helped neighbors in Clearfield County, PA, Conway, SC, and other communities, serving with your hands and your hearts.
- Even when it was not possible for you to be "hands-on" in a mission project, you've joined in the conspiracy of kindness with your prayer support and your generous giving.

In many ways, you've shown kindness in and through your life together this summer. You've also demonstrated love with your family, friends, and even strangers. Often kindness transforms lives in unseen ways. It's like the pinch of yeast the woman in Jesus' parable hid in a large measure of flour. Every demonstration of love in Jesus' name makes a difference, whether we realize it at the moment or not.

How about you? Why has God put you where you are right now? How can you demonstrate the love that God has so freely given to you in Jesus Christ? There is a conspiracy of kindness happening in the Body of Christ! Will you be part of it?

From Pastor John:

Endowment Committee

I moved from Carlisle to Grace Lemoyne in 2012. Pastor Denny was my DS at the time. There are many things that happen in a new church, when I arrived at Grace I was told that the organ would be used for two weeks and then go under repair for 8 months. It was a beautiful instrument but it needed some work and you should see it and hear it now. I was in a Trustee meeting one time, when someone from a Suzuki violin class came rushing in and told us that there was water coming into the third floor ceiling. We knew that we were in the midst of a renovation/replacement of that part of the church roof. But we thought that we were replacing the roof so it would not leak, not creating a watertight pond that filled up and then splashed over the rim and created a waterfall from the third floor to the basement. Then there was the time when the sound system just did not work like it used to work. On occasion the cb conversation of truckers on 81 would interrupt prayer time or while serving communion or even during the sermon. These may have been interesting conversations but they really didn't belong in the worship service. Lastly, there was the time when a couple desired to help young people afford to go into nursing school or other higher education field. This couple had not been able to have any children themselves. This couple had watched many children grow up in their beloved church. This couple, upon the cancer caused death of the wife who had been a nurse, wanted her legacy to continue long after her death.

So you may be asking what do all of these different situations have in common. The answer is simple. They all surround an endowment fund. Each of the projects, each of the legacies, each of them were motivations that included funding through an Endowment Fund.

I have had the privilege as pastor to see many church members express their stewardship and faithfulness through support of Endowment Funding. Some have given a little and some have given much. Some have supported through cash giving. Others have given through estates, property, jewels, stocks and bonds. The funding has been very diverse. But it was through this type of giving that great things were accomplished.

I invite you to contact the endowment committee of First Church and discuss ways in which you might express your stewardship to Jesus Christ. Just maybe your gifting will provide music for ages, a dry place for ministry, support of those who have hearing difficulties. Or just maybe you will be laying in a hospital bed and the attending nurse who is giving such compassionate care is there because they were supported in their education through an endowment gift. You will never be able to predict all that God will do through your generosity and commitment.

I can't believe I am writing the August newsletter. Summer is rushing by too fast! After I write this, I am going to the back porch with a good book and savor summer moments—Hey Ron, what's for dinner?

If you know me, you know I love a good mystery. Kathy Herman caught my eye by having her complete Ozark Mountain Trilogy published at the same time. No waiting between her suspenseful books. Ms. Herman starts the series with Not by Sight. Five years earlier, Abby Cumming's sister and father vanished without a trace while they were out fishing. Now Abby spots a person she truly believes is her sister while she is out shopping. But neither her mother nor her older brother will believe her. She turns to her best friend J. D. and he agrees to help her investigate. But can two sixteen year-olds really crack this cold case? In **Only by Death** Ms. Herman explores the ravages Alzheimer's can have on a family. Liam Beme cannot bear the thought of his mother spending her last years in a nursing home in the grip of Alzheimer's. So he takes her to the river and drowns her. And getting his inheritance early has been a good thing for him. But did he commit the murder out of mercy or for his own gain? Then he discovers there is a witness or maybe two. Must he now commit murder again to cover up what happened to his mother? The final book in the trilogy, Treacherous Mix addresses the issue of premarital sex. Hawke Cummings wakes up from a nightmare to realize his lover is gone. Really gone—her house has not one stick of furniture, picture or any sign that anyone ever lived there. Not wanting to admit he even knows Kennedy, he decides not to notify the sheriff she is missing. Soon he realizes that someone else in town knows his secret, and he begins to fear for his life as well as Kennedy's life. This trilogy was rated high for suspense, so keep all the lights on and read while the lightening bugs light up the night sky.

For all of you who love a good romance, new author Carla Laureano's *Five Days in Skye* might be a perfect beach read for you. Set in Scotland on the Isle of Skye, Andrea Sullivan is trying to snag a high profile client for her hospitality consultant job, but she only has five days to accomplish her mission. Andrea is realizing that she is working so hard that there is no joy in her life. Her client, James MacDonald, is also weary with his life in the public eye. He longs to leave the rat race to the rats. And like all good romances when two people want a different life come together, sparks begin to fly. They wonder if this is God's wake up call to take a chance on each other and a deeper life. I won't spoil the story. I just invite you to read and escape in this romantic but soul deep read!

If neither of these books interests you, stop by as there are many genres to choose from and a volunteer to help you find just the right book!!

Tax Advantaged Ways to Gift to First United Methodist Church

1. If you are over 70 1/2 and have to take a Required Minimum Distribution from an IRA AND are gifting money from your checking account, you may be able to save money on federal income taxes using the Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) rule.

2. If you have stocks with big gains and plan to sell them to gift to the church, you may be able to save on federal income taxes by gifting the shares instead.


