"How Should We Pray?"

When we closed our church building in mid-March, and began having our worship services and other activities online, none of us expected this. It's August. A new school year is approaching. We're still trying to figure out life, and church life, as COVID-19 continues to spread. In the midst of it all, the most important thing we can do is pray. How should we pray?

Many Christians are returning to a verse in the Old Testament. When King Solomon completed the building of the temple, the Lord appeared to him and said,



...if my people, who are called by my name, will **humble themselves and pray** and **seek** my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land. (2 Chronicles 7:14)

This verse points to four keys to prayer:

Perspective "...*if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray*..."

There is something humbling about this virus. Over these months we realize we are not in control. There are things we can do to care for the well-being of ourselves and others, but the spread of COVID-19 is a daily reminder of our human frailty. God calls us to humble ourselves. To let go of our need to figure it all out and work it all out. To get down on our knees before our Creator and put everything in God's hands. Humility is not thinking less of ourselves. It's thinking of ourselves less, and trusting our present and our future to God, who loves us.

Presence "... and seek my face ... "

God's face is always turned in our direction, much like the face of a parent or grandparent lovingly watching over a child. There are so many ways we can turn to see God's face. So many ways to become aware of God's loving presence. Reading the Bible and devotional writings. Worshiping alone or, as we've been doing, online. Enjoying fellowship with others. Keeping a journal helps some to seek the face of God. Walking outdoors, enjoying the beauty of God's creation, is another way to pray. Prayer is a love relationship with God. Seeking God's face feeds us. It comforts us. It's an amazing blessing.

Peace "...and turn from their wicked ways, ... "

We all experience the consequences of our sins and the sins of others, but this pandemic is not God's punishment for our wicked ways. God's heart aches for those who suffer and grieve. God is forever at work to heal and to restore. Jesus died on the cross for imperfect people like you and me. Our need is to turn from anything in our lives that interferes with our relationship with God. In prayer we lay down our sins, our fears, our anxieties and we receive God's forgiveness and God's peace.

Power "... then I will **hear** from heaven, and I will **forgive** their sin and will **heal** their land."

Prayer not only changes us. It also changes situations. God hears our prayers and acts in response to them. Just as God's people were called to pray when Solomon's great temple building project was completed, so we are called to pray in this time of crisis. **Prayer is the most important thing we can do right now!**

God invites us to humble ourselves and pray, to seek God's face, and to turn from things that interfere with our relationship with God. As we do, the eyes of our hearts are open to see that God hears our prayers, forgives our sins, and heals our land. Things are not yet as they shall be, but a new world is emerging. A quiet revolution of grace and peace is underway. God's people, you and I are called to be part of it!

I am writing this on a very hot summer night in July and wishing I was out on the deck reading a book or watering my flowers while listening to a book. But I am going to power through this newsletter, wishing I could show each and every one of you all the wonderful books I have bought with you in mind during this time alone. Keep praying that happens soon. I have to stop and laugh. My computer just told me to be more concise-it doesn't know me like you do! But enough chatter- on to the books.

Becky Wade has been one of my favorite authors for a long time because she writes comedic romances. Nothing serious for her, but this time she is tackling a serious subject. In her latest book, Stay with Me, Genevieve Woodward has finally faced the fact that she is an opioid addict. It started after an ankle injury, and now it has escalated to a full-blown addiction. As a Christian Bible study author, she has taken great pains to hide it from her readers. When she wakes up in a stranger's house, with the homeowner starring down at her and wondering if she is dead, Gen knows she has to get clean. Sam Turner is a loner who has closed himself off after the overdose death of his girlfriend. He is understandably not sure he can be around another addict. But Gen begs for him to let her stay, and they come to an agreement with several checks

and balances. As Gen endures withdrawal, Sam tries to help her with healthy meals and some emotional support. With several twists and turns in this book, I will let you find out what happens. Robin Caroll's new book **Dead Silence** caught my attention, because my daughter has a degree in deaf education, and I know a smattering of sign language. Elise Carmichael, is a court sign language interpreter and mother to a deaf son. Lip reading has become second nature to her, and when she reads a stranger's lips talking about an attack on a senator, who is also her mother-in-law, she wonders what to do. Just at that critical moment she receives notice that her son Sawyer has been rushed to the ER, and she races to his side. After being at the hospital with her son, she forgets what she has "over heard". Not until the morning news screams the news that her mother-in-law has been assassinated does she call the FBI to tell them what she knows. After revealing she can identify the killer, she and Sawyer become the focus of the killer's aim. This book is classed as a thriller, and the plot will keep you guessing to the last page. Don't miss this page turner.

In June, giving is running behind average weekly budget by \$2-\$3 thousand per week. We appreciate all the support for our church during this difficult time and are thankful for those who have been able to continue in prayer and financial support of our ministry. Until we gather again, we hope you will consider mailing your contributions to the church office or utilizing electronic giving via the church website, <u>www.fumchurch.com</u>. The quarterly giving statements were mailed in early July. Our actual expenses continue to be less than planned as the church staff is working hard to reduce discretionary spending to help keep our financial position in good shape.

We are looking forward to gathering again starting July 26th, but also understand the situation is very fluid. In the meantime, since the pandemic started, our church continues to serve the Lord and its members by offering services "online" and hosting Sunday classes and meetings throughout the week.
