Opening Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors

"Quick to Listen, Slow to Speak, Slow to Grow Angry"

Last month we began a series of messages called, "All Day Every Day," focusing on the New Testament Book of James. James offers practical guidance for living as followers of Jesus, not just the one hour a week we're in church, but the other 167 hours of the week of our everyday lives. Digging into this letter, I'm amazed at how these ancient words are so relevant for our lives today. Among his most relevant words for us today, James writes:

Know this, my dear brothers and sisters: everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to grow angry. (James 1:19)

Imagine if we would make it our practice all day every day to be "quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to grow angry." When we don't slow down, when we don't take the time to hear each other, we create conflict and anger with one another. If we're quick to listen, if we're slow to speak, a natural response is that we're slow to be angry.

So what does it mean to be quick to listen and slow to speak? It means to consider our heart before engaging our mouth. Not every truth is ours to tell. Not every opinion needs to be expressed. Not every correction needs to be made. Not every thought needs to be spoken.

In a world of people that are eager to get in the first word, to win the argument, to sway others to their side, we are called to follow the example of Jesus, the greatest listener that ever walked the earth. Jesus often went away to a quiet place where he listened to God in prayer. Out of his prayer life flowed the grace to listen with compassion, not just with his ears, but with his heart. In relationship with Jesus we learn to be quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to anger.

As I think about the example of Jesus, and reflect on the teaching of James, my prayer for our church family is that we would excel in listening! Listening builds loving relationships. Listen to God, both in your devotional time and in the midst of your daily activity. Listen to members of your family. Listen to your friends. Listen to your neighbors, your co-workers, the strangers you meet. Listen to your sisters and brothers in the household of faith.

- 1. Listening shows you love. By listening you put aside your agenda and give your full attention to the one you are listening to.
- 2. Listening shows you care. By listening you convey your desire to understand what the one you are listening to is experiencing, feeling, and thinking.
- 3. Listening shows you value others. By listening you take the time to get to know people, their situations, their stories, the way Jesus did. It is a great honor to get to do this!

Lord, teach us all to listen!



From the Library

Drumroll, please! Exciting news! The library is now open for business every Sunday before the first service and during the Sunday School hour until the second service starts. It has been 18 months since we have been open, and we have many wonderful books for you just in time for your vacation. We are ready for you!

Domestic abuse is a problem our society has yet to conquer, but where do you go for help if your abuser is a celebrated police officer from a powerful and prominent family? Janice Cantore tackles that quandary in her latest book, **Breach of Honor**. Set in Oregon, Officer Leah Radcliff feels safer on the job than at home with her volatile husband, Brad. Then one night it all comes to a tragic conclusion, but will anyone believe Leah's side of the story? It seems that many in the Table Rock police department have a secret they want to keep, and they will go to any length to keep Leah quiet. Officer Clint Tanner is one of the few who is willing to help her and her attorney to produce the evidence they need to show Brad's true character. In her darkest hours Leah is leaning on the One who has promised to never leave her. **Breach of Honor** has a five start rating, and many reviewers have said it was the best suspense book they have read this year—see what you think.

Talking to all of you book lovers out there, I am sure my story of loving the library from an early age is very familiar. I was allowed to ride my bike there by myself and usually took the limit of books every time. When I lived in England, the American library was an hour away, and I never missed an opportunity to visit it when I was on the base—it was a lifeline. So that tells you why the **Librarian of Boone's Hollow** was on my must buy list. During the Great Depression, Addie Cowherd is attending college and planning to become a novelist when her parents run out of money for her education. She takes a job as a traveling

librarian, who ventures into rural Kentucky on horseback to deliver books and magazines. But instead of being welcomed with open arms, she is rejected as an outsider, and outsiders aren't welcome in Boone's Hollow. Emmett Tharp is no outsider, but he has returned to the Hollow as the first college graduate in his family only to find he is also being rejected by a community with high unemployment, a community that values moonshine over a degree. Can two "outsiders" come together to win the town's trust and support? I won't spoil that ending for you! This is Pam—"As a former librarian, I think this book sounds like a great read. But I am not sure I would have had the gumption to be a traveling librarian. A similar book that you can get at the public library is **The Book Woman of Troublesome Creek."**

August Prayer Challenge – Musical Prayers!

Many of us use scripture in our prayers, but have you ever used music in your personal prayer time? Music goes beyond what words can express... it connects with our emotions, stirs our spirit and helps us to more fully express what is in our hearts. Let's look at a few different ways you can use music in your prayers – throughout the month of August, give one or all of these ideas a try!

- <u>Sing Your Prayer</u> If you have a hymnal at home, open it up and find a song to use as your prayer (and if you would like to borrow a hymnal from church, just let Tina Eaton know). Sing it out loud and let the sound of your voice be your prayer. Allow the act of singing to open your heart to conversations with God. No matter if you think you have a beautiful voice or not, sing out loud for your audience of One!
- <u>Pray the Lyrics</u> When we worship together in the church, we often don't take time to really consider the words. Hymns and worship songs have their foundation in scripture, so try using the lyrics for your prayer. Simply read the words, taking time to meditate on what they mean and how they relate to your life. Give it a try with a song like Amazing Grace, How Great Thou Art or some other hymn and, whatever you choose, turn the words into your prayers! If you're looking for a more contemporary song that references a specific scripture verse or passage, try <u>wordtoworship.com</u>.... this is a great

online tool to use in your search!

• <u>Focus Your Prayer</u> - Do you listen to music when you study or work? Background music can remove distractions and help you focus your thoughts. Try listening to our playlist, "Where Words Fail, Music Speaks" at First UMC of Mechanicsburg on Spotify. Don't forget, you need to sign up for an account, but it's free!

Using music as a part of your prayers also fosters a special time of personal worship with God, which is a great addition to gathering with your church family to worship on Sundays!
