This month's reviews:







This is absolutely the best day to write the December newsletter. And yet I have been sitting here for a half hour staring at the screen. Maybe more caffeine, maybe less---different chair -no chair—and so it goes. But her grandmother has left her the family's peach orchard, and everyone is expecting her to take over the Running the business is adding stress to Zoe's life that she never saw coming. Meanwhile, ex-boyfriend Cruz is not sure he can handle life in the same town with the woman he never stopped loving. Try to fit this into your December schedule.

Irene Hannon, one of my favorite romantic suspense writers, has a new series out called *Code of Honor*. Book one is titled **Dangerous Illusions**. Detective Collin Flynn is investigating a tragic death linked to a grieving woman with apparent memory loss. But soon he realizes there is more to this case than meets the eye. His job is to decide if Trish Bailey made a mistake that led to her mother's death, or did she deliberately murder her own mother. Trish is in a very fragile state as she has not yet recovered from the deaths of her husband and father from an accident that had left her mother disabled. What I love about Ms. Hannon's books are the twists and turns. Just when I think I have pinpointed the culprit, a clue takes the story in another direction. And this book is just as complex. Sneak out of your least favorite holiday event to read this book!!

With those two recommendations, I want to remind you to stop in the library and check out all we have to offer. I hope you have had time to catch up with recent goings-on in Mitford in Jan Karon's newly released To Be Where You Are. If you saw The Mountain between Us movie in theaters now, I have been told the book is so much better. And as you all know we have the best Amish library around!


