#### "Repeat the Sounding Joy"

I love singing the old, familiar Christmas carols. I love singing them in worship as soon as the first candle of Advent is lit and to keep on singing them all the way into the next year. The highlight of the whole season for many of us is the Christmas Eve Services. When the light of candles illumines the dark sanctuary and we sing, "Silent Night, Holy Night," it's amazing! Then the blessing is given and the candles are extinguished and the lights are turned on, but, as you and I know, the service isn't over yet. The celebration of Christmas Eve isn't over until the music swells and we lift our voices to sing, "Joy to the world, the Lord is come."

2019 marks the 300th anniversary of "Joy to the World." In worship this Advent and Christmas Season we're going to focus on the theme of joy, using Scripture and this old-familiar carol. Interestingly, when Isaac Watts wrote the words in 1719, he was not intending to write a Christmas carol. "Joy to the World" never mentions the birth of Jesus or the manger. There is nothing in it about Bethlehem, Mary and Joseph, shepherds, magi, a bright star or angelic choirs. The lyrics were originally penned by Watts for a collection of poems based on some of the Old Testament psalms.

The inspiration for "Joy to the World" was Psalm 98:4-9, which envisions all of creation and everyone on earth breaking forth in joyous song and singing praises when the Lord comes in final victory. For example, in verses 8-9a the psalmist declares,

Let all the rivers clap their hands; let the mountains rejoice out loud altogether before the Lord because he is coming to establish justice on the earth!

In verse 2 of his poem, Watts proclaims,

Joy to the world, the Savior reigns! Let all their songs employ; while fields and floods, rocks, hills and planes repeat the sounding joy, repeat the sounding joy, repeat, repeat the sounding joy.

Nearly 130 years later, in 1848, composer Lowell Mason set the words of Watts' poem to music, using an arrangement from Handel's "Messiah." Since then, generations of Christians have joined their voices in the cold December darkness to "repeat the sounding joy." We find true joy in the birth of the Lord Jesus, and in the promise of his Second Coming. This is the good news this world so badly needs. The Savior reigns!

I can't wait to worship with you every Sunday this December and on Christmas Eve. I look forward to singing the old carols and the new songs of Christmas, as we "repeat the sounding joy." We are a people of joy, and we witness to the whole world as we sing, "Joy to the World, the Lord is come!"

Rejoicing in the Lord with you, always!

#### From the Library

On this crisp November night, I find it hard to believe I am writing about Christmas. So I put on some Christmas music and started looking at the new Christmas books I want to tell you about—now I am stoked –I wonder how Ron would feel about putting up the tree later. On that note I better get back to the books. I have long been a fan of Rachel Hauck, and her novella The Wedding Dress Christmas: (Small Town Romance) is the perfect cap to her Wedding Trilogy. (It can easily be read as a standalone book). It combines the charm of Christmas, small towns, and country music. JoJo Castle has come home to Hearts Bend, Tennessee after her adventure in the big city came crashing down around her. Back home and working with her cousin in the Wedding shop is all JoJo aspires to even when her high school crush and now country super star, Buck Matthews comes back into town. Buck has cancelled his European tour so he can be at his mother's side while she is battling cancer. Buck has had no time for family or friends during his rise to fame, but during this down time in his hometown, Buck begins to reevaluate his life goals. JoJo has felt the flames of long forgotten love coming to life, but she and Buck have different paths and ideas. Could there really be a chance for love between two such different people? Reviewers have given this novella raving reviews and it is the perfect size for this busy time of year. New to our library, The Women of Christmas is a short reflective read for Christmas. Ms. Higgs encourages us to put aside the wrapping paper, the endless shopping, and all the other trivialities that we call Christmas and experience the season afresh with Elizabeth, Mary, and Anna. You might remember that I used to dress in costume to tell Mary's story in first person. Though it was based in scripture, part of it was my feelings as a woman and what she might have felt. Ms. Higgs takes it deeper using scripture to show the wonder of these three biblical women as they prepare the world, their families, and themselves for the Savior. With each verse of scripture, God's gift is revealed, and the remarkable journey of these women is vividly described. Before you are sucked into the Christmas vortex, refresh your spirit with this insightful read. Another book you won't want to miss this Christmas season is Max Lucado's Because of Bethlehem. I am sure many of you have used one of Lucado's books for a Bible study at some time—he has been a prolific author and pastor for 30 years. Having read the first quarter of the book at the time of writing this, I can tell you he has made me laugh out loud and shed some tears. The theme of this Christmas book is "God knows what it's like to be human". You can share any problem, question or even angry thought and He understands it all. The baby whose story starts in the cradle and climaxes at the cross knows you. This is a book that will cause you to think deeper and to inspire you long after the decorations are put away. With humor and insight, Lucado's book is a down-to-earth approach to Christmas. Included in the book are a devotional guide and also a guide to recommended readings if you are struggling with fear, weariness, or grief—just to name a few topics. Though I recommend this book in December, truthfully you could enjoy it any time. The library has several other new Christmas books you won't want to miss. Stop by the library and let us help you find just the right Christmas read!!

And for the deeper, more simplified meaning? Joy. A reminder to myself to never lose joy in worshipping our God; to never lose that wonderment of Christ—true man, yet very God; to be joyful in my serving for His kingdom.

And as we approach another busy Advent and Christmas season, I invite you to continue to discover joy in worship as you feel called.

#### **Clearance Updates Required**

As per state law and our churches Safe Sanctuary requirements, clearances for those 18 years of age and older who serve alongside children and youth MUST be updated every 5 years. Because a bulk of First Church partners in ministry (those serving in any capacity within the children and youth departments) updated their clearances at the same time, most are approaching their 5 year renewal with the start of 2020. Therefore, it is very likely your clearances need to be updated. This includes Child Abuse Clearance, PA Police Background Check, FBI fingerprinting or notarized affidavit, and your Safe Sanctuary training. To begin the process please verify with Dawn Fisher or Anna Harris as to when your 5 year renewal must be completed. On January 12 and 19 after services and during the Sunday school hour there will be opportunities to get your affidavit notarized. Notaries will be available for those that qualify for a signed affidavit instead of FBI fingerprinting. (Affidavit are available for only those who are nonpaid staff and who have lived consecutively in the state of Pennsylvania for at least 10 years. Out of state college is not an exception). We will provide the notary form, just come with a valid form of ID to the main lobby on either January 12 or 19. Watch your email for an invitation to participate in a Safe Sanctuary training. Training has moved to an online platform and links are issued per person (please do not share the link for the training).
