Opening Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors

"We're Still Waiting"

This year, Advent finds us waiting as perhaps we've never waited before. Virtually this entire year has been a time of waiting. We've waited during lockdowns and quarantines. We've waited on masks and cleaning supplies and toilet paper. We've waited on test results for the coronavirus, wondering whether we are positive or not. We've waited endless weeks and months, not able to visit our loved ones in hospitals and nursing homes, in order to protect them.

We've waited on our kids going back to school and waited to see if our jobs would hold out during the crisis. We've waited on unemployment checks and stimulus checks. We've waited in line to vote and waited to see if our mail-in ballot went through, and then waited on the results of the election. We've waited for a vaccine. And we've waited and waited and waited to go back to church in the old ways that were familiar and comfortable to us.

As I write this there is news of a vaccine on the horizon, but we're still waiting. In the meantime, the number of covid-19 cases in our area is spiking again. Many of us are growing weary of all the waiting. We're tired of putting life on hold and missing out on things we treasure.

This year of waiting has been difficult. However, Advent and Christmas remind us that waiting time does not have to be wasted time if we "wait upon the Lord." (Isaiah 40:31) Mary's time of waiting for the Christ Child invites us as followers of Jesus to do two kinds of waiting at the same time.

On the one hand, Mary's time of waiting had a fixed endpoint that she knew ahead of time. The closer she got to "the time for her to be delivered" (Luke 2:6) the more laborious her wait was, but she knew that in nine months the Lord Jesus would be born. Her waiting had a goal and an end, and she faithfully pursued it with God's help.

In much the same way, we're waiting to celebrate Christmas. This will be "A December to Remember." For everyone's health and safety our celebrations at church and with family and friends will be different this year. But, with God's help, we will still faithfully proclaim the Good News. We will still sing the carols and share the love of Christ as we celebrate "Emmanuel! God is with us!" (Matthew 1:23)

On the other hand, Mary's time of waiting was filled with the unknown. She made a difficult journey to Bethlehem, gave birth to Jesus in a stable, and fled with Joseph and the baby to Egypt to escape Herod's wrath. In the midst of uncertainty, God was still at work in Mary's life, providing everything she needed to fulfill God's calling.

Like Mary, our present waiting is filled with the unknown. We don't know how much longer we will be in this season of waiting nor what life will look like in 2021. But do know this, "God is with us!" What new thing is ready to be born in your life, in your family, in our church, in our community? The apostle Paul has a good word for people like us that are waiting, "I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work among you will bring it to completion by the day of Jesus Christ." (Philippians 1:6)

May you and your dear ones in all the places where they are have a most blessed Christmas!

Endowment Fund Grants Support Pandemic-Related Projects

The Endowment Fund Committee of First Church was pleased to award grants toward the following pandemic-related needs of our congregation in 2020:

Sound Deck, Sanctuary Roof – The Trustees received a grant to expand the worship sound deck at the rear of the sanctuary, and toward replacing the roof over the sanctuary. During the pandemic, our sound system has been critical to livestreaming worship services and recording them for placement on the website. The improvements also will enhance the overall worship experience for all who attend our church.

Worship Arts Ministry Honorarium – In March, First Church temporarily halted in-person worship for the safety of our members and the community. Weekly services were pre-recorded and made available through the website. When in-person worship resumed in July, our Sound Team began livestreaming services for those who feel more comfortable worshipping at home. Additionally, recorded services continue to be available through the website. All of this is made possible only through the efforts of the church staff and a team of dedicated volunteers headed by Jason Kichline. As the pandemic and need for online worship continues, an honorarium was created for Jason's continued work.

Stained Glass Windows - In addition, a contribution was made to a fund for the restoration of First Church's historic stained-glass windows in accordance with a donor's wishes.

In all, \$17,685 in grants was distributed with the annual income produced by the Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund was established over a decade ago. The principal remains untouched, and the annual income it generates is reinvested into First Church's worship, ministries, and outreach efforts. All of this is made possible by the generosity of our congregation members who support the fund with current or deferred gifts. The Endowment Committee gratefully acknowledges this support, and appreciates your continued prayers of our efforts to grow the fund for the future of First Church.
