On Valentine's Day, many of us exchange cards and gifts to show love to our dear ones. This year, as the holiday approaches, I'm remembering a simple prayer, written centuries ago by Cuthbert, the prior of a monastic community on a remote island near Ireland.

My dear ones, O God, bless Thou and keep, in every place where they are.

As I pray this prayer, I am reminded of who "my dear ones" are. "My dear ones" are, first of all, those closest to me. Betsy, our children and their spouses, our grandchildren, our parents, our siblings and their spouses and children, our extended families, both near and far away. Holding each of these "dear ones" before God in prayer, my heart is filled with gratitude for their lives and concern for their needs.

My dear ones, O God, bless Thou and keep, in every place where they are.

"My dear ones" are also my church family. The Apostle Paul wrote, "In the same way, though there are many of us, we are one body in Christ, and individually we belong to each other" (Romans 12:5 CEB). First Church, you belong to me, and I belong to you. I pray for you, holding your joys and sorrows before God in prayer, seeking God's blessing and keeping as we carry out Christ's ministry and mission together.

"My dear ones" include sisters and brothers in United Methodist churches, too, locally and all over the world. I pray for our church, its pastors and leaders, its people and ministries. "My dear ones" extend to other Christian communions, local churches throughout Mechanicsburg and to the ends of the earth. God's house is a big, big house, with lots and lots of rooms, and I pray for the health and vitality of every congregation, bringing the gospel to the world for whom Christ died.

My dear ones, O God, bless Thou and keep, in every place where they are.

The circle of "my dear ones" continues to widen, when I consider that when Jesus said, "Love your neighbor as yourself," by "neighbor" he meant everyone. He meant my neighbor across the street and my neighbor across the world. Holding "my dear ones" in prayer, I realize that I belong to them. They belong to me. "O God, teach me to love my neighbors, all of them!" The circle of "my dear ones" grows wider still as I consider my connection not just to all people, but to all of creation.

My dear ones, O God, bless Thou and keep, in every place where they are.

Beloved, I invite you to pray this simple prayer. Those who bring "my dear ones" to God in prayer are rays of hope in a hurting world. To pray this prayer breaks down barriers and opens doors. If all of us were simply to hold our dear ones, all of them, before God each day, it would change the world.

A Thank You Note

As a member of both the Hospitality and ACCESS teams, I wanted to extend my personal thanks to our Trustee and Facilities teams for making changes to areas throughout the sanctuary. They have worked closely with the various groups within the church and have reached out to local craftsmen for design and implementation.

Over the last few years there have been many changes to the sanctuary to allow all to come into His presence. Our friends of the Church of the Brethren denomination have a special initiative called "*Open Roof*" named after their desire to remove all barriers of those coming into the presence of our Lord and Savior. In Mark 2: 1-5, four men brought their friend who was crippled lying on a mat to see Jesus. However, there were so many around Jesus that they went up on a roof and literally made a hole in the roof to lower their friend into the presence of Jesus. Thankfully, we have not had to make that kind of drastic

modification to the church building!

The sanctuary now has a more open and welcoming altar area and a ramp that allows complete access to the pulpit. Some pews around the outer end of the sanctuary were also removed to promote an easier and safer traffic flow that encourages hospitality and the building of relationships. The most recent change has now created areas within the pews that invites our loved ones to be with us always - in service, and during special times of baptisms, wedding and funerals.

When I gaze upon the large stain glass window at the rear of the sanctuary - the one with Jesus surrounded by children, I can hear Him say, "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." **Matthew 19: 14**

Lastly, I also want to thank the First Church congregation for your support of these changes but most especially to those who have literally had your regular seating areas modified or removed so that all His little children can come into His presence.

Clearance Updates Required

As per state law and our churches Safe Sanctuary requirements, clearances for those 18 years of age and older who serve alongside children and youth MUST be updated every 5 years. Because a bulk of First Church partners in ministry (those serving in any capacity within the children and youth departments) updated their clearances at the same time, most are approaching their 5 year renewal with the start of 2020. Therefore, it is very likely your clearances need to be updated. This includes Child Abuse Clearance, PA Police Background Check, FBI fingerprinting or notarized affidavit, and your Safe Sanctuary training. To begin the process please verify with Dawn Fisher or Anna Harris as to when your 5 year renewal must be completed. Watch your email for an invitation to participate in a Safe Sanctuary training. Training has moved to an online platform and links are issued per person (please do not share the link for the training). Complete the remaining clearances on-line by following the instructions located under the "Safe Sanctuary" tab of the Children's Ministry page at fumchurch.com

First Church had a successful financial year in 2019. We held our expenses in line with our contributions and still had funds left over. In accordance with our policy and direction from the Finance Committee, we used all unspent balances of individual line items fund \$5,700 for the building reserve, \$5,700 for Missions and another \$10,000 on the debt principal. Using General Fund and designated funds, we paid more than \$111,000 to a wide variety of missions; another great success.

The December 31, 2019, financial report and the 2020 approved budget are included in this newsletter.


