"Seven Last Words"

Just before the beginning of the Lenten Season last year, just as we were learning about the COVID-19 virus, I watched an interview with Pulitzer Prize winning presidential historian, Jon Meacham. The interview was about his latest book. Surprisingly, the book was not a biography of one of our nation's presidents, but a series of sermons he gave on the last words of Jesus from the cross. A lifelong Episcopalian layman, Meacham wrote, The Hope of Glory, reflecting on the gospel accounts of the final words of Jesus during the six hours he suffered on the cross.

Before reading Meacham's book, my experience with what are traditionally called "the seven last words" was somewhat limited. Over the years, I've been invited to preach at community Good Friday Services on one of the "words," which are more accurately statements of Jesus. Reading Meacham's book, I came to see that these words convey in a powerful way the message of Jesus' radical love. This message speaks powerfully to us today, not only because of what Jesus said, but because of who he was, "the Christ, the Son of the living God." (Matthew 16:16)

Wanting to dig deeper, I discovered that over the past few years there seems to be a renewed interest in exploring the meaning of Jesus' final words. In fact, two United Methodist pastors have recently published books on them. In 2018, Adam Hamilton, senior pastor of The United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City, wrote, Final Words From the Cross. In December 2020, Seven Words: Listening to Jesus From the Cross, by Susan Robb, Senior Associate Minister at Highland Park United Methodist Church was published.

Reading and reflecting upon these three books led me to develop a series of sermons that I look forward to sharing with you during this Lenten Season. I invite you to join me for worship each Sunday, beginning February 21, as we draw close to Jesus as he breathes his last and speaks his last words. Listening to Jesus, may we experience anew the depth of his love for us and discover the meaning of his words for us today.

This has been a difficult year in many ways, but God always provides! We are thankful for His helping hand as our ministry of Opening Doors for Christ continues to move here at First Church. We are so grateful for the prayers and support our congregation has provided throughout 2020. As noted above, despite the difficulties of the pandemic, our church family continued supporting ministries and programs of our church at nearly the level we budgeted for the year. Furthermore, our church members, staff and volunteers came together in 2020 to help us hold the line on costs.

With the guidance of the Finance Committee and approval of our Administrative Board, the church participated in the Springtime CARES Act legislation which ensured our church and Little Friends Preschool staff remained engaged and could help us transition to a "virtual" ministry where needed. Like many organizations participating in this program, our CARES Act loan of \$104,000 was forgiven in December with our compliance to the guidelines of the relevant legislation.

In the midst of state shutdowns, our church established a successful "virtual" ministry for regular church

services each Sunday and other events throughout the week. In addition, here are just a few of the ways our resources were put to use during this unusual time: In addition to its budgeted outreach, the Missions team was approved to expand its giving by \$10,000 to support our United Methodist camping program, which was significantly impacted by the summer camp shutdown due to Covid. From a trustee's standpoint, we were able to upgrade some of our heating and air conditioning units, purchase equipment for online streaming and support the safety and security needs of our facility. We were also able to establish a significant operating fund to assist our consistent programming and mission outreach during the inevitable financial ebbs and flows of the upcoming year.

The full year financial results for 2020 are enclosed, along with our budget for 2021. We all look forward to see how God continues to grow our faith and family during this new year, in line with His will. Thank you for your commitment to the First Church ministry.

Little Free Pantry Collection

First Church is collecting nonperishable food items for the Little Free Pantry located on our property to help local families in need. The Little Free Pantry collection will take place on **Wednesdays from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m.** in our parking lot through February 24. Items will be placed in the Little Free Pantry, as needed, throughout the winter months.
