I've been reflecting upon some of the ways our First Church family demonstrates God's love and responds to the needs of others.

Recently, you demonstrated God's love at Vacation Bible School. Making crafts, teaching stories and songs, leading recreation, offering delicious snacks, and just being with the children, you sowed seeds into the lives of 188 kids!

You are demonstrating God's love this summer by serving as deans, counselors, and nurses for our Conference Camping Program, and by supporting scholarships for children and youth to enroll in this important, life-changing ministry. You not only support campers from our church, but also from the Neighborhood Center in Harrisburg.

You demonstrate God's love by extending hospitality to everyone. Whether it's on Sunday morning or during the week, whether it's during special events like the Re-Creation concert, or in the parking lot for the third Friday food trucks and Jubilee Day, you are there with a kind word, a warm smile, and helpful direction. You demonstrate God's love by committing time and resources to support our Youth Mission Trip to Brooklyn this summer as they serve Christ in a place of great need.

You demonstrate God's love with financial support for our sister church in Sierra Leone, our Cru Missionaries, Jenna Mengle, and Matt and Leanne Herring, our college students engaged in short-term mission this summer, and others from our congregation serving as Volunteers in Mission.

You demonstrate God's love by helping our neighbors through Backyard Missions, Mission Central, New Hope, Neighborhood Center, Isaiah 61, the U.M. Home for Children, Bethany Village, and numerous other ways you serve in our community.

You demonstrate God's love with your prayers, your visits, your meals, and countless other acts of care for those in our congregation that are in need.

You demonstrate God's love through your giving as part of the United Methodist Church. You support missionaries at home and abroad. You have reduced by half the number of deaths from malaria on the continent of Africa and prevented childhood diseases. You are rebuilding communities destroyed by natural disaster, feeding the hungry, providing shelter for the homeless, advocating for refugees, working for peace, caring for "the least of these," as Jesus commands us to do.

In many, many more ways you demonstrate God's love in your day to day lives. You make *a huge footprint* every day!

The words of Jesus to his disciples long ago are still so true for us today:

"The size of the harvest is bigger than you can imagine, but there are few workers. Therefore, plead with the Lord of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest." (Matthew 9:37-38)

This is the day I have been waiting for—80 plus degrees, lots of sunshine, and the promise of more warm weather to come—whoopee! If I make errors in this newsletter (my proofreader will never let that get by her), it's because I am eager to take my book and my ice tea to the back porch.

Rain, rain, go away! I find myself saying that a lot this summer. I know I should see rain as a blessing, but rain every day is a little too much. So instead of worrying how many weeds are popping up in my flower beds, I'll read a book. (I would say guilt-free, but there is the dreaded dusting, always before me.) Better get to the best books for this month.

Rachel Hauck has played right into my hand by releasing her latest book, **The Love Letter**. If you have read Ms. Hauck's previous books, you know she likes to link her main character with a historical person and let their stories intertwine. Chloe Dashle's favorite acting job is not the romantic lead, but after reading the script from an epic love story set during the Revolutionary War, she decides she wants to expand her career and this would be the perfect movie to showcase her acting talents. Meanwhile, Jesse Gates isn't looking for anything beyond an actress to bring his script to life, but when he and Chloe begin to work together, chemistry and fireworks begin to crackle. The basis for the script is the love letter Hamilton Lightfoot writes to Esther Longfellow on the night of a major battle in South Carolina. Hamilton is a patriot and Esther's father is a staunch loyalist who vows his daughter will never marry a rebel. I won't spoil either plot, but read **The Love Letter** to see if romance can win for either of these two couples separated by a couple hundred years.

You know I can't pass up telling you about a good mystery, and the third book in the Memphis Cold Case series by Patricia Bradley has arrived. **Justice Betrayed** is dear to my heart because it is set in Memphis during Elvis week and filled with Elvis impersonators. What a delightful combo! Even if you are not as thrilled with Elvis as I am, I still think you'll enjoy this mystery! When Rachel Sloane, investigator of cold cases, is shown a photo of her mother (an unsolved murder) with four Elvis impersonators—two of which have also been murdered, she decides there are some new leads to be followed in this cold case. Lt. Boone Callahan offers to help, but their messy romantic history might be a stumbling block in the case. If you avoid the rain and read this by the pool, wear lots of sunscreen, because you won't be able to put this down.

Here's another reminder about our annual book sale in conjunction with the UMW yard sale on August 18th. We are accepting gently used adult and children's books, CDs, DVDs, and jigsaw puzzles. 


Ready, Set, Sell!
