A Message from Katie Knorr, Director of Children and Family Ministries...

When I think back to my childhood, many of my strong memories revolve around church, like hiding in a choir loft, singing a song about a wee little man named Zacchaeus, and spending a week with new and old friends for Vacation Bible School. I might not remember every craft, every song, or every face of the volunteers, but I can remember the Bible stories I learned and the feeling of happiness I felt each week. Growing up with a mom who was (and still is) a pastor, my sister and I would go to at least three Vacation Bible Schools a year, and the moment I aged out, I started volunteering. Getting to see how excited these children would get when they saw the teens or adults praising God made me truly treasure the opportunity to share God's love with the children of the community.

First Church has in-person Vacation Bible School back on the menu after a short hiatus and we are so excited to see what God has in store for us. Our theme for this year is "Food Truck Party: On a Roll with God." We will spend the week learning about different food stories in the Bible, tying it all back to Matthew 6:11 "Give us this day our daily bread". We will celebrate the ways God provides, loves, and cares for us and share our faith in God through providing for, loving, and caring for others.

Vacation Bible School also allows these children to come together and make a difference in our community, which we plan to do by collecting food and money for the Little Free Pantry, a service opportunity that supports countless families in our community.

From the Library

I hope you are enjoying summer and celebrating our country's birthday with family, picnics, and a perfect afternoon on the deck with a good book and an icy beverage. It doesn't get any better than that! In keeping with a patriotic theme I have two new books series to introduce to you that involve the military. Without more chitchat let me tell you about these great reads that will leave you ready for more in the series.

When I am reading a good book, half of me wants to get to the end to finish the plot and the other half of me never wants it to end. With that idea in mind, let me introduce you to the Metcalfe family of six siblings. Book one in *The Metcalfe series* is about **Stone Metcalfe**, eldest of the clan. A ruggedly handsome man with a background of military service, but with political ambitions. When a foolish lapse of judgement upends all his plans, and he retreats to a mountain lodge to hide and regroup. Tasked with guarding supermodel, Brighton Buchanan with whom he was once in love, Stone takes it on with much anger and trepidation. She is a woman that had it all until her mistake traps her in the world of human trafficking. Stone and Brighton have an ugly history, but Brighton needs and still loves Stone. Stone doesn't think he can forgive her nor even like her again. As danger surrounds them, Stone vows to protect her, but that is all he plans to do. I'll let you find out if that is true!

Author Ronie Kendig continues the Metcalfe series with **Willow**, an aftercare specialist for helping trafficked victims and who has joined Mission: Liberate Everyone, based in Nigeria. The compound is attacked, and Willow and all the other victims are taken hostage. She tries to organize an escape, but it fails. Chijioke Okorie has returned to his homeland to discover his sister is missing and Willow, the woman he vowed to marry years ago, is now a hostage. With Chiji and Willow fighting from the inside and outside of trafficking ring, can they find a way to break the circle? I will warn you—this is a page turner.

As you probably know I am drawn to military suspense, but I might also mention if a dog is an integral part of the story, it is a forgone conclusion, I will be reading it. Lynette Eason is always a winner in our library, and she is back with a new extension of her *Elite Guardians series* of several years ago (and on the shelf). The Elite Guardians are a group of female bodyguards. In this first book, **Driving Force**, Christina Sherman is task to guard Boss, a highly trained military dog. Christina thinks at first this is a job for a boarding kennel, but Boss' owner Special Forces Air Commando Grey Parker, brings her around, especially after there is an attempt on Grey's life. Grey needs his dog guarded while he undergoes experimental surgery to restore his ability to walk. He wants to track down the villain that unleashed the nerve gas that has left Grey in a wheelchair and threatens many others. Not giving away anything, but if you have read Ms. Eason previously, you know there will be high octane suspense and many twists and turns before the last page.

A team of 23 youth and adult leaders are returning to Mat-Su Covenant Church in Wasilla, Alaska, departing on July 2nd.

Why Alaska?: A goal of the youth ministry at FUMC is to help expand a student's understanding and experience of mission and service during their time as a student at FUMC. We plan trips following the mentality of Acts 1:8 – going to "Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth." Over our four-year rotation we venture from Harrisburg (local) to an international experience (ends of the earth). Missions and service range from disaster relief, community provider support, rural, city, and every-



thing in between. We hope that students grow in their awareness of need in the world but also have their hearts stirred by the Spirit as to how they can use their skills and gifting to be a help to others. We partner with organizations that either have deep roots in a community or who serve by way of the local church. This way, even though our time in the area may be short, there is long lasting efforts and presence being made by the permanent organizations. While Alaska is not international, it is indeed cross cultural and is a more ideal option for us amidst of pandemic conditions.




