"Take Prayer to a New and Powerful Level"

In his book, <u>The Post-Quarantine Church</u>, Thom Rainer emphasizes the critical importance of prayer as churches prepare for ministry in the post-pandemic world. His research found that during the pandemic pastors and other church leaders began to seek God in prayer more fervently. Church members became more involved in prayer ministries. "The church was born from a movement of prayer after Christ's ascension," he writes. Reading the Book of Acts, Rainer observes,

"The church *devoted* themselves to prayer. Prayer was not a mere formality or a routine ministry. It was such a priority that it consumed the members of the first church. The power of the congregation would not be human centered; it would be God directed." (page 57)

This increased commitment to prayer that Rainer discovered in churches across the country, has certainly been evident in our life together at First Church. In addition to our prayer time during Sunday morning worship, you regularly pray for and with one another. Throughout the week you pray together in classes, small groups, committees, and other activities. Moms in Prayer meets regularly to pray for our students, their parents, and administrators, teachers, and staff in our schools. Many of you receive the weekly prayer letter from Janice Bowen, our Director of Congregational Care, and hold our church, its members and friends, and many others in prayer. This, in addition to your day to day devotional life, and the mealtime and bedtime and other time prayers you share together at home.

In April many of you participated in our prayer initiative, "One Thousand Prayers for Mechanicsburg." Organized by Tina Eaton, our Discipleship Director and Lori Hoffnagle, our Outreach Director, we partnered with four other churches in Mechanicsburg. Together we prayed for more than 1,100 places! In addition, churches in Newville, New Cumberland, and Sunbury heard about what we were doing, and requested prayer kits so that they could pray in their communities as well. The ripple effect of our efforts has reached beyond what we could have planned or imagined! It's been such a joy to hear stories from these prayers. Some of you have started forming friendships with those you've prayed for. God is so good!

In this newsletter, you'll find more information on our June "Ephesians Prayer Challenge." The four-part prayer in Ephesians 1 provides a powerful format for our own prayers, and challenges us to pray in new ways.

I'm grateful that First Church is a praying church. Thank you for your prayers for our church, for our pastors, staff, and leaders, and for the churches of our community. In this season of challenge and opportunity, we continue to discern God's direction for our next faithful steps. My prayer is that as a congregation, we will take prayer to a new and powerful level! What was true for the early church is true for First Church, Mechanicsburg today. *The power of the congregation would not be human centered; it would be God directed.*

From the Library

I usually start these newsletters with a brief topic like coming holidays, the weather, my obsession with coffee, or my favorite genre of books—but by this time you could probably write the intro yourselves—so let's just skip the trivial part and get to the books! Glad you agree with me.

Becky Wade is one of the library's favorite romance writers. Not only are her books swoon worthy, but my favorite part is also her comedic touch. Her latest series, *Misty River*, is based on five adults who are bound together by a childhood tragedy that they all miraculously survived. In the first book, **Stay with Me**, Ms. Wade introduces famous author and motivational speaker Genevieve, who ran from her life of fame to regroup. Sebastian Grant is introduced to us in book two, **Let Me be the One**. Sebastian is a pediatric heart surgeon who grew up as a foster child with problems most of us can only imagine. He craves a family of his own with a soul mate he can rely on. The problem is he is in love with his best friend's girlfriend. (I'm humming Jessie's Girl—you know what I mean). Fortunately, he has been able to hide his feelings from her, school teacher Leah Montgomery, not to mention his best friend. Leah is a math prodigy who has set aside her dream to raise her younger brother. Now that her brother is grown, Leah can pursue her dream of earning a PhD in math, and she is not letting romance get in her way. After submitting a DNA sample to a genealogy website, she gets some surprising results, and she asks Sebastian to help her track down her history. The more sparks fly while they work together, the more Sebastian must resist her—that is until Leah realizes her own feelings. Read this witty book to follow the path to the outcome.

I have been reading Terri Blackstock even before the church had a fiction library, and she never fails to deliver a good mystery with timely topics. Her newest book **Aftermath** is no exception. What are the topics other than romantic suspense? Friendship, betrayal, mental illness, PTSD, and survivors' guilt will get you started on what this book is about. It begins with three friends who go to a club to listen to their favorite band when there is an explosion. Only one friend makes it out alive. Dustin Webb, former military and owner of a security firm, is found with a trunk load of explosives—someone is setting him up. How can he prove he is being framed? Though he hasn't seen his childhood friend, Jamie Powell since he left for basic training, Dustin hopes she will defend him and help him find the people that are really responsible. She will be putting her career on the line to defend the man people are calling a terrorist. This is a five star stand alone mystery. Reviewers have said you won't be able to put this book down—so get ready.

The library has many books by these authors, so if you like these, there are more to choose from. The library will revive its book sale in August in the multi-purpose room. We will be accepting donations of gently used adult and children's books, DVDs and jigsaw puzzles. Ephesians 1 Prayer Challenge

As Pastor Denny mentioned in his article this month, First Church's devotion to prayer has been very evident during the pandemic! And in response to this increased devotion to prayer, we have been engaging in monthly prayer challenges in order to deepen our collective commitment to prayer! In April we prayed, along with 4 other area churches, for over 1,100 places in Mechanicsburg! In May, we joined thousands of others across our nation in our National Day of Prayer by holding a 24-hour prayer vigil.

Next up is our "Ephesians 1 Prayer Challenge"! Paul's four-part prayer in Ephesians 1 provides a powerful format to personalize and pray for someone. So, in June, think of a person or persons you would like to pray for over 30 days, and use this paraphrased/condensed version from verses 17-21 (or put it into your own words) to pray for them each day:

Page 4

- I am asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ may give (name of person you are praying for) the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that (he/she) may know God better.
- I pray that the eyes of (name's) heart may be enlightened in order that (he/she) may know the hope to which (he/she) is called.
- I pray that (name) may know the riches of God's glorious inheritance in (him/her), and know God's incomparably great power for us who believe... the same power that raised Christ from the dead!
- And I pray that (name) will know Jesus, in whom God placed all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked under, not only now, but also in the time to come. Amen.

Praying this prayer for someone over 30 days will have powerful results! Just imagine if everyone truly knew God in a way that brought deep hope, an understanding of God's power, a knowledge of their worth to God and an abiding relationship with Jesus?

Covered in Love Leader Stepping Down

First Church is blessed to have a Covered in Love group. This international ministry gathers church members to knit or crochet blankets and other items for those who need them. Church member Sandy Bennetch, who was instrumental in launching the group at First Church and has served as its unofficial leader, is stepping down this year after more than a decade.

"I will be forever grateful you followed the call to begin the Covered in Love group," said participant Marge Snyder. "Your leadership and commitment were unshakeable." Marge particularly enjoyed the inspirational readings on knitting that Sandy shared at meetings.

Covered in Love normally meets weekly on Wednesday mornings. A second group called Knit @ Nite was formed for those who are unavailable during the day. This group meets once a month in the evening. The groups combined and began meeting virtually via Zoom when the COVID-19 pandemic started. Participants can create items of their choice, but more often they work together to produce items as requested by our church and the community.

"We have always worked as a team, focusing on projects or needs that are made known to us throughout the year," Sandy said.

Their signature items are prayer shawls and lap blankets for members who are facing surgery or extended

medical care. In addition to providing physical warmth, recipients receive emotional comfort in knowing that the item was created in love and prayed over by our pastors.

The group has produced hundreds of items for multiple ministries. Just to name a few:

- Gifts for Day of Pampering
- Dishcloths and doilies for shut-ins
- Dolls for Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes
- Hats and scarves for the Little Pantry
- Winter hats for New Hope Ministries and Neighborhood Center
- Baby blankets for the Shalom House in Harrisburg
- Scarves for Operation Gratitude (members of the military)

Group members donate the yarn as well as their time and talent. All items are distributed free of charge or donated for charitable purposes such as Little Friends Nursery School's annual auction.

Growing the Glean Team!

This growing season, we are excited to offer the Biblical practice of gleaning in Mechanicsburg! You may already be familiar with the concept of 'gleaning,' perhaps from reading references to gleaning in the Books of Leviticus and Ruth or from taking part in Project Share's opportunity to glean in Carlisle. As depicted in scripture, gleaning occurred when some of the fallen grain during harvest was intentionally left behind, including whole corners of the fields as required by Israelite law. The intention was to offer an unharvested portion of grain for others to collect in helping to feed the poor, the orphans, widows and foreigners, as a safety net and resource to provide for their needs.

We plan to glean some local crops (strawberries and corn for example) to share with our own community! Naomi said to her, 'Go ahead, my daughter, '"* (Ruth 2:2).
