Paul wrote the letter to the Galatians in a time of tension. Leaders in the Galatian churches were suggesting that Gentile believers must become Jewish before they could become followers of Christ. Paul responds with intense emotion, urging the Galatians to reclaim the gospel of grace. Paul encourages them to accept the freedom God has given them in Jesus Christ, to be guided by the Holy Spirit, to live in unity as they "bear one another's burdens," and share the fruit of the Spirit.

This letter is especially relevant for us today as we experience the transformative power of grace and reach more people with the good news of Jesus Christ. During this series, you are encouraged to unite as a church family in reading a chapter of Galatians each week.

- ⇒ **June 5** "Grace That Transforms" Galatians 1 (Holy Communion) **Key Verse**: The one who formerly was persecuting us is now proclaiming the faith he once tried to destroy. (Galatians 1:23)
- ⇒ **June 12** "Grace That Embraces" Galatians 2 **Key Verse:** <sup>10</sup> They asked only one thing, that we remember the poor, which was actually what I was eager to do. (Galatians 2:10)
- ⇒ **June 19** "Grace That Clothes" Galatians 3 **Key Verses**: <sup>27</sup> As many of you as were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. <sup>28</sup> There is no longer Jew or Greek; there is no longer slave or free; there is no longer male and female, for all of you are one in Christ Jesus. (Galatians 3:27-28)
- ⇒ **June 26** "Grace That Forms" Galatians 4 **Key Verse**: <sup>19</sup> My little children, for whom I am again in the pain of childbirth until Christ is formed in you. (Galatians 4:19)
- ⇒ **July 3** "Grace That Bears Fruit" Galatians 5 (Holy Communion) **Key Verses**: <sup>22</sup> By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, <sup>23</sup> gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things. (Galatians 5:22-23)
- ⇒ **July 10** "Grace That Sustains" Galatians 6 **Key Verse** <sup>9</sup> So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up. (Galatians 6:9)

We plan trips following the mentality of Acts 1:8 – going to "Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and the ends of the earth." Over our four-year rotation we venture from Harrisburg (local) to an international experience (ends of the earth). ### **Opening Doors on Jubilee Day, June 16**


