And if you have ever read this newsletter or you know me at all, you will know why I was so drawn to them.

The Coffee Club Mysteries: 6 Whodunits are Brewing in Small-Town Kansas is light fiction-filled with book club ladies, mysteries, and, of course, coffee. Each novella is written by a different author, but they all revolve around Morgan Butler and the Coffee Perk Shop she owns in Oak Grove, Kansas. Oak Grove is very much like Cabot Cove, Maine as dead people keep showing up in this small town, and it is up to a group of coffee drinking book club ladies to solve each mystery. I won't give the plots away, but I will warn you these books might make you crave more coffee—but at least the caffeine will allow you to stay up late reading.

Brunch at the Bittersweet Café by Carla Laureano is the perfect match with the coffee club book. I selected the second book in The Saturday Night Supper Club series because I felt it fit better with a coffee book, but you may want to start with book one aptly titled the Saturday Night Supper Club. Baker and pastry chef Melody Johansson is stuck in a rut, not only in her work, but also in her social life. Her night baking job at a chain bakery doesn't allow her to use her talents as a classically trained French baker and her love life is a disaster AGAIN. Then she meets Justin Keller who arrives at her workplace during a snowstorm, and she thinks this might be a sign that her life is turning around. Justin is in about the same place in his life as Melody. While exploring a relationship, both Melody and Justin are offered their dream jobs, but at opposite sides of the country. Melody wonders if she should keep with her dream of her own bakery or chuck it all and follow the man she has come to love. I think if you like romance, you will love this series.

I just wanted to mention to all of you who loved The Montana Rescue series that Susan May Warren is bringing out a new series called The Montana Marshalls with the first installment due mid-March titled **Knox**. Something to brighten up March!!!

If neither of these books interests you, stop in the library and a volunteer will help you find just the right book—many genres to choose from! Now off for a large latte, maybe a pastry and some quality time with my sewing machine. More next month.

In the Bible, names were more than just a way to identify a person: The name itself revealed something about a person's character. Their name could relate to the circumstances of their birth (Moses means "drawn from the water"); a specific characteristic about the person (Esau means "hairy one"); or a praise to God (Jeremiah means "God is exalted"). A name also said something about a person's destiny (Jesus means "Saviour").

The Old Testament uses more than 85 different names for God. Each name reveals something about God's character, mostly related to a need in people's lives. God's people called on the Lord for provision, peace, healing, forgiveness, strength, hope, victory and so much more. Each name expressed confidence that God can meet every need.


