"Giving It Up For Lent"

One year the people of the Otterbein UMC, Emigsville, where I served just after seminary, decided to make fastnachts as a fund raiser. A fastnacht, in case you've never had one, is a fried donut served on the day before Ash Wednesday, also known as Shrove Tuesday or Fastnacht Day. The tradition of making fastnachts began among German Christians in Europe as a way of emptying their pantries of lard, sugar, fat, and butter before observing a fast from such things during the 40 days of Lent.

That first year we had so many orders for fastnachts that it took the whole church to fill them! Teams started working right after church the Sunday before Fastnacht Day. The kitchen and fellowship hall were busy with people mixing dough, rolling it out, cutting it into rectangular shapes, and frying it in lard. They laid the finished donuts out on tables and covered them with powdered sugar or cinnamon sugar. Night and day they worked right up to Tuesday morning, filling orders and serving walk-ins who lined up out the door of the church.

Fastnacht making became an annual tradition at the Emigsville Church. Every year was more successful than the year before! We not only raised money for some wonderful projects; we also had a lot of fun together. Our friends and neighbors sure loved those fried donuts, lard, sugar, fat, butter and all!

Like our German ancestors who emptied their pantries to sacrifice for Lent, many Christians give up certain things for the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Some abstain from food for a meal or for a day each week, or give up favorite foods or beverages for the whole season. Others let go of watching television or being on social media. Others stop a hurtful habit or behavior.

Giving up things for Lent is a way of remembering the great sacrifice Christ made for us on the cross. It also makes us mindful of those who suffer in the world. Whatever we give up for Lent, the purpose is deeper fellowship with Jesus and our neighbors. What is God calling you to give up for Lent?

In our worship services this Lenten Season, beginning March 1, we're going to focus on the theme, "Giving It Up." Please join us every Sunday as we journey with Jesus, who calls us to lay everything at his feet, so that we might find true freedom!

Unless you are Irish or pretending to be Irish on St. Patrick's Day. So I am tasked with brightening up your reading list. And you know I am always ready for that.

Rachel Hauck's newest book is the **Fifth Avenue Story Society** that is described as a book filled with stories of second chances and hope. Anonymous, mysterious invitations summon five different people to come to the library and write their true stories. Among the five invitees is Lexi Prescott who is dismayed to find her newly ex-husband has been put in charge of the Monday night story time at the old library in their community. Jeff Wilder, her ex, is no more thrilled than she is to be thrown into such close contact with Lexi. None of the five invitees are sure they want to bare their souls to strangers, but something pulls them in, and they struggle to share their hearts and look for their second chance. Loneliness brings them back to the library each week as the bond of friendship and shared stories cocoons them in the healing power of love. You won't be able to put this book down until you unravel each of their stories to the end.

A little adrenaline always lifts the spirits and Lynette Eason has once again brought that skill to her latest book **Collateral Damage**. After the war in the Middle East has raged on for now its nineteenth year, Ms. Eason has brought forward the timely topic of psychological damages many people returning from war are facing. Psychiatrist Brooke Adams has left the Army after an explosion nearly killed her. She has set up

shop to help other veterans with war scars of their own. When Special Ops veteran James Asher, finally admits he needs help to escape his war nightmares, he is assigned to Brooke as a client. When he arrives at her office she isn't there, but a dead body is. After entering the office and falling to pieces in James' arms, Brooke is not sure if she should be his counselor after such an unprofessional start. But James is sure he should be her protector when it is revealed that Brooke was the target of the murderer. Will the two of them find more than healing in their budding friendship? I will not ruin the ending for you by telling you the answer.

These items are then taken to Mission Central where they will be put together with other items and sent to women in poor countries. Endowment Committee Funds Two Staff-Related Projects For 2020

The Endowment Committee has provided financial support for two staff-related projects for 2020:

- An intern to backfill Lisa Aronson’s duties while she is on maternity leave; and,
- A demonstration project designed to test an expansion of worship arts development and practice in the Youth Ministry.

The Youth Ministry intern, Caroline Barsom, is a student at Messiah College. She will be working with us for thirteen weeks under the supervision of Senior Pastor Rev. Dr. Dennis Keller and will benefit from the mentorship of Rev. Dr. Stephen Gallaher, Associate Professor of Christian Ministries at Messiah. In addition, she will be coached by Cheryl Mengle and Lynn Rapp of the Staff-Parish Relations Committee. Caroline has been getting to know our young people and familiarizing herself with FUMC operations as she manages day to day activities and programs in accordance with a detailed set of instructions and schedule information Lisa prepared before her leave. The 15 hours per week, 13 week intern position is supported by a \$1,950 stipend and runs concurrently with Lisa’s maternity leave. The Director of Youth Worship Arts Team Demonstration Project is managed by Allison Ometz who will report to Sarah Pugh. Allison has been doing similar work at a lower level of effort for over a year. The project is a response to the broadening range of worship modality interests FUMC youth have been developing. Elements of youth participation expansion, both under discussion and active, include dance, drama, an increased role in regular worship and, of course, music. The results of the project will drive the decision of whether to include the enhancement in the 2021 FUMC unified budget proposal. Two thousand nine hundred and ten dollars have been granted to fund the project for the 2020 budget year. The Staff-Parish Relations Committee, on behalf of the FUMC congregation, extends thanks to the Endowment Committee for the leadership and support that make these efforts possible.

An Endowment Committee Tax Tip

You may be able to lower your 2020 Income taxes.... And improve your cash flow just by changing how you give, not how much you give. Please read to find out if you can take advantage of this tip!

1. The stock market is near all time highs. Do you own stocks or mutual funds in taxable accounts.. that have gained in value?
 - a. How do I know? If you have declare Dividends and/or Capital Gains on your tax return you own investments that are taxed each year. Non-IRA investments.
 - b. Look at your year end statement.. is the Cost Basis less than the current value?
 - i. If so... you potentially qualify... go to step 2.
2. Do you contribute to the church from your checking account?
 - i. If so... this Tax Tip may be for you.....

The TIP.... Transfer Stock Shares to the church in the amount of your gift instead of taking money out of checking each month. (Call the church office for further assistance).

1. Don't sell the shares. Instead, transfer them direct to the Church.
 - a. If you sell the shares, you have to pay capital gains taxes on the sale
 - b. If you give shares direct to the church, you are credited with the appreciated value as a donation.. the church can then sell the shares and as a non-profit pay no capital gains tax.

Example: If you are giving \$50 per week to the church, that's \$2,600 in a year. If you sell stock you paid \$1,000 for to generate the \$2,600, you will have a realized capital gain of \$1,600 and may increase your income taxes. (Your Tax Advisor can help determine the actual difference in your taxes.) If instead you transfer \$2,600 worth of the stock to the church, you realize no capital gains.

Would you like to make a lifetime difference to church missions? Consider a gift of a highly appreciated stock to the Endowment Fund. We are on track to fund over \$10000 in projects and missions this year alone. Each additional gift allows us to increase the amount available each year.
