Ministry “Bright Spots”

In preparation for the quarterly Administrative Board meeting in February, our church staff compiled a list of "Bright Spots" from the past few months. As you read them, I invite you to join me and celebrate that First Church is alive and active even in a time such as this. We have so much to be thankful for!

- We had a very special Advent season, filled with opportunities that connected us to one another, helped us celebrate Jesus and spread the Good News beyond the walls of the church building!
- Using an innovative approach, this year we coordinated our Service of Remembrance and Hope with Malpezzi Funeral Home online in order to provide comfort to a wider audience. We had 48 unique views and Malpezzi Funeral Home spread the reach of this special service even further than we could have done on our own!
- We held an outdoor Christmas Caroling sing-a-long in the church parking lot and several family groups also went out to carol in the community... all together 100 people participated. This was a very safe and meaningful event!
- This Christmas, we offered a pre-recorded family service with a very special worship "kit," which made it very interactive for children! This service had 181 unique views. In addition, 2 other live streamed services were offered, which had fantastic participation. In all, our worship attendance on Christmas Eve was 1,167!
- A new, prerecorded New Year's Eve service was offered for the first time in 2020. It had 78 unique views, which is great!
- Using Instagram Live as a tool for gathering has proven to be a very effective way to connect with our youth. Since using this, about 25-50 youth have been meeting weekly, in addition to meeting on Sunday evenings for 4G (on Zoom)!
- Sunday School is consistently running strong. We are currently holding 5 classes (on Zoom) and the Guyer class is using their Sunday School materials as devotions for regular study at home. Altogether, 75-85 adults are participating weekly!
- Our men's group has met twice a month all through the pandemic. Whether outside, in garages and on Zoom, this group is going strong and growing in number!
- We launched the Alpha Course (a fantastic evangelistic tool), and it's going great! 1/2 of the group is either from the Mechanicsburg community, or were personally invited by a church member!
- About 50 adults are currently meeting weekly for Bible study, and two new classes are set to start during Lent, which will engage about 25 additional adults in studying God's Word weekly!
- 41 written testimonies were received in January from members of our church family. These were used to create a very special Lenten Devotional! It's a beautiful collection of how God has ABUNDANTLY provided in many different ways during the pandemic!
- About 13 Care Team members are connecting every month or so with about 100 church members, or friends/family of church members, who are sheltering at home during the pandemic. They have delivered newsletters, devotional materials and, in February, treats and homemade Valentines created by the Little Friends Preschoolers!

- We partnered with Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church on Main Street to make soup (using safety protocols), which was served to visitors at their Caring Closet (free adult clothing) on February 13!
- We had a collection for the Little Free Pantry (on the corner of Simpson and High Streets) in January and February to ensure that the pantry had a sufficient amount of items, especially for the winter months. Church members dropped off the items during the collection times in our parking lot on Wednesday afternoons. Great response so far!
- We had a very sweet time with our Rejoicing Spirits community during Advent with both a Fireside Chat and Happy Birthday Jesus Celebration on Zoom!
- Our Little Friends Preschool has had a safe and successful first half of their school year. 50 preschoolers have participated in the program this year!
- Using a conservative “multiplication factor” of 1.5 to calculate *weekly online attendance*, we averaged 394 per week in 2020. For the weeks we were able to hold *in-person worship* last year, our average weekly attendance was 210.
- **FUMC ranked #2** for the number of small groups meeting out of 88 churches reporting in the Susquehanna Conference. Small groups include those meeting for Bible study, Sunday School, fellowship groups, support groups, prayer groups, women’s and men’s groups, music groups, etc. To God be the glory!

As your pastor, reflecting on these "Bright Spots" from just the past few months, I rejoice in your commitment, your generosity, your creativity, and your resilience. I cannot thank God enough for you! Surely in this new year, there will be more "Bright Spots" to celebrate, as *together* we meet the challenges and opportunities of "the Post-Quarantine Church."

Today as I sat down to write this newsletter, I realized I have been writing these articles for over twenty-five years. In that time I have reviewed the weather, mentioned many times I like to drink coffee while reading, and reviewed over a thousand books. I keep wondering if there is any new way I can convince you to read what I am writing about or convince you we are hiding a treasure of Christian fiction a stone's throw from the sanctuary (of course, that is when the church is open). I hope all of you are hoarding these reviews and will surge into the library to get your favorite book once we are all out and about. In that hope, I am skipping the weather report and the coffee analysis and getting right to the books.

For those of you who love Amish fiction and romance, Kathleen Fuller is offering **A Double Dose of Love** in this first installment of the *Amish Mail-Order Brides* series. What makes this a double dose of love is

that the plot revolves around two sets of twins. Each set of twins has one responsible twin trying to contain their less than responsible sibling. Zeke and Zeb Bontrager are starting a new horse farm, while trying to build a ranch house and train a wild colt. Zeb has to contend with Zeke's bad business decisions and hidden debt while keeping their good standing in the Birch Creek Amish community. Meanwhile Darla King travels to Birch Creek Amish Community to answer a newspaper ad for a mail order bride. Amanda, her twin, follows her there, promising their parents she will convince Darla to come home. That is all the clues I am giving you—find out if the head or the heart wins this battle.

Sarah Sundin breaks with the usual trilogy to offer a stand-alone novel **When Twilight Breaks**. Evelyn Brand is trying to buck the male dominated reporting job. Set in Munich in 1838, Evelyn is shocked at the brutality she sees from the Nazis, but she must be careful with her words as reporters can be expelled from Germany if they are too unfriendly to the government. How can she get the word back to the states, yet maintain her standing in Germany? Another American in Germany is Peter Lang who is disillusioned with the state of the world due to the Great Depression. He is impressed with Germany's new prosperity. But when brutality rears its ugly head, Peter uses his contacts in the Party and feeds stories to his friend Evelyn. Can the two make any difference? This is my kind of book--pulse pounding and filled with suspense. Plan to check out this page turner.

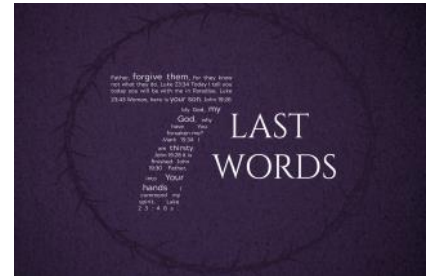

Current Sermon Series — Seven Words: Listening to Christ from the Cross

The pastors of First Church will present a series of sermon messages on the “Seven Last Words” of Jesus during worship services this Lenten season. The messages, based on the book *The Hope of Glory* by Pulitzer Prize winning presidential historian and lifelong Episcopalian layman Jon Meacham, reflect on the gospel accounts of the final words of Jesus during the six hours he suffered on the cross. The “words,” or more accurately statements, of Jesus convey in a powerful way the message of the Savior’s radical love. May we experience anew the depth of his love for us, and discover the meaning of his words for us today.

- **Contact to Care** is a community-based program with the purpose of connecting people to health insurance options and medical care, addressing issues of transportation, language, housing, food, and health literacy when posing as a barrier to accessing healthcare.
