"To Everything There Is a Season": Part 2

In our February newsletter I wrote about seasons. Just as seasons change in the natural world, life moves with ups and downs, joys and sorrows, beginnings and endings. We can't stop seasons from happening, but, with God's help, we can adapt, adjust, and even grow through every season.

In this issue, I want to shift focus to seasons in the life of the church. We are now in the season of Lent, which began with Ash Wednesday and continues for 40 days (not counting Sundays) that lead up to Easter. Lent is a season for deepening our relationship with God. In this newsletter, you will discover numerous opportunities for your spiritual growth during this Lenten Season, like our current sermon series and small group study, "In the Footsteps of Jesus."

While we mark time in the church according to the church seasons, churches also go through seasons that we have no control over. Seasons of gain and loss, birth and death, planting and harvesting. For every church, a new season began in March 2020, with the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Over the past three years, we have all experienced loss. Loss of being able to see one another when we couldn't gather in person. Loss of beloved members of our church family that have died. Loss of attendance at in-person worship and at many programs and activities even after we returned to the building. Loss of members, some of whom have left for other churches. Others who are still connected, but much less active. Loss of staff members who retired or relocated. Last year we even lost the use of our sanctuary for six months after a portion of the ceiling fell!

While reflecting on our experiences of loss, I sometimes reminisce about how things were before this COVID season. But, of course, we can't go back. We couldn't have stopped what the season ushered in by the pandemic brought any more than we can stop the coming of spring! But, as you've shown, we could adapt; we could adjust; and we could even grow through this season together. With God's help and a cooperative spirit, you have been open to change and seized new opportunities.

- You have shown amazing love and care for one another, especially for those who have grieved the loss of loved ones. You have undergirded First Church, its people and its mission in prayer.
- You have welcomed new people warmly. You have extended your reach with online worship, social media, and our church website. You have also offered in-person worship experiences and built relationships in classes, small groups, and other activities throughout the week.
- You have employed new staff members, who have joined your team to support the day-to-day operations of the church and to provide creative leadership for church ministries and outreach.
- You have given generously to support our mission and ministry, and to fund special projects like the beautiful renovation of our sanctuary and the Green Space Project.
- You have made us more visible in the community, supporting our growing Little Friends Preschool, holding events in the new Green Space, keeping the Little Free Pantry stocked, and being involved in mission with your time and talent, and your resources.

Over the past three years, we have experienced more loss than any of us could have imagined. But, I am joyful and hopeful because of all you have accomplished in this most difficult season. I'm with the apostle Paul who could say of you what he wrote to the church in Philippi long ago: I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ. (Philippians 1:6)

From the Library

March always seems dreary to me. There are no major holidays, unless you're Irish. Lent also adds a bit of somberness to the month as we remember Jesus' last days on earth. People with seasonal affective disorder can feel more depressed before spring breaks through. So, I was looking for a feel-good book to buy and write about, and I think I found a great one. You will have to read it, and let me know if I am right.

The book is the debut of author Sharon Mondragon and is titled The Unlikely Yarn of the Dragon Lady. Ms. Mondragon writes what she knows about. She



is the long-time facilitator of her church's prayer shawl ministry and is a knitting instructor at a local yarn shop. In this book, she touches on a problem many churches face — a dwindling congregation and how the pastor handles it. The pastor boots the long-standing knitting group out of the church and tells them to knit in the mall as a way to connect with people and spread God's love in an unlikely place. At first, the women of the Heavenly Hugs Prayer Shawl group are furious at this move and wonder how they can make prayer shawls in such an unholy place. But soon, strangers begin to approach them with their questions or troubles, and a whole new ministry is born. Reviewers say they have laughed, cried and learned so much while reading this book, and they could not put it down. Additionally, there is a pattern for a prayer shawl included and a free Bible study available to be used with the book.

If you like light mysteries without a lot of gore, we have a new series of books donated to us called The Scottish Bakehouse Mysteries. College roommates reunite to open a bakery in Loch Mallaig, Michigan. Their bakery, Bread on Arrival, is in an old Victorian mansion, which gives customers the desire to sit for a spell, sip tea, nibble on shortbread and talk about the latest mysteries of the town. When not baking, these fifty-year-old women solve murders, setting out on new adventures and proving it is never too late to begin again. Though the books are numbered, you don't need to read them in order. Though I am more a coffee drinker than a sipper of tea, learning about Scottish treats calls to me.

If neither of these books interests you, stop in the library and let one of our volunteers help you find just the right book for you!

For 30 years, First Church has performed a Passion Play where children, youth and adults share the story of Jesus leading up to his death and resurrection. After a three-year hiatus, we are happy to announce that we will be carrying on this beloved tradition in a new way! 
The Handbell Choir will once again sell subs and pretzel sandwiches that will be delivered on Palm Sunday. Be sure to order yours from a choir member!

Little Free Pantry and Little Friends


