From the Library

I hope I am writing about the merry month of May, but in-home quarantine during all of April and most of March, has left me wary about how merry May will be. But I am seeing May as the light at the end of the tunnel! I have been buying and receiving during this time, and I hope I will be in the library checking them out to you very soon. Let me tell you about a couple of the new books, and then you can come into the library in May to find the rest of the treasure.

If you know me in the least, you know I love a good mystery and Lisa Harris is a writer who delivers on her promise of lots of suspense with a little bit of romance mixed in. Traitor's Pawn finds main character, FBI Jack Shannon, in Corpus Christi, Texas trying to find out who is selling secrets to the Chinese. While he is there, a senator is shot and his companion is abducted. Aubrey Grayson, the abductee, just so happens to be a woman Jack was once in love with, so he joins the hunt to find and save her. During the investigation it becomes clear the senator was not the intended victim and that Aubrey may be entangled in Jack's original case. But how? Can Jack figure this out and save Aubrey, or will he end up finding her only to arrest her? I will not spoil this ending. This is a page turner waiting for you! I know everyone doesn't like as much adrenaline in their books as I do, and readers have been asking for some historical fiction books so I purchased a trilogy by Sarah Sudin, who is new to our library but well known in this genre. The series Sunrise at Normandy includes The Sea before Us, The Sky above Us, and The Land beneath Us. Each book revolves around a Paxton brother and his life in a different arm of the military. Wyatt serves in the Navy, Adler serves in the Army Air Corp, and Clay serves in the Army Rangers. Each man has a job to do and leaves a woman waiting and praying for his safe return. You might say, "Ho and Hum - more World War II stories and we all know how it ends", but what drew me to this series is Ms. Sudin is known for historical accuracy, and she builds her story on her characters' strength of faith and finding comfort in small things. This might be just what we need in our own turbulent times. I also admire her wanting to confront the struggle of why bad things happen to good people. Many people wrestle with that. And if all that isn't a reason to read this series, the clincher is my big sister said it was a good read. Try it; you might like it, also.

If none of these books feels like a good fit for you, stop in the library and check out all the other new books or let a volunteer help you find just the right book.

<u>Registration Reassurance</u> - We are deeply sensitive to the fact that families are wondering if they will lose their deposit and registration fee if they register now and the summer camp event is cancelled or participation prohibited due to COVID 19 restrictions. You will not. The only cost to a family would be if there is a card transaction by a service provider. In fact, we invite families to sign up for camp now, but not pay any camp fees until after June 1, 2020 if that is preferable for you. Our standard cancellation policy for reasons outside of COVID-19 remains in effect.

<u>Camper Scholarship Fund</u> - It remains our desire that all children and youth be able to attend camp and retreat events, regardless of their ability to pay. FINANCIAL REPORT

Federally Funded Loan Received

With the approval of our Administrative Board, our church has applied for and received a federally funded loan through the Payroll Protection Plan. Since we are not holding on site services, our giving is down. This loan bridges the gap in a time of national crisis, when the ministry of our church is now needed more than ever. Food Collection Update

Pastor Layne Lebo at Mechanicsburg Brethren in Christ is very thankful to everyone who has contributed to the food collection for families in the Mechanicsburg School District. Dr. Leidy from Mechanicsburg School District reported that the school has distributed 25,000 meals over the past month. Pastor Layne reports that they are seeing an average of 60 to 65 people dropping off food donations at McBic each Wednesday, enabling them to contribute 300 food packs each week. Thanks to everyone who has contributed to this effort! They are halting the collection, as of April 29, but watch for other ways to support our neighbors in need.
