"The Return"

We are returning. We are returning to classrooms and workplaces, stores and restaurants, athletic fields and theaters. Many of us are still going to school virtually, working from home, and shopping online, but we see hopeful signs. We are still wearing masks, washing our hands, maintaining safe distances, but more of us are taking slow, cautious, gradual steps toward "postquarantine."

More of us are returning to church, too. We are offering a variety of online and in person experiences for worship and other activities. Slowly in person worship attendance is increasing. Easter Sunday we added an 11:00 modernstyle worship service, The Gathering, to our 8:15 Foundation Service. Gradually, more groups and activities will begin returning to the church building. At the same time, we are planning to expand our outreach online. We are committed to welcoming you where you are, in ways that are best for you. Not just in worship, but in every aspect of our church life.

During the month of May, I'm planning a four-part sermon series on one of Jesus' most beloved stories, "The Parable of the Prodigal Son." It's a story about "a father who had two sons" (Luke 15:11). It is also your story and mine. Several weeks ago I attended the Christian Fellowship Sunday School class via Zoom. Our teacher asked, "Where do you see yourself in this parable?" The more I meditate on this parable the more I see myself in all of the characters. As the late devotional writer Henri Nouwen said of this parable, "All of the Gospel is there. All of my life is there. All of the lives of my friends is there" (The Return of the Prodigal Son, p.14)

When it comes to returning to church and other activities, each of us is at a different place right now. That's okay. But there is this one thing we all have in common. We all have a Father who loves us, who meets us where we are, and who welcomes us home. The most important return any of us can make is when we respond to God's gracious invitation and seek to become like God in the way we welcome others.

I am taking a deep breath and enjoying spring to the fullest. Yesterday I weeded my flower bed and today I shopped at Patti Noggle's Nursery and seriously resisted buying one of each beautiful flower Patti has. So now I am tied in my chair and chomping at the bit to be back outside. The only reason I am at the computer on this gorgeous day is I have a stack of new books by my chair that I really need to tell you about. I now struggle with the problem to review just a couple; as Gilda Radner is known for saying, "It's always something!"

In our library is the always popular Irene Hannon. Not only does she write page-turning mysteries, but also insightful romances. **Blackberry Beach** sounds like a romance we could all enjoy today on the porch with our large iced tea, right? If you follow Christian fiction, you know that almost all the series are three or four books, but Ms. Hannon is breaking the mold making **Blackberry Beach** the seventh in her *Hope Harbor series*. Katherine Parker is a woman who has it all, but neither fame nor money has made her happy. She comes to the Oregon coast hoping to figure out what will make her happy. Her neighbor, Zach Garrett, the local coffee shop owner (does it get any better than that?), is struggling to get over his own traumatic loss. Neither has romance on their minds, but when they are recruited to volunteer in a rehab home for foster children, sparks begin to fly. Reviewers have said this is a down to earth romance with plausible people and a sub plot that adds to the overall story. See what you think!

New to our library is mystery writer Elizabeth Goddard. **Present Danger** is the first book in the *Rocky Mountain Courage series*. Former FBI Special Agent and now Detective, Jack Tanner is in Montana during a search and rescue mission, when he finds a body in the national forest. He is determined to find the killer, but that will mean working with former girlfriend, Terra Connors, who is a US Forest Service Special Agent. The victim is tied to a powerful and menacing trafficker of archaeological artifacts and this could be an extremely dangerous case. But Jack is determined to find the killer and protect Terra no matter what. Both come to this case wounded by the past and carrying personal baggage, but can they live to solve the case and maybe trust each other again? I will warn you; many reviewers have mentioned late night finishes. After you check out this author, let me know if I should order book two due out in November. Be a Part of the Glean Team!

This growing season, we are excited to offer the Biblical practice of gleaning in Mechanicsburg! You may already be familiar with the concept of 'gleaning,' perhaps from reading references to gleaning in the books of Leviticus and Ruth or from taking part in Project Share's opportunity to glean in Carlisle. As depicted in scripture, gleaning occurred when some of the fallen grain during harvest was intentionally left behind,

including whole corners of the fields as required by Israelite law. The intention was to offer an unharvested portion of grain for others to collect in helping to feed the poor, the orphans, widows and foreigners, as a safety net and resource to provide for their needs.

We plan to glean some local crops (strawberries and corn for example) to share with our own community! To read more about gleaning in Biblical times, turn to the book of Ruth where Ruth was able to glean the fields of Boaz to sustain herself and her mother-in-law, Naomi: "And Ruth the Moabite said to Naomi, 'Let me go to the fields and pick up the leftover grain behind anyone in whose eyes I find favor.' Naomi said to her, 'Go ahead, my daughter,'" (Ruth 2:2).

- Contact to Care is a community-based program with the purpose of connecting people to health insurance options and medical care, addressing issues of transportation, language, housing, food, and health literacy when posing as a barrier to accessing healthcare. 
