Opening Doors with Christ, One Another and Our Neighbors

"Consecrated, Lord, to Thee"

Each year in the fall we celebrate how God is at work in and through the Ministry and Mission of our church. We also invite our members and friends to *consecrate* a portion of their income for the Lord's work in the coming year. This year *Consecration Sunday is November 15*.

"Consecration" is not a word that we commonly use in our everyday language. However, it is still filled with meaning for us as followers of Jesus. To consecrate means, "to make or declare something sacred," or "to dedicate somebody or something to God."

Long ago, our mothers and fathers in the faith *consecrated* our church building as a sacred space. They declared that the sanctuary was to be set apart to glorify God in worship. The classrooms and fellowship hall, the offices and multipurpose room, even the parking lots were *consecrated* as sacred spaces where each generation could grow in faith and fellowship and service for Christ.

Whenever we celebrate Holy Communion, we say a prayer to *consecrate* the elements. *This* bread and *this* cup do not just nourish our bodies and quench our thirsts. They are sacred gifts that convey the grace of God freely given to all in Jesus Christ. As we partake of the *consecrated* elements, we experience the love of Christ, whose body was broken and blood was shed for our salvation.

This year, with the pandemic, we have experienced firsthand that the church is not a building; it's a people. The apostle Paul reminds us that, as followers of Jesus, we, too, have been *consecrated*. "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God-what is good and acceptable and perfect." (Romans 12:2). We are set apart in this world. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, our lives are transformed to reflect the love of Jesus.

A great hymn of our faith expresses the same message, "Take my life and let it be, *consecrated*, Lord, to thee." The hymn continues, "Take my moments and my days...take my hands...take my feet...take my voice...take my lips...take my silver and my gold...take my intellect...take my will...take my heart...take my love...take myself..." To ask God to *consecrate* our lives is to dedicate all that we are and all that we have in ways that honor God.

So, on **Consecration Sunday**, November 15, each of us is asked to consider, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to *consecrate*?" Some of us may worship in person, either at 8:15 a.m. in the sanctuary or 4:00 p.m. in the parking lot. Others may worship online from home. All of us will be invited to *consecrate* an amount, with 10% as our goal, to support God's work of "Opening Doors with Christ, one another, and our neighbors" in 2021. We offer not just our money, but our whole lives, trusting that God will *consecrate* what we give and, in God's faithful hands, use it to produce abundantly!

I cannot thank God enough for your generous giving, and look forward to all that God has in store for us as we continue in ministry together in 2021!

Email and Text Scam-Alert

In response to receiving an email or text message from someone you know and trust from First Church (including recent incidents involving Pastor Denny's list of contacts), our first reaction is to open the text or email and respond. We would like to caution you, however, to be alert for a message that seems 'suspicious' or does not sound like something the sender would typically say, or ask you to do.

- If you receive emails, text messages, or Facebook posts from First Church staff or friends asking you for money, or asking you to purchase Walmart or Amazon gift cards etc., this is most certainly a scam.
- There is no way to stop this kind of scammer, so we caution you to look twice to check the email address or phone contact, which typically will be different from the email or number you have in your personal contacts.
- When in doubt, please do not respond by replying to the text/email that you received.
- Try calling or emailing the individual directly from your contact list to determine if they are truly trying to reach you.

From the Library

With fall in full swing now, it's time to hunker down with a good book and a hot latte. And as always, I have some great books to escape into and ignore the outside world.

Irene Hannon, a perennial favorite here in the library, has started a new series. Book one of her new *Triple Threat series* is **Point of Danger**. Eve Rielly is a controversial talk radio show host and while many of her listeners don't always agree with her point of view, up until now all they have thrown at her are verbal jabs. All of a sudden someone has taken it to the next level by leaving a fake bomb accompanied by a threating note to be silent or ELSE. Brent Lange is the detective on the case, and he becomes increasingly concerned about Eve as the threats and harassment escalate. A sub plot in the book exposes a talk show

want-to-be who would like Eve's job. Could she be the instigator of the harassment or is it someone more sinister? Ms. Hannon is known for great character development, and again she fleshes out Eve's character by introducing her two sisters and getting the family back story. Play close attention to the two sisters as I am guessing they will be the main characters of the next two books in the series. This is a very twisty and suspenseful novel that will keep you up way past your bedtime. You won't need another latte to stay awake for this book.

Another favorite, Denise Hunter, is wrapping up her *Bluebell Inn series* and the saga of the Bennett family with book number three, **Autumn Skies**. The last of the Bennett siblings, Grace, has longed to strike out on her own while still helping the family run the inn. She decides to open an outfitters business that will not only cater to the inn's guests but other tourists as well. Her plan is coming to fruition, but she is feeling a little lonely with the departure of her siblings. That is until tall, dark, and handsome Wyatt Jennings walks into the lobby. Wyatt comes with more baggage than his suitcase can hold. He is on mandatory leave from the Secret Service due a slowly healing gunshot wound. With work not consuming his thoughts and actions, Wyatt realizes he has to come to grips with the tragedy he endured fourteen years ago. After the political world, Grace is like a breath of fresh air to Wyatt, and they soon bond and begin to share their stories with each other. But will the past pull them together or push them apart? (I'll give you a hint. Ms. Hunter says she always likes to end her books with a sigh of contentment. Let's see if she does that this time.)

With each month that passes, I keep hoping I will soon see all your smiling faces in the library. Fingers crossed for this month. Or you can contact Donna or Pam if you want to visit the library privately.

Our year to date actual expenses continue to be less than planned as the church staff is working hard to reduce discretionary spending to help keep our financial position in good shape. We are grateful to be holding inperson services with the appropriate safeguards in place according to guidelines. We area also continuing our Sunday services online. In September, giving continues to run behind an average weekly budget by \$1,000-\$2,000 per week. We appreciate all the support for our church during this difficult time and are thankful for those who have been able to continue in prayer and financial support of our ministry. If you cannot join us for in-person services, we hope you will consider mailing your contributions to the church office or utilizing electronic giving. Annual Sleep Out For The Homeless

If there was to be a motto for this fall within the youth ministry it might be "let's not cancel it, let's reimagine it." The Covid realities of the world have made doing our ministry events in a typical fashion a bit of a challenge and the annual Sleep Out for the Homeless is no exception.

As we reimagined the Sleep Out our three main goals were to: One, raise money for the agencies that serve those in homeless situations. Two, equip students with an awareness of the realities of homelessness. Three, create a fun and engaging space for our students to gathering in a safe way. So what has become of this years Sleep Out?

In partnership with McBic we are taking our fundraising online (cash and check donations will still be accepted) and moving an in person gathering to their property. Students will be challenge to extend homeless awareness online and share the donation link for our online fundraising (which will be made available in early November). Money raised will not only help agencies like New Hope, Family Promise, and Bethesda Mission, but also unlock different features to our in person student event. \$200 might unlock the campfire, \$1000 might unlock the soup kitchen, and \$5000 might unlock some crazy, fun and exciting event for the evening.

This collaborate effort of collecting will unlock an evening of fun and learning. In addition, participants' individual entry to the event will be much needed pantry items. The items they will be challenged to bring will correspond to pre-event education mailings that offer each participant a persona, life challenges, and needed items for someone encountering situations surrounding homelessness.
