"For All the Saints"

A couple of weeks ago my Betsy and I watched the Mechanicsburg Halloween Parade as it passed by our church. In addition to enjoying a great hot dog with chili prepared by members of our Bell Choir, I was reminded of two things about our community that night.

For one thing, we have a lot of children! I didn't count, but with sports teams and cheerleading squads, dance groups and Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, marching bands and floats, not to mention the children lining the streets to watch the parade, there must have been hundreds of kids! Watching them pass by in their costumes and dash into the street for candy, I couldn't help but wonder. With so many activities competing for their time, how many of these children and their families know Jesus? How many of them are part of a loving church community like ours? Our ministries with children and their families are so important. How might God be calling you to be involved?

The parade also reminded me what a big deal Halloween is in our culture. We love carving pumpkins and decorating, buckets of candy from trick-ortreat and happy children dressed in costumes in parades. We love celebrating Halloween, but our culture pays little attention to the holiday that comes the day after Halloween. All Saints Day has far more significance for us as followers of Jesus that All Hallows Eve does. On All Saints Day we celebrate who we are in Christ.

Most likely there are few, if any of us would call ourselves saints. The people we most often think of as saints lived lives of extraordinary faith and obedience to God. We call Jesus' first disciples and the writers of the four Gospels saints. We call Mary, the mother of Jesus a saint. We also call the Apostle Paul and Stephen, the first Christian martyr, saints. We think of Saint Augustine and Saint Francis of Assisi and Saint Teresa of Calcutta as saints. We celebrate the lives of "the great cloud of witnesses" who have gone before us!

On All Saints Day we also celebrate another, older understanding of saints. In the New Testament, all baptized Christians are called saints. We are all saints, not because we are perfect, but because we belong to Christ and we are part of his family. As responsible members of his family, we are called to be holy in our daily lives.

In our worship services on November 7 we will celebrate All Saints Sunday. We will remember and give thanks for the saints from our church family that have gone before us in the past year. In their lives we have experienced God's love. We also remember that we are part of "the communion of the saints." We are connected to our sisters and brothers in Christ in every time and every place. The festivities surrounding Halloween can be fun, but let's not forget who we are in Christ. Saints, you have been set apart to share his love, with the children and families of our community and in your daily life!







Suzanne Woods Fisher is one of the library's favorite Amish writers, and she brings her gift to her latest book, **A Season on the Wind**.
