10:45 Convergent Worship Service Starts October 1

When you worship, what kind of music do you like to sing?

If I were to ask that question to a cross-section of people here at First Church, it's likely I would get a number of different answers.

There are many factors that determine the kind of music you like to sing in worship, like your denomination or ethnic background. But the most important single factor in determining the hymns you like is the year you were born. We tend to "bond" to music, both sacred and secular, between age sixteen and twenty-four.

If you were born before 1960, like I was, it's likely you "bonded" with the great classic hymns and old gospel songs accompanied by a pipe organ or a piano and music offered by robed choirs.

If you were born after 1960, you may prefer one of the three or four generations of newer Christian music often referred to as "praise and worship" or "contemporary."

Numerous studies have shown that congregations that are intentional about providing worship experiences for every age group are far more likely to reach young adults and to be healthy and strong.

In June, a Worship Enrichment Team (WE Team) was formed. (The names of team members are listed below). Their purpose was to evaluate our 10:45 service and to discern God's direction for its future. The team identified the strengths and weaknesses of 10:45, prayed and studied, conferred with our program and music staff, and visited other churches. As a result, they envisioned a new service that will begin October 1 at 10:45 and will be consistent from week to week.

8:15 and 10:45 will have the same scripture and sermon, incorporate prayer, offering and Sacraments, and communicate things appropriate to the whole church, the style of each service will be unique.

Our 8:15 service will offer the same traditional style that has been the foundation of our worship life for many years. To distinguish it from the later service, it will be called "Foundation".

Our new, 10:45 service will bring together classic hymns, gospel songs, and older and newer praise and worship songs led by our praise team and choirs. There will be musical offerings from the sanctuary choir, the bell choirs, children and youth and other worship arts. This service will be called "Convergent," which means "coming closer together." It's based on I Corinthians 12:4-7, where we are called to offer 'different gifts, different activities, but the same Spirit.'

I am grateful for the faithful work of our WE Team and for our music and program staff. The WE Team will continue to evaluate the service and to make changes as needed. It's members are: Bob Bittenbender, John Bowen, Jenny Dose, Barry Eaton, Jason Fisher, Dave Florey, Juanita Guise, Anna Harris, Rick Herring, Dennis Keller, Lynn Rapp, Mark Routch (chair.), and Michelle Spencer.

#### Change for Water ~ Located at the Sierra Leone Display in the Tower Hallway

Help support the Sierra Leone Well Drilling Project by dropping your pennies, or any loose change, into the *Change for Water* Bucket. One hundred percent (100%) of your donations are used to provide training and dig wells that supply safe drinking water for schools and communities in Sierra Leone. There were 650 pennies contributed this past month for a total to date of \$12,853.46.

Thank you to all who have contributed to the disaster relief for Sierra Leone. While our attention has turned to relief for disasters closer to home, Sierra Leone continues to struggle. The scope of the effect of the mudslide goes beyond loss of lives, homes and belongings, as if that is not enough. Wells that once provided safe drinking water have been contaminated and new wells will need to be dug.

The Change for Water (previously Penny Fund) collection at the Sierra Leone display table is a way you can continue to support the relief efforts. Just drop your loose change or even bills into the bucket. The money is sent to the Sierra Leone Initiative of the Susquehanna Conference and from there it is sent to Sierra Leone, designated specifically for well drilling.

Please don't let the well run dry.

#### Sierra Leone Mission Trip Update

As you know, we started our letter writing campaign – "Connecting to Calvary", to get our First Church congregation to connect with the Calvary Church congregation in Taiama. We want to thank all the children, youth and adult members that have already filled the SL mailbox with letters, prayers and photos. The deadline to mail your envelope is Sunday, October 8th. If you haven't already composed a letter but want to, please take an envelope off the Sierra Leone Table in the Main Entrance hallway. Instructions, fun facts and a photo are included.

We will be taking the mail with us to Calvary in Taiama, Sierra Leone on our November 2nd -11th mission trip. We are sure the love and prayers shared in those letters will give our brothers and sisters in Christ hope. And assure them that we care about and pray for them, even with the many miles between us J.

A big thank you to the Covered in Love ministry for doing such a great job in knitting cute hats for the boys and girls at Calvary. And thank you to the Martha Circle and other church members who are making t-shirt dresses for the girls! We are excited and looking forward to praying and connecting again with our brothers and sisters in Christ in Taiama.

The mission team would also like to thank everyone for their purchases, donations at our UMW yard sale spot in August. All proceeds are going to fund our mission trip to Calvary UMC, Taiama, Sierra Leone on November 2nd thru November 11th.

Once we return, we will be having a presentation about our mission trip during the Sunday School hour on Sunday, December 10th. Hope to see you there!

Last but certainly not least, thank you for your continued prayers for traveling mercies, our safe travel there and back, and for all the lives we will touch, and will touch us, along the way.

# August: preparing for Roma, Italia

# Every student. Every campus. Every nation.

Over the next year, I will take part in cru's global mission of seeing every student on every campus presented with the chance to follow Jesus, in every nation.

As I am now fully supported and I praise the Lord for his provision, I welcome all the new additions to my mailing list! I'm stoked you're here on this journey with me to Rome, welcome!

August was a month of finishing my financial support team (praise God!!!) and preparation because on September 1st I make the move to Rome. WHAT?! First, I am so thankful that I've gotten to see so many of you in the Mechanicsburg area. The dessert my parents hosted was a blast, and blew me away in celebrating my first year of ministry. [Thanks again mom & dad!] As I look to this year, I can't help but anticipate how God will move!

For the middle 10 days of the month, I got to attend a fellow Miami alum and sweet friends' wedding, had a 6 day training for moving overseas, and then had 3 days to visit many friends that I'll miss dearly over the year. What a gift it was to have this time.

This month, when I stopped by Miami I was motivated and surprised once again to hear the need in western Europe from an outside perspective:

"When I first heard that cru went to Italy, a catholic country and home of the vatican, I was sort of offended. Then, I studied abroad in Italy this summer and was shocked and sad to learn that their faith is dead, hardly anyone believes and it is an identity based on culture and traditions, not faith- they need to hear truth and have Christian friends."

#### STINT (Short Term INTernational) training:

At training, we covered things like: safety, team unity, cru's mission, ministry specifics in western Europe and I got to meet my 2 new roommates that are going to Rome. Meet Savannah and Kassey: They are from South Carolina and Alabama, and are 2017 Ole Miss graduates. We will take our transatlantic flight together on the 1st, and do most of our lives together this year.

#### How to reach me starting September 1:

Facebook messenger will work the same & is free.

iPhone: I will have a new Italian number upon arriving, but will be able to communicate via iMessage, FaceTime and FaceTime audio if you are an iPhone user. The first time you message me will have to be via email, or Facebook, and then I can share my Italian number. (This is free on WiFi) I will most likely not receive your messages to my American number after September 2nd.

WhatsApp is a free texting, calling and video call app that will be my primary mode of connecting with both Italians, and friends at home. You can download this in the app store, and will use my Italian number to contact me once I am there (Free with wifi- use FB messenger or email to get this number)

Email will work the same.

Mail: although mail is not as efficient in Rome as in the US. I welcome (and would love) the attempt of mail and packages! :) To send letters or postcards, it takes1 international stamp. Just ask for my address!

Dear First United Methodist Church of Mechanicsburg,

Every time I think of you, I give thanks to my God. Whenever I pray, I make my requests for all of you with joy, for you have been my partners in spreading the Good News about Christ from the time you first heard it until now.

Philippians 1:3-5 (NLT)

As I (Matt) was about to graduate from West Chester in the spring of 2015, I was wrestling with two things: do I go into the workforce, or do I go into ministry with Cru? What I wanted to do? Ministry. But my fears of raising financial support were so great that I decided not to. I got a good job with a marketing firm, and LeeAnn and I planned to move to Los Angeles after we got married where I would work for the firm while she was on staff with Cru at a local campus.

However, throughout our engagement LeeAnn encouraged me to leave my job and join staff with Cru alongside her. I thought it was too much of a risk to take. But deep down, that's what I wanted. With my fears of raising support right in front of me, God gave me the grace to quit my job and begin raising support with my new bride.

Fast forward to today. The average amount of time it takes a long-term Cru staff member to raise their initial support in order to report to campus is 12-18 months. Between the 3 months last summer that we raised support for our intern year, and the 1 ½ months that we've raised support since we've been home from our training in Colorado, we are humbled and grateful to say that we will be reporting to campus starting next week!



With time flying, I guess I better get right to the heart of this newsletter article.

October has always been mystery month in the library, but I have news that can't wait till November. Jan Karon is taking us back to Mitford in her latest book **To Be Where You Are**. After 12 years of wrestling with the conflicts of being retired, Father Tim decides he really is ready for retirement, and he doesn't need a steady job—but God has a surprise for him. When **Come Rain or Come Shine** ended, Lace and Dooley were just married and had become new parents to an orphan named Jack. Dooley had begun his vet practice and everyone was bursting with happiness. Now there is a crisis on the farm impacting not only their home life but the practice. Before Nikki can even say "Honey, I'm home," she is off and chasing the frightened woman, trying to find her before the not-so-good guys do. By the time you finish these three books, there will be the fourth in the series on the shelf—**Vanished**. This author was brought to me by Evelyn Fennel, and if you have a book or author you would like to suggest for the library, please let any of the staff know, and we will try to get it.




