That trend has changed during this summer and we now are experiencing a small shortfall. Income is typically lowest during the third quarter of the year so this is not surprising.

\$20,000 from the General Fund and \$3,015 from the Building Fund has been paid on the debt thus far in 2017. An interest payment of \$1,508 was made during July.

#### Recap of Allport-Bigler-Woodland Workcamp

Once again this summer, I was blessed to be able to take part in the Volunteers in Mission (VIM) workcamp to the three Clearfield County towns of Allport, Bigler and Woodland. Led by Pastor Jeff Fisher of Calvary UMC in Harrisburg, the group of volunteers worked on about 20 homes doing repairs and improvement projects during the period of Sunday, June 18<sup>th</sup> through Friday, June 24<sup>th</sup> assisting elderly and low income members of the communities. Most of us from out of the area stayed at Lake Street UMC in Woodland, while others stayed at the nearby Woodland Campground. There are a number of small UMC congregations in the area, and they all work together to provide food for our nourishment during the workcamp. Morning and evening meals were prepared and served (buffet style) by some of the women from Lake Street UMC, and we "brown bagged" our lunches at the various worksites.

The biggest project worked on during the week was a 12' by 36' deck along with a 24' ramp being built for a 50-year old woman (and her family) who had recently been diagnosed with MS. As you might imagine, lots of folks (but not me) were fully engaged on that project. I spent most of my days working on the home of an 87-year old woman named Shirley, where we tore off and replaced a 10' by 12' section of her roof, fixed a number of rain gutter issues, replaced a rotting window sill, installed about 36' of new aluminum fascia along one side of her home, weeded her flower beds, and did some exterior painting. Shirley's husband died when she was 52, so she has been taking care of her home by herself for the last 35 years. When Shirley told me she could do plumbing, electrical, and carpentry work, I replied that she ought to be part of our workcamp team! Unfortunately, she has arthritis in her hip and needs to use a cane when walking, which really limits her mobility. I did notice that she was still able to get on her riding tractor and mow over an acre of her yard while we were there, and also clean out/straighten up her garage. Wow! It was a joy to sit down and talk with her about her life and her faith. I could really sense her pride in keeping her humble home maintained these many years, and she was so appreciative of our efforts to accomplish some things around her home that she is no longer able to get done. In addition, I helped install some additional electrical circuits in the fellowship hall at Lake Street UMC so that breakers don't get tripped every time a bunch of crockpots and roasters get plugged in for church meal gatherings.

I love being part of this workcamp, which was being held for the 6<sup>th</sup> time this summer. Mike Ogden invited me to go the first year as Mike is originally from Clearfield and wanted to "give back" to his old communities. What a blessing it has turned into for me. I so look forward to going back each summer, renewing acquaintances with other persons on the workcamp team and the folks from Lake Street UMC. Like Shirley this year, I have always found the people whose homes we work on to be most appreciative of our efforts. It takes a lot of faith to open your doors to a group of strangers, not knowing if they have the requisite skillset to accomplish the needed repairs. As the old saying goes, "God doesn't call the equipped; He equips those that are called!" So won't you consider joining me next June for the 7<sup>th</sup> annual workcamp? I'm sure you'll be blessed by the experience!

I still think of September as back to school month, even though most schools start in August now. With fond memories of back to school and days gone by, I have the perfect book for you.

Rachel Hauck has been using dual time periods in several of her recent books to connect women from different eras. Her newest book **The Writing Desk** is reminiscent of days gone by when ladies sat at their writing desks with their flowery stationery and answered their correspondence. 
