On Sunday, July 15, Dave Florey, chair of our Staff-Parish Relations Committee, announced that effective August 15, Jody Brinley was stepping down as our Director of Music. Jody served First Church for nine years and enriched our worship by directing our Sanctuary Choir and coordinating our music ministry. On Sunday, August 5, we celebrated Jody's ministry at the 8:15 service and at a fellowship time between services.

As we look to the future, representatives from our Staff-Parish Relations Committee, our church staff, and youth and adults leaders have been meeting with Dr. Douglas Curry, Director of Worship Arts at Messiah College. He has been guiding us through a process to develop a new position to direct the worship arts at First Church. In July, the Staff-Parish Relations Committee approved a job description for a Director of Worship Arts. This position will be recommended to our Finance Committee and Administrative Board in the near future.

We will keep you informed as we work out the details for this new position. As a congregation we are so very blessed with adults, children and youth who are gifted in worship arts, including music, dance, drama, and the use of media. The group of 25 people that has been involved in this process is very excited about how the leadership of a Director of Worship Arts will enhance our worship at 8:15, 10:45, and other special services.

As we continue the process of developing this position and searching for a Worship Arts Director, I am glad to report that our excellent music ministry will continue.

At the 8:15 service, Frank Heberlig will serve as organist. Flossie Ryder will direct Sounds of Worship, with Karen Philp as their accompanist.

At the 10:45 service, Trace Morgan and Allison Ometz will lead our Praise Team. This past week, the Staff Parish Committee asked Allison to serve as our interim director of Sanctuary Choir. We are still looking for an accompanist for the choir. If you have any recommendations, please see Allison.

Kathie Bittenbender will lead our bell ministry for adults and children.

Our Youth Praise Band will support our Sunday night youth gatherings, and will also be involved in Sunday morning worship as well. Our children will participate in Worship Arts during Wonderful Wednesday, which begins in October. They will offer choral music, dance, and drama in worship.

We all come to worship to bless God, to serve God, to praise God. I am asking for your support as we offer our best to God in worship. Please pray for those who currently lead and serve in our worship services, and for those discerning our next steps toward a new Director of Worship Arts. If you feel called to join one of our choirs, to serve on our praise team, to operate sound and media, or to serve in other ways, please reach out to me or Pastor John or a member of our staff.

It's such a joy to worship with you in this wonderfully gifted congregation!

Fall Bible Studies

If this were my first book report of the school year, I'd go back to last month's article as I think those two books (Called to Protect and Auschwitz Lullaby) inspired me so much that the newsletter almost wrote itself. Well, time to quit staring out the window, and tell you about some other inspiring reads.

It is often said that history repeats itself, and I often find books repeat the same theme—the story is just adjusted to a new time and place. **The Hope Jar** by Wanda Brunstetter is such a story. Michelle Taylor is homeless and hopeless, until the elderly Lapp family of Lancaster County mistakenly identifies her as their long-lost granddaughter. Even though Michelle knows it's wrong to deceive these wonderful people, she is feeling secure and loved for the first time in a long time. As she debates about how to get out of this lie, she discovers a blue jar in the barn filled with slips of papers containing prayers, quotes and inspirations to her budding faith. Of course, I won't spoil the plot by telling you how she reveals to her new family she really isn't their granddaughter.

If you haven't been in the library lately, you may have missed the book **Tear Soup**, brought to us by Janice Bowen, the Director of Congressional Care Ministry. It's a book about grief that is appropriate for all ages. It explains that grief is a normal part of life, and everyone grieves in different ways and for different lengths of time. When you first look at the book, it looks like it is for children, but it can comfort anyone. Another plus to this book has a directory in the back of the book of where to get help for all ages. You might want to have a look at this book before you need it as a resource or need it as a comfort gift to a grieving family.

Lastly, the library would like to thank everyone who donated books or purchased books from our annual book sale. Through these books sales the library is almost self-sustaining and we owe it all to you. THANK YOU!!

StrongWomen/Growing Stronger Strength Training Program

First United Methodist Church in Mechanicsburg and Penn State Extension will be teaming up again to offer the **StrongWomen/Growing Stronger Program** this fall.
