Change in Sunday Morning Schedule Begins Sunday, September 19

We have certainly been blessed these past several months to resume offering multiple worship services that are God-glorifying and well-attended, despite the obstacles that Covid-19 has presented! What's more is that, even in this summer vacation season, attendance at both services has continued to grow. Each week we welcome new persons to worship along with familiar faces returning in person. At the same time, our online worship attendance remains strong!

Based on feedback from our congregation, and after prayerful consideration among staff and leaders of First Church, beginning Sunday, September 19, we are changing the time of our Foundation Service from 8:15 am to 8:30 am. In turn, this will shift our Sunday School enrichment time to 9:45-10:45 am. Our later worship service, The Gathering, will remain at its current time of 11:00 am.

We hope to see several benefits to this change in times, both for our early service and our Sunday School enrichment time:

- It will provide a little more time for folks to arrive in the morning.
- Everyone who supports worship will be able to arrive a little bit later. This includes all of our ushers, greeters, sound/media team, musicians, pastors and staff, etc. We hope this will also encourage more people to serve in these important ministries.
- It tightens the Sunday morning schedule just enough so that there is not too much time in between worship and Sunday School enrichment.
- Providing childcare at our Foundation service will open the door for more families to attend, and shifting to a slightly later time will help in recruiting childcare workers.
- Shifting the early service by just 15 minutes has the previously mentioned benefits, while not impacting the end time for our later service.

September 19, when this new Sunday morning schedule will begin, is also our fall kick-off day. We encourage everyone to join us, either in person or online! And bring a friend! Having discerned this through much prayer and conversation, we look forward to seeing what God has in store for us!

- 1. **Praise**—Praise God for **who He is**, His attribute as our Master Planner, the One who has the perfect plan, the One who plans our day-to-day steps. Suggested scripture: Jeremiah 29:11, Psalm 32:8, Psalm 33:11, 2 Peter 3:9
- 2. Confession—Silently confess your sins to the God who forgives. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. (1 John 1:9)
- 3. **Thanksgiving**—Thank God for **what He has done**. In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. (1 Thessalonians 5:18)
- 4. **Intercession**—Coming to God in prayer on **behalf of others**. Insert name(s) of person(s) you are praying for in the blank spaces: LORD, may You show _____ Your ways, teach them Your paths, in Your truth and teach _____. Savior, may _____'s hope be in You all day long. (Psalm 25:4-5)

Our year-to-date financial position continues to be blessed by the faithfulness of our Lord through the gifts of our congregation and friends. July giving was somewhat "short" of the average expected monthly giving. Thank you again for keeping First Church in your prayers and thoughts as we go through this extraordinary time.

Our expenses remain in good shape as we continue to offer online services, in addition to opening up more and more through this unusual time. We ask for your continued prayer and support as we make our way through the summer months.

The Endowment Fund

The current and future financial needs of our church will be supported by numerous resources. One of these resources is the church Endowment fund through the annual withdrawal of earnings from the invested permanent fund, the principal which is held in perpetuity. Our church needs to maintain the building, possibly replace volunteer staff with paid staff, establish new areas of ministry, and respond to unanticipated ministry need. With creative giving, giving from one's accumulated resources, this will provide a unique opportunity to mature and support our obligation for the future of the church. God is good all the time and He has provided us with an abundance of blessings and we might want to consider if supporting the Endowment fund is a consideration.

Trustee Update from Jim Murdoch (President)

As good stewards of your giving, it is the Trustees mission to ensure this beautiful church is well-maintained to serve our community for generations to come. I wanted to highlight some of our accomplishments over the past few years:

• 2018: Video System & Masonry Repairs

• 2019: Sanctuary Aesthetic Changes:

- o Extended the platform to allow for a permanent home of the grand piano
- o Installed wood trim through the sanctuary
- o Added handicap ramp access to the chancel
- o Added handicap pew access throughout the main sanctuary

• 2020: Air Handlers

o Replaced two air handlers that expired beyond their expected life span

• Security

- o Installation of a key fob system on the exterior doors, providing additional protection to our preschool & staff members
- Covid: We adapted to necessary protocol changes created by the pandemic:
 - o Through a special gift, we installed an air purifying ionization system in the air handlers of the sanctuary & children's wing
 - o We purchased two mobile air ionizers to professionally clean surfaces
 - o Installed simulcast equipment for online viewing
 - o Constructed a stage for our outdoor worship space in the parking lot

2021:

- o Completed masonry/brownstone renovations to the small tower along Simpson Street
- o Replaced all shingles areas of our roof: office wing, both portions of the sanctuary, and tower entrance by the preschool
- o Provided annual scholarships to our college students and continuing educational needs of our pastors
- o We also provide on-going maintenance required at the parsonage.

This is all done through your regular gifts to the general fund, the Endowment fund, and to the various designated memorial funds. Thank You!

Looking to the future we are currently evaluating reconstruction of our sound/media desk area with full replacement of our sound systems for better control, which would include computers, digital equipment, wiring, amps, and speakers. In addition, our long-term objectives include the preservation of our stained glass windows throughout the church, masonry/brownstone repairs, and needed improvements to our HVAC systems.
