"One Another One Another"

As I reflect on the people and places we've been blessed to serve over the past 40 years, including our loving First Church family, a phrase that appears frequently in the New Testament comes to mind: "one another." In every place we've served, we've witnessed how beautiful it is when sisters and brothers in Christ "one another one another."

In his letter to the Galatians, the apostle Paul writes, "The only thing that really counts is faith that shows itself through love" (Galatians 5:6 NIV). If you were to ask Paul what this "faith that shows itself through love" looks like, he would likely rattle off a list of instructions that include the words, "one another." "Build one another up." "Forgive one another." "Bear with one another." "Serve one another." The list goes on and on...

It's likely that after each "one another" Paul would add the words, "just as." Each of the 59 "one another's" in the New Testament is a specific application of Jesus' command, that we "love one another just as I have loved you." (John 15:12)

In worship this fall, we're going to consider some of the "one another's" in the New Testament. These instructions seem especially timely today as we build relationships with "one another" in the church that reflect the love of Christ to the world around us. Join us each week as we deepen our relationships with Christ, one another and our neighbors, learning to love one another just as Christ has loved us.

#### From the Library

When I write the newsletter, I usually look at the new books that have come in during the month, check the reviews on-line and then try to come up with some entertaining prelude to get all of you interested in reading these books. As I checked out Wanda Brunstetter's website, I see that she was one of the founders of Amish fiction and has written more than 100 books, sometimes with other family members, but mostly by herself. I

was marveling at how she came up with so many ideas as I sit here and wonder how to start this newsletter. Then I remember that Pam, Fran and I started the library in October 1998. So, I have been writing this newsletter with Pam as my hardworking editor for 20 years. 20 years times 12 months come to 240 newsletters. I am way out in front of Ms. Brunstetter! No wonder I can't think of one more witty thing to say. Guess I will just skip to the book review this time.

The Apple Creek Announcement is the third book in Wanda Brunstetter's Creektown Discoveries Series. If she follows the usual format of Christian fiction writers, this should be the last book in this series, but there is no indication she is winding up the series. The first two books, The Walnut Creek Wish and The Sugarcreek Surprise arrived earlier this year. All three books are set in Amish communities in Ohio and are romances. Like the song says, "the course of true love never runs smooth", and that is the point in each of these books. You will have to read each book to the end to find out how each couple overcomes their difficulties to find a lasting relationship.

Patricia Bradley is finishing her *Natchez Trace Park Rangers Series* with a "protocol breaking" fourth book in the series titled, *Deception*. All four books are romantic suspense books set in Mississippi and this one not only involves park rangers, but also the FBI. Madison Thorn has transferred into the white-collar crimes department of the FBI after her last case turned extremely violent. She needs time to heal, but she doesn't want to leave her job. She is less than thrilled to be sent to the Natchez Park and finds she will be working with a former childhood friend slash enemy, Clayton Bradshaw. All too soon Madison finds herself in danger and will have to work with Clayton to solve the case and to stay safe. Reviewers have said that this story has more twists and turns than a pretzel—so plan to stay up late to finish it all in one sitting.

As you well know I am writing this before the book sale, but I want to thank you for all the donations and the continued support of the library.

Receipts year-to-date through the end of July are a bit down from our expectation. Keep in mind that the summer season is usually our slowest time of year. Expenses for the month of June were again favorable and our year-to-date "receipts over expenses" is positive \$15,000. The staff at first church and its volunteers continue

mindful stewardship of the gifts of our congregation and are working to open doors to others for the glory of God. We are grateful to all our congregation and guests who continue to support the work of First Church, as we serve the Lord by opening doors for all to know salvation through Jesus. We continue to ask for your prayers, your presence and your support through service and gifts to the mission of our First Church family. As we move into the end of the summer season, we look forward to having your join us online or in-person, serving the King together.

### Change (or Paper) for Water!

Water is the foundation of our very lives; yet, according to CDC estimates, only 2% of the population in Sierra Leone has access to clean, readily available drinking water! Help us to support the **Well Drilling Fund for Sierra Leone** by dropping your loose change, or even paper bills, into the blue "Change for Water" bucket located back on the Sierra Leone mission table in the Main Entrance hallway. Donations from July totaled \$20.75. 100% of your donations will be used to provide training and dig wells for schools and communities in need.
