As we do, I invite you to celebrate the people of our church and consider how will you be involved in God's great mission here.

I have no doubt that you are the best thing about First Church! I rejoice to be together on the journey with you.

#### **From the Library**

I love books and sewing. Every day I fight the good fight over sewing or cleaning, sewing or cooking,

and sewing or anything else. I have conquered the battle of sewing and reading by using audiobooks when I sew or do all the other aforementioned chores. But even at that, I still love books and love introducing you to all my favorites each month. Fall is a great time of year — the weather is crisp and coffee tastes better when it is chilly. Also, fall lends itself to curling up in a chair with a good book. And, now that there is a writers' strike on TV, a book is even more important. Usually, I say October is mystery month in the library, but if you know me, you know I think every month is mystery month. I hope you will enjoy these mystery selections as much as I know I will.



Coming out in the first week of October is *Into the Fire*, the first book in the "Undaunted Courage" series by Irene Hannon. The plot centers on Bri Tucker, a former smokejumper and current arson investigator. When a mysterious blaze takes the life of a friend, Bri takes over the case and discovers it's only one of several fiery deaths. Bri teams up with ATF Special Agent Marc Davis to solve the mystery, and the danger escalates. Someone wants not only to destroy the evidence, but also to incinerate the investigators. This one will keep you reading way past your bedtime, but maybe not by the light of a fire pit.

As I was checking for new mysteries to write about, I discovered that writers don't know this is mystery

month. So, I'm going to let go of my theme and talk about a new romance — but one I'm still looking forward to. In *Wildflower Falls* by Denise Hunter, the main characters have a couple of secrets making this a small mystery. Charlotte Simpson, owner of Stillwater Ranch, is bereft when her mother dies. She has never known who her father was and she longs to know. She hires Gunner Dawson to work with her horses. Gunner has experienced great loss, and he likes to keep everyone at arm's length. He also doesn't like to stay in one place long. But, what he hadn't planned on is getting caught up in helping Charlotte, not only with the ranch but also with her search for her father. Soon he doesn't know if he is falling in love with the ranch or its owner. But, what may complicate his feelings is learning Charlotte's true identity. This could be a page-turner too!

#### **Financial Report**

Through August 31, 2023 66% of year

Expected income – YTD \$ 600,585 (67% of budget) Actual income - YTD \$ 609,907 (68% of budget) \$ 607,234 (67% of budget) Actual expenses – YTD

Income for the four-Sunday month of August was \$57,286, about \$12,000 shy of our average four-week budget expectation. However, the summer months are often our lowest time of giving. Despite this, we continue to run ahead of our year-to-date giving budget. In July, expenses were a bit higher as they included a \$13,000 payment of principal on our bell tower loan. The good news is year-to-date income has outpaced year-to-date expenses through the first eight months of the year. Thank you for giving your prayers, talents and gifts to support First Church's work to spread the good news of salvation through Jesus Christ. And, thank you to staff and volunteers who continue to steward all of these gifts well.

We continue to ask for your consideration of making a gift to reduce the debt from our bell tower loan as guickly as possible. At one point, we believed we may need to borrow up to \$200,000. However, by controlling project costs and with contributions from individuals and church groups, we have already reduced the debt to around \$80,000. We will make monthly interest payments and periodic principal payments throughout the year. You can make a donation on the Church Center app or with a check. #### Sleep Out for the Homeless | Nov. 17-18

Did you know that our annual Sleep Out for the Homeless has been happening for 30 years? In 2023, First Church will host this event to raise money and awareness for the homeless for the 31st time. Once again on the Friday evening before Thanksgiving, students will line Simpson Street to collect spare change from passing traffic. When not on the streets, students are taking a break in the soup kitchen, praying, or participating in a hands-on learning activity about the realities of homelessness. Students also construct cardboard shelters and face the elements as they sleep outside through the night. In recent years Mechanicsburg Brethren in Christ's youth group has join First Church's youth group in making this event possible.

The event has shifted and adapted through the years, but it continues to be an important way for the local agencies that benefit from the funds raised. Each year, we have raised upwards of \$5,000 to donate to local organizations dedicated to helping the homeless in our area. This year's recipients will be One80Ministries, Family Promise and New Hope Ministries. These organizations do so much to help those affected by homelessness in our community, and it's a joy to support their continual efforts of caring for those in need.

How can you be involved?

- Pray for our event. Pray that students would learn more about the realities of homelessness, for our students' safety, and for the generosity of those passing by Friday evening.
- Volunteer at the Sleep Out.
